Parish News and Words from Our Pastor

32nd Sunday of Ordinary Time

The readings for the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C ask us how far we are willing to go in practicing our faith and also ask us to consider what the next life will be like. In the first reading a mother and her sons endure torture and death rather than violate the law. The psalm sings "Lord, when your glory appears, my joy will be full." In the second reading Paul prays that we may have the endurance of Christ. In the gospel Jesus answers a question about the resurrection. Let us pray for a strong faith that will help us endure, keeping the faith until the end of our life so that we can

enjoy eternal life in heaven!

Make Disciples Capital Campaign (MDCC)

In light of the announcement this weekend that from the guidance of the Into the Deep strategic planning committee, we will be merging with another parish nearby by the summer of 2024, people have asked how this affects our Make Disciples Capital Campaign. I would like to strongly make the point that the future plan of merger does not affect the campaign. The three construction phases have been completed and we have paid all the bills for the construction, \$700,000 of which is financed with our loan and line of credit from Capitol Bank. We hope that our donors can continue to make payments to complete their pledges and that we will be able to pay off our debt, the interest that is accruing, and also still have \$500,000 in our MDCC Endowment Fund. The interest from this endowment fund is legally established to only pay for future capital improvements on our STA property. So regardless of any plans for a merger with another parish in the summer of 2024, the MDCC financial plan is firmly set up to comply with the intent of the donors. MDCC fund contributions for this campaign will continue to pay for the construction costs, and any money raised over the \$3 million spent on construction, will be placed in the MDCC Endowment Fund to support our property moving into the future. The goal of the campaign was always to raise \$3.5 million. So far \$3.4 million has been pledged and to date, \$2.55 million has been collected. Thank you for your continued support of our Make Disciples Capital Campaign!

We hope to have a Grand Opening Event of our new Enrichment Wing (renamed from Education Wing), the weekend of our parish feast day of St. Thomas Aquinas on January 28 and 29. We are still waiting for a patio door and some windows to be installed and we want the space to be 100% complete when we unveil our new evangelization center! We have already been experiencing a high amount of usage of this new space by people of all ages and it truly has become a place where people in any stage of discipleship are encountering Jesus Christ in a life changing way! We are so blessed and thank you for your support!

If you would like to make a pledge to help complete our project and meet our Goal of \$3.5 Million, please contact Holly Irving. We only have \$100,000 to go to reach our goal!

Time, Talent, and Treasure Pledges for 2023

People have also asked about their pledge of treasure for 2023 in light of the news of the parish merger. Thank you for your questions, interest, and concern. I too share in your concerns. Since the merger is not scheduled to take place until the summer of 2024, this upcoming year of 2023 will not be affected at all by the merger plans and will be a year similar to the previous years in terms of funding our parish and mission. Next year, October 2023, will be the year for us to be concerned about the future of parish funding and all things related to the financial side of the parish merger. By then, we will need to be clear and explain well how the newly merged parish will operate. Please continue asking questions and offering feedback. We all need to work together as we enter this new territory and we need to be respectful and appreciative of people's financial gifts and the donor's intentions.

Campaña Capital de Hacer Discípulos (MDCC)

Según el anuncio de este fin de semana, siguiendo la orientación del comité de planificación estratégica Into the Deep, nos uniremos a otra parroquia cercana para el verano de 2024, la gente ha preguntado cómo afecta esto a nuestra Campaña Capital *Make Disciples*. Me gustaría señalar con firmeza que el futuro plan de fusión no afecta la campaña. Las tres fases de construcción se han completado y hemos pagado todas las facturas de la construcción, \$700,000 de los cuales se financian con nuestro préstamo y línea de crédito de Capitol Bank. Esperamos que nuestros donantes puedan seguir haciendo pagos prometidos y que podamos saldar nuestra deuda, los intereses que se acumulan y también tener \$500,000 en nuestro Fondo de Dotación de MDCC. El interés de este fondo de dotación está legalmente establecido para pagar solo futuras mejoras de capital en nuestra propiedad STA. Entonces, independientemente de los planes para una fusión con otra parroquia en el verano de 2024, el plan financiero de MDCC está firmemente establecido para cumplir con la intención de los donantes. Las contribuciones de fondos de MDCC para esta campaña continuarán pagando los costos de construcción, y cualquier dinero recaudado sobre los \$ 3 millones gastados en la construcción se colocará en el Fondo de dotación de MDCC para apoyar nuestra propiedad en movimiento hacia el futuro. El objetivo de la campaña siempre fue recaudar \$3.5 millones. Hasta el momento se han prometido \$3.4 millones y hasta la fecha se han recaudado \$2,55 millones. ¡Gracias por su continuo apoyo a nuestra Campaña Capital *Make Disciples*!

Gospel Reflection

Luke 20:27-38

Let's talk about the numbers seven and eight! In both our first reading and the Gospel we hear about seven brothers. The number seven wasn't just a random number chosen by the writers of the Scriptures; the number seven is used to

indicate the completeness of the created world. This is seen most evidently in Genesis where God created the world in seven days. So, if a person wanted to talk about the completed, created world, they would use the number seven as a symbol.

In the first reading, we find seven sons tortured to renounce God's law. The seven sons are a symbol for the complete kingdom of Israel. Central to the readings today is the insistence of two of the bothers that death is not final; they believe in Resurrection after death. In the Gospel, we hear about seven more brothers, who also die. Again, the seven brothers are used by the author of the Gospel to relate to the physical world, and again the theme of resurrection is central.

But seven isn't the number I want to concentrate on today, rather I want to consider the number eight. Why? Because seven is the number of the natural world, and one step beyond seven, eight, is a symbol of the Resurrection.

The Fathers of the Church, liked to speak of the day of Resurrection as the "eighth day." Christ's resurrection occurred on the day after the Sabbath, which was the seventh day of the natural week. That meant that the Resurrection occurred both on the first day of the new week – a symbol of a new creation -- as well as on the Eighth day – signaling a step beyond the natural world into a super-natural world. The Catechism of the Catholic Church has this to say about this eighth day:

"But for us a new day has dawned: the Day of Christ's Resurrection. The seventh day completes the first creation. The eighth day begins the new creation. Thus, the work of creation culminates in the greater work of redemption."

So, what do the readings today tell us about Resurrection? The first reading shows us the importance of faith in regard to the resurrection. The Gospel relates something different. The Sadducees, who didn't really believe in resurrection, were trying to trip-up Jesus. Their problem was that the resurrected life they imagined was essentially the same in nature as our life here in the natural world. Jesus tells them that the resurrection is something completely new, and we can't even imagine what it is like. It is super-natural to our world of the natural; it is the eight to our world of seven.

Our challenge is to believe in the face of all doubt, to believe in the face of attack and skepticism, to believe in the Resurrection – a resurrection we cannot imagine or describe but know to be true. As this Church year approaches its conclusion, it is a good time for each of us to look beyond what happens to us today, or this week, or this year, or indeed in our natural lives -- to reaffirm our faith in Resurrection.
