

Parish News and Words from Our Pastor

Noticias Parroquiales y Mensaje de Nuestro Párroco

Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

On this last Sunday of the Liturgical Year, Catholics celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. This feast is designed to give special recognition to the dominion Christ our Lord has over all aspects of our lives. This solemnity is as

important to celebrate today as it was when it was established by Pope Pius XI on December 11, 1925. At that time the Church responded to the rise of fascism, national socialism, and communism that spawned the likes of Benito Mussolini, Adolf Hitler, and Joseph Stalin. Pope Pius XI saw that people were denying Christ in favor of a lifestyle dominated by secularism, material advantage, and false hope created by tyrants. The Pope wanted to send a message of peace. These words by his predecessor, Pope Benedict XV, point out the Church's response to worldly dictatorships: "There can be no stable peace or lasting treaties, though made after long and difficult negotiations and duly signed, unless there be a return of mutual charity to appease hate and banish enmity." Pope Pius XI wrote, "We firmly hope, however, that the feast of the Kingship of Christ, which in the future will be yearly observed, may hasten the return of society to our loving Savior."

Pope Benedict XVI, on the feast of Christ the King, Nov. 22, 2009, shared this reflection:

"But in what does this 'power' of Jesus Christ the King consist? It is not the power of the kings or the great people of this world; it is the divine power to give eternal life, to liberate from evil, to defeat the dominion of death. It is the power of Love that can draw good from evil, that can melt a hardened heart, bring peace amid the harshest conflict and kindle hope in the thickest darkness. This Kingdom of Grace is never imposed and always respects our freedom. Christ came 'to bear witness to the truth' (Jn 18: 37), as he declared to Pilate: whoever accepts his witness serves beneath his 'banner.' Every conscience, therefore, must make a choice. Who do I want to follow? God or the Evil One? The truth or falsehood? Choosing Christ does not guarantee success according to the world's criteria but assures the peace and joy that he alone can give us. This is demonstrated, in every epoch, by the experience of numerous men and women who, in Christ's name, in the name of truth and justice, were able to oppose the enticements of earthly powers with their different masks, to the point that they sealed their fidelity with martyrdom."

Peace still eludes us in our day. Our world needs now more than ever, our witness to Jesus' rule over all things.

Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo



nidad es tan importante de celebrar hoy como lo fue cuando fue establecida por el Papa Pío XI el 11 de diciembre de 1925. En aquella época, la Iglesia respondió al ascenso del fascismo, el socialismo nacional y el comunismo, que generaron a personajes como Benito Mussolini, Adolf Hitler y José Stalin. El Papa Pío XI vio que la gente renegaba de Cristo en favor de un estilo de vida dominado por el secularismo, las ventajas materiales y la falsa esperanza creada por los tiranos. El Papa quería enviar un mensaje de paz. Estas palabras de su predecesor, el Papa Benedicto XV, señalan la respuesta de la Iglesia a las dictaduras mundanas: "No puede haber paz estable ni tratados duraderos, aunque se hayan hecho después de largas y difíciles negociaciones y se hayan firmado debidamente, si no hay un retorno a la caridad mutua para aplacar el odio y desterrar la enemistad". El Papa Pío XI escribió: "Esperamos firmemente, sin embargo, que la Solemnidad de la Realeza de Cristo, que en el futuro se observará anualmente, pueda acelerar el retorno de la sociedad a nuestro Salvador amoroso."

El Papa Benedicto XVI, en la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey, el 22 de noviembre de 2009, compartió esta reflexión:

Pero, ¿en qué consiste el "poder" de Jesucristo Rey? No es el poder de los reyes y de los grandes de este mundo; es el poder divino de dar la vida eterna, de librar del mal, de vencer el dominio de la muerte. Es el poder del Amor, que sabe sacar el bien del mal, ablandar un corazón endurecido, llevar la paz al conflicto más violento, encender la esperanza en la oscuridad más densa. Este Reino de la gracia nunca se impone y siempre respeta nuestra libertad. Cristo vino "para dar testimonio de la verdad" (Jn 18, 37) —como declaró ante Pilato—: quien acoge su testimonio se pone bajo su "bandera", según la imagen que gustaba a san Ignacio de Loyola. Por lo tanto, es necesario —esto sí— que cada conciencia elija: ¿a quién quiero seguir? ¿A Dios o al maligno? ¿La verdad o la mentira? Elegir a Cristo no garantiza el éxito según los criterios del mundo, pero asegura la paz y la alegría que sólo él puede dar. Lo demuestra, en todas las épocas, la experiencia de muchos hombres y mujeres que, en nombre de Cristo, en nombre de la verdad y de la justicia, han sabido oponerse a los halagos de los poderes terrenos con sus diversas máscaras, hasta sellar su fidelidad con el martirio.

La paz todavía se nos escapa en nuestros días. Nuestro mundo necesita, ahora más que nunca, nuestro testimonio del dominio de Jesús sobre todas las cosas.

Our Lady of the Rosary of Chiquinquirá Nuestra Señora del Rosario de Chiquinquirá

Our Lady of Chiquinquira

Recently a group of Catholics approached me about celebrating the Blessed Virgin Mary under the title, "Our Lady of Chiquinquira (OLC)." OLC is the Patroness of Colombia. This Saturday, we are adding to our celebration of Christ the King and also celebrating OLC at our 6:30 p.m. Spanish Mass. OLC is very popular in Colombia and in a nearby Venezuelan territory. Chiquinguira is the name of the city in Colombia, where the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared miraculously on a canvas that was faded and worn out and put into a storage room in a church. Many miracles have been attributed to her intercession and under the title OLC. In the image of OLC, Mary is holding the child Jesus on her lap and she is holding a rosary. This image has encouraged the faithful to pray the rosary as a family. In addition to the miraculous restoration of her image in Chiquinquira, Colombia, she also miraculously appeared to a woman in Venezuela on a piece of wood that the woman found floating down the river where she was washing her clothes.

When our parish began offering the Spanish Mass and we began our Hispanic Ministry at STA, one of our hopes was that we would be a unified parish with many diverse members. We wanted to avoid forming two separate communities, that basically would use the same church building. Our bilingual Masses during Holy Days and other times during the year help to achieve this unity. It is good for us to realize the rich-

ness of faith that exists in our Church and the many devotions and expressions of faith that we practice. Together we have so much to offer one another. Our Hispanic sisters and brothers have shared with us their love for the Blessed Virgin Mary, which we can see in our familiarity with Our Lady of Guadalupe, and now we are learning about OLC. In our welcome and inclusion in the name of Jesus, I pray that others can be inspired and enriched by our faith.

Nuestra Señora de Chiquinquirá

Recientemente un grupo de católicos se me acercó para celebrar a la Santísima Virgen María bajo el título de "Nuestra Señora de Chiquinquirá". Nuestra Señora de Chiquinquirá es la Patrona de Colombia. Este sábado, vamos a añadir a nuestra celebración de Cristo Rev y también celebraremos a la Nuestra Señora de Chiquinquirá en nuestra misa de las 6:30 p.m. en español. Nuestra Señora de Chiquinquirá es muy popular en Colombia y en un territorio venezolano cercano. Chiquinquirá es el nombre de la ciudad en Colombia, donde la Santísima Virgen María se apareció milagrosamente en un lienzo que estaba descolorido y desgastado y que se puso en un almacén de una iglesia. Muchos milagros se han atribuido a su intercesión y bajo el título de Nuestra Señora de Chiquinquirá. En la imagen de Nuestra Señora de Chiquinquirá, María tiene al niño Jesús en su regazo y sostiene un rosario. Esta imagen ha inspirado a los fieles a rezar el rosario en familia. Además de la restauración milagrosa de su imagen en Chiquinquirá (Colombia), también se apareció milagrosamente a una mujer en Venezuela en un trozo de madera que la mujer encontró flotando en el río donde estaba lavando su ropa.

Cuando nuestra parroquia empezó a ofrecer la misa en español y comenzamos nuestro ministerio hispano en STA, una de nuestras aspiraciones era que fuéramos una parroquia unificada con muchos miembros diversos. Queríamos evitar la formación de dos comunidades separadas, que básicamente utilizarían el mismo edificio de la iglesia. Nuestras misas bilingües durante los días festivos y otros momentos del año ayudan a conseguir esta unidad. Es bueno que nos demos cuenta de la riqueza de la fe que existe en nuestra Iglesia y de

las muchas devociones y expresiones de fe que practicamos. Juntos tenemos mucho que ofrecernos unos a los otros. Nuestras hermanas y hermanos hispanos han compartido con nosotros su amor por la Santísima Virgen María, que podemos ver en nuestra familiaridad con Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, y ahora estaaprendiendo sobre Nuestra Señora de Chiquinquirá. En nuestra acogida e inclusión en el nombre de Jesús, ruego que otros puedan ser inspirados y enriquecidos por nuestra fe.

- La colecta en el Servicio de Oración Ecuménico será para los bancos de alimentos locales.




Thanksgiving Day Offertory Collection Goes to STA SVdP Conference

Our STA conference of St Vincent de Paul has had a very busy year assisting our neighbors in need. We have helped a total of 159 households and 437 people! Our financial assistance to those in need has included \$14,969 in housing assistance, \$4,223 in utility payments, \$5,026 in clothing, furniture and moving needs, \$4,621 for transportation, \$1,213 for food plus many referrals and deliveries of food from our district food pantry.

All of our financial support comes from STA through outreach funding and other donations. The Thanksgiving day collection is designated for our conference. This year we have helped 3 families who were homeless move into apartments. We've helped families from Kazahkstan, Venezuela and Nigeria who are new to Madison with furniture, rent, eyeglasses. We've paid rent to prevent evictions and utility bills preventing shut offs for people who have missed work due to illness, Covid, or caring for family members, or those who have had their work hours reduced unexpectedly.

This is a ministry where we personally encounter Christ in those we serve. We pray with and pray for those we meet. The tenets of the St. Vincent de Paul Society are spirituality, friendship and service. We strive to witness to Christ, develop true friendships, and personally connect with those in need. It is wonderful to be able to provide both physical and spiritual support. Thank you for your support!

- 5. The delivery of the baskets will take place Saturday, December 17, starting at 9 am. As in years past, we need many volunteers to deliver the baskets.

Please return gifts unwrapped with the ornament or card attached on the outside to the alcove at the left of the fireplace in the gathering area.


Gift cards should be returned with the envelope or card attached and handed in at the office or slid through the mail slot.

Art & Environment Wish List

Throughout the Seasons of the Church Year, we have a dedicated team of people who help us to enliven our celebration of the Mass, through their decorating and care for the Sanctuary and the Altar. This group of folks works with a very small budget amount each year, which primarily takes care of the flowers for the Seasons of Christmas and Easter. As we have striven to be good stewards of the resources we have been blest with, we are now at the point where some of our cloth and other furnishings need to be refreshed or replaced. We can only do this through your generosity! This list includes a few examples of what we are looking for and their associated costs. Set of New Altar Cloths/Fabric for Decorating

Ranges from \$1,200 - \$2,500 PER SEASON, depending upon the style and size of the altar cloths which are used. Seasons of Christmas and Easter, where we use full cloths that drape to the floor cost considerably more. We are looking forward to new altar cloths for the Seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time. We would ideally like to purchase a couple of new sets each year, so that we can spread out the cost and be responsible stewards of your gifts.

New Censor/Thurible/Incense Stand

\$1,200. Our current stand has been around for many years and is very worn. It also does not match any of our altar appointments or candle sticks. This new stand would integrate well into our décor as needed.

New Advent Wreath/Stand

\$2,500 - \$3,000. We have been making do using our Altar Candle Sticks and carefully attaching a wreath to them. Making the investment in an actual advent wreath stand for the church will allow us to spend less time in setup, be more creative in our decorating of the wreath, and allow us more time to focus on other parts of the church in our Advent décor.



Sanctuary Lamp Stand

\$3,000. A floor-standing Sanctuary Lamp stand would allow us some options for placement of the Sanctuary Lamp. Last year, we used a temporary setup for this during Lent, which was a bit precarious. Having a floor stand allows us a safe way to keep the Sanctuary Lamp visible throughout the Seasons of the Year.



Torch Stands

\$1,400. We currently have several processional candles/pew torches, which we rarely use because they are difficult to store and to setup for use. Having storage stands for them, would allow us to utilize them much more easily, and use them for special liturgical celebrations and Masses throughout the year.

Carlo Acutis was a boy from Milan, Italy, who had a great love for the Lord, the Eucharist, computers and the internet, hiking and other activities that young people do. Because of his love for Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, he gathered information of all of the recorded Eucharistic Miracles from around the globe, and cataloged these into a website. He finished his work in 2005. A year later, Carlo died at the age of 15 from leukemia. He was beatified in 2020. Since that time, a traveling exhibit of panels has been developed, using the information he cataloged. A Relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis will accompany the exhibit – be sure to come visit this exciting display!

Gospel Reflection

Luke 23:35-43

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. At first glance, it is an odd sort of kingship we see illustrated in today's Gospel. Jesus, the King, is being crucified; his throne is a wooden cross. His attendants are but two: traditionally

known as "the bad thief" and "the good thief." We can see elements of ourselves in both thieves: the first when we refuse to take responsibility for our own often sinful actions, the second when we recognize our failings, take responsibility, and throw ourselves at the mercy of the king. Mercy -- the most sublime attribute of a good king. Even undergoing the excruciating pain of crucifixion, Jesus personifies mercy. The good thief was confident in this mercy and Jesus' promise of resurrection, as we should be.

It was (and still is, in some places) a tradition that when a king dies, it is proclaimed: "The king is dead; long live the king!" This symbolizes the passing of the kingship from the deceased king to his heir. With Jesus, it is different. His kingship is eternal, and his death and resurrection a means for us to enter into his kingdom. The king has died but has risen – forever lives the King!
