

Bienvenida al Diacono Dick Martin







What Does The Data Tell Us?

>> Faith Formation Trends

Youth Faith Formation Declines 48%. Why is this happening? In the past 10 years, fewer Catholic families view K-12 religious education as a necessity in the lives of their children.





>> Priest Trends

Not Enough Priests to Maintain the Status Quo. The good news is that the Diocese of Madison ordains a steady number of priests. The reality is that we have significantly fewer priests than the past. Since 1960, the total number of priests has declined from 430 to 158. There are not enough priests to maintain the status quo. And, we cannot maintain our current number of church structures with the number of priests that we have.

Gospel Reflection

Luke 18:1-8

Halloween is coming soon and that means time for costumes and dressing up! And that is something that is not just reserved for kids; many adults take part in this Halloween tradition. But there is, I think, a big difference in dressing up as a kid and doing so as an adult. When kids

kid and doing so as an adult. When kids are old enough to choose what they want to be for Halloween, there is some element of themselves embodied in the costume that they choose. When they dress up, to some degree, kids *become* what they dress up as. In a sense, they fully inhabit their costume. Adults, on the other hand, when they dress up have a more detached attitude. They know they are just putting on a costume. They don't really inhabit the costume; they assume a role to play.

Praying is kind of like a kid dressing up for Halloween. When we enter into prayer, we must inhabit that prayer. When we pray, the prayer must be a part of us, it must emanate from who we are. There is an honesty, an opening oneself before God. Listen to the words Sirach uses in the first reading to describe how the people pray: They "cry out" to God, they "wail" and they "pour out" their prayer. These are people whose prayer is part of their fiber; not just speaking words. In today's Gospel, the tax collector puts on his humility as a sinner, and he truly inhabits his prayer of contrition and mercy. The Pharisee, on the other hand, is like a costumed adult. His prayer is indeed worn as a costume, but he does not truly become one with his prayer. It really is a covering, a mask that actually comes between him and God. So this week as Halloween approaches, dress yourself in prayer!
