

Parish News and Words from Our Pastor

33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

In the Gospel today, as the disciples walked with Jesus into the temple, they were impressed by how beautifully adorned the temple was. Jesus took the opportunity to tell them that the future would be difficult and that the temple would be destroyed. Jesus alludes to the end times and the trials that await His disciples. As Jesus' disciples in our own day, we realize that discipleship is not easy and that we will endure challenges and difficulties along the way. But the glory that awaits us in eternal life is worth the struggles of following Jesus in this life. Let us pray for the strength and

endurance to keep the faith until our very last breath!

Please visit the Into the Deep website (see above) and read about the future planning for our Diocese of Madison. You can also offer helpful feedback regarding the current proposal for the newly organized 29 Pastorates. Last Sunday I announced that our STA Parish is in Pastorate #21 along with Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish (QP) in Madison. The proposal is asking us to merge into a single parish with QP by the summer of 2024. Here are some brief points to consider based on some immediate feedback I received last Sunday:

- The Merger will not affect our Make Disciples Capital Campaign, nor will it affect the financial pledges made recently for the 2023 Offertory. The merger will affect our budget in 2024 and we will be able to plan for that and discuss that next October 2023 as we prepare the budget for the following year.
- The merger does not call for us to close our building. I envision that we might celebrate Holy Week together in one Liturgy in the same Church, like for example have one Holy Thursday Mass at QP and one Easter Vigil Mass at STA, but I do not see either building being closed. Our decisions about what Mass to celebrate where and when will be based on Mass attendance in the past, the capacity for each Church, and the number of priests. Also, we have recently invested over \$3 million in our building and our new Enrichment Center combined with QP's catholic school will be a dynamic offering to both communities. The population is growing in our area and we have a big potential for growth.
- The merger will mean working together in a mutually respectful way and planning out mass times and other programs that will be complimentary.
- The merger will mean that there will be changes in priest assignments and there is a possibility that I could be named pastor of the new Pastorate. There is a possibility that I could be moved if the Bishop feels my gifts and talents are needed elsewhere. For now, I am concentrating on enjoying celebrating my 10th Christmas with all of you, my beloved friends, of STA!

There are still more questions than answers for sure, but overall I am very satisfied with this proposal and am hopeful for the opportunities that are before us. St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us!

This year, we will continue our tradition of celebrating **Thanksgiving Day Mass at 9AM on Thursday**, **November 24**. In addition to this, for the very first time, there will be a city-wide **Ecumenical Prayer Service at Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish on Monday**, **November 21 at 6:30PM**. This is the only prayer that we participate in that is ecumenical during the year so I feel that it is important for us to be a part of it. I hope that we can have good attendance at both liturgies. There is so much to be thankful for!

El domingo pasado anuncie que nuestra parroquia STA está en el Pastorado #21 junto a la parroquia Nuestra Señora Reina de La Paz en Madison. La propuesta nos pide que nos unamos en una sola parroquia con Nuestra Señora Reina de La Paz antes del Verano 2024. He aquí algunos puntos a tener en cuenta, basados en comentarios inmediatos que recibí el domingo pasado:

- La fusión no afectará a nuestra Campaña Capital Ve y Haz Discípulo, ni tampoco afectará a los Compromisos Financieros realizados recientemente para el Ofertorio de 2023. La fusión afectará nuestro presupuesto en 2024 y podremos planificar y discutir eso el próximo octubre de 2023 cuando preparemos el presupuesto para el año siguiente.
- La fusión no exige que cerremos nuestro edificio. Preveo que podríamos celebrar la Semana Santa juntos en una sola liturgia en la misma iglesia, como por ejemplo tener una Misa de Jueves Santo en Nuestra Señora Reina de la Paz y la Misa de Vigilia Pascual en STA, pero no veo que ninguno de los dos edificios cierre. Nuestras decisiones sobre qué Misa celebrar, dónde y cuándo, se basarán en la asistencia a Misa en el pasado, la capacidad de cada iglesia y el número de sacerdotes. Además, hemos invertido recientemente más de 3 millones de dólares en nuestro edificio y nuestro nuevo Centro de Enriquecimiento combinado con la Escuela Católica de en Nuestra Señora Reina de la Paz será una oferta dinámica para ambas comunidades. La población está creciendo en nuestra área y tenemos un gran potencial de crecimiento.
- La fusión significará trabajar juntos de forma respetuosa y planificar las horas de las Misas y otros programas que serán complementarios.
- La Fusión significará que habrá cambios en las asignaciones de los sacerdotes y existe la posibilidad de que yo sea nombrado párroco del nuevo Pastorado y también existe la posibilidad de que sea trasladado si el Obispo considera que mis dones y talentos son necesarios en otro lugar. ¡Por ahora, estoy concentrado en disfrutar de la celebración de mi décima Navidad con todos ustedes, mis queridos amigos, de STA!

Sin duda, todavía hay más preguntas que respuestas, pero en general estoy muy satisfecho con esta propuesta y tengo esperanza en las oportunidades que se nos presentan. ¡Santo Tomás de Aquino, ruega por nosotros!







Luke 20:27-38



I know this is supposed to be a Gospel reflection (it's right there in the article title!), but today I am going to veer a little and talk about a line from the first reading from Malachi: "for you who fear my name." We hear a lot about "the

fear of the Lord," so what is it?

St. Thomas Aquinas describes two aspects of fear in our relationship with God. The first kind of fear is the kind of fear we tend to think about, which Thomas calls servile fear. This is the fear of punishment. In terms of our relationship with God, this is our fear of hell. We stay close to God because of our fear of punishment. But this is a negative kind of fear. Thomas tells us there is a better, holier kind of fear which he calls filial fear. This is the fear of being separated from God. It is called filial fear because it is the fear of a son who never wants to lose his relationship with his father.

Thomas tells us filial fear is actually born out of love, since it is through love that we keep our relationship with our Father. And there is a major difference between the types of fear. Servile fear is a fear of passivity; that is, we do nothing in dread of punishment, and through our inactivity, we can actually hurt our relationship with God.

But filial fear is an active, positive force. Filial fear, the fear of being without God, impels us to do that which keeps our relationship strong: that is, it impels us to works of charity and mercy. We invest the talents God has given us to do that which he asks us to do. We act out of love for the relationship.

So as we approach the end of the church year, and the readings turn toward preparing for the "end times," it is time to be fearful – in an active and loving way.

Carlo Acutis was a boy from Milan, Italy, who had a great love for the Lord, the Eucharist, computers and the internet, hiking and other activities that young people do. Because of his love for Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, he gathered information of all of the recorded Eucharistic Miracles from around the globe, and cataloged these into a website. He finished his work in 2005. A year later, Carlo died at the age of 15 from leukemia. He was beatified in 2020. Since that time, a traveling exhibit of panels has been developed, using the information he cataloged. A Relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis will accompany the exhibit – be sure to come visit this exciting display!

Christmas Food Basket Time Is Right Around The Corner!



Make a Tax-Free Gift with an IRA

Did you know that you may be able to give to St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Parish and save money at the same time?

There are different options depending on your age: Age 70.5 or Older

If you are 70.5 years or older, you may be able to give an amount (up to \$100,000) each year from your IRA directly to St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Parish without having to pay taxes on the money. This is a popular form of giving that is sometimes referred to as the IRA charitable rollover, or the qualified charitable distribution (QCD).



Additional Benefits for Those 72 or Older

- When you turn 72, the transferred funds may begin counting toward your required minimum distribution (RMD) so you do not pay income taxes on the gift.
- The funds transferred to charity do not qualify for a charitable deduction, but they may become exempted from taxable income whether or not you itemize deductions.
- Lowering your taxable annual income level could also result in lower Medicare premiums and the amount of Social Security subject to taxes.
- Your disbursement must come directly from the administrator of your IRA to the parish. You cannot receive the funds first. Please contact the administrator of your IRA with any tax or account-specific questions.

Additional ways to use your IRA to make a gift:

Did you know that leaving your qualified retirement account may be the most expensive asset to leave your children? Unlike individuals, St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Parish does not have to pay income taxes on inherited IRA's, so the full amount that you direct to us through a beneficiary designation would further the mission of your church family. This is often a very easy way to make a substantial gift as it only takes the completion of a form that your account administrator may provide for you.

Important Step: It is critically important that you contact the parish and let us know of your gift. This is because many retirement plans do not notify the charity of a gift designation. We will monitor the situation to be sure that your plans for giving are indeed followed. Plus, we want to be able to thank you for your generous gift!

To make a gift from your IRA, please follow these steps:

- Seek the advice of your financial or legal adviser if necessary.
- Determine the gift you would like to give.
- Contact Julia Hix, Business Manager, in the parish office of St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Parish to inform the parish of your intended gift (Phone: 608.833.2600 or Email: *julia@stamadison.org*).
- Ask your IRA administrator about making a direct transfer to the parish or have the administrator send a check from your account to the parish directly. Remember, to be tax free the donation must be made directly from your IRA account to the parish and not pass through your hands.
