First Sunday of Advent 2022 The Four Holy Habits

Last week we concluded the liturgical year and we reflected on the final judgment and our desire to choose allegiance to Christ, King of the Universe! With the season of Advent, the wheel of time turns again. The Catechism of the



Catholic Church states, "When the Church celebrates Advent each year, she makes present the ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming (#524)." Now it's all about beginnings and fresh starts. This season is pregnant with possibilities, expectant with hope. If you like, you can be born again with Christ! The world is getting another chance to make things right. Each of us is issued the same opportunity to be made new. This Advent our theme, "The Four Holy Habits," is a way for us to make things right in our lives and in our families:

- * Reclaiming Sunday
- * Daily Prayer
- * Friday Penance/Regular Sacrifice
- * Frequent Celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

New Liturgical Year Begins! Comienza el Nuevo Año Litúrgico!

New Liturgical Year Begins!

The First Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of our new liturgical year. This year we will be using Cycle "A" Scripture Readings for Sunday Mass. The Sunday Scripture Readings are on a three year cycle and each year is called Year "A," "B," or "C." Each of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) is unique in structure and a good bit of content. What each Gospel writer put into his account was shaped by the needs, the problems, and the trials and challenges of the community for which the Gospel is written. This year, Year "A," we will be proclaiming the Gospel of Matthew. Matthew was writing for the Jewish followers of Jesus who had continued to attend the synagogue regularly. However in 70 A.D. the Jewish Christians were expelled from the synagogues and treated like enemies, especially by the Pharisees who were leading the Jewish faith at that time. They said that Jesus was not the Son of God and in fact was a terrible sinner who violated the Jewish laws and practices. Matthew's Gospel addresses these issues in an anecdotal literary form and presents Jesus doing very "Moses-like" things. Matthew's Gospel begins with a statement from Isaiah. "Emmanuel...God is with us (1:23)." The Gospel ends with a similar sentiment with Jesus promising, "I am with you always, until the end of the age (28:20)." Matthew's Gospel invites us to be open to hear and believe in the Word of God and open ourselves to God's continuing presence in our lives. We are to witness to others that God's love is abundant and given to us freely. In turn, we are to give that same love to others, abundantly and freely.

Comienza el Nuevo Año Litúrgico!

El primer domingo de Adviento marca el comienzo de nuestro nuevo año litúrgico. Este año utilizaremos las lecturas bíblicas del Ciclo "A" para la Misa Dominical. Las Lecturas Bíblicas Dominicales tienen un ciclo de tres años y cada año se llama Año "A", "B" o "C". Cada uno de los Evangelios (Mateo, Marcos, Lucas y Juan) es único en su estructura y en su contenido. Lo que cada escritor de los Evangelios puso en su relato fue moldeado por las necesidades, los problemas, las pruebas y desafíos de la comunidad para la que se escribe un Evangelio. Este año, el Año "A", proclamaremos el Evangelio de Mateo. Mateo escribía para los seguidores judíos de Jesús que seguían asistiendo regularmente a la sinagoga. Sin embargo, en el año 70 después de Cristo, los cristianos judíos fueron expulsados de las sinagogas y tratados como enemigos, especialmente por los fariseos que dirigían la fe judía en ese momento. Decían que Jesús no era el Hijo de Dios y que, de hecho, era un terrible pecador que violaba las leyes y prácticas judías. El Evangelio de Mateo aborda estos asuntos de forma literaria anecdótica y presenta a Jesús haciendo cosas muy "a lo Moisés". El Evangelio de Mateo comienza con un comunicado de Isaías: "Emanuel... Dios está con nosotros (1:23)". El Evangelio termina con un sentimiento similar, con Jesús prometiendo: "Yo estoy con ustedes todos los días, hasta el fin del mundo (28:20)". El Evangelio de Mateo nos invita a estar abiertos a escuchar y creer en la Palabra de Dios y a abrirnos a la presencia continua de Dios en nuestras vidas. Debemos dar testimonio a los demás de que el amor de Dios es abundante v se nos da gratuitamente. A su vez, debemos dar ese mismo amor a los demás, de forma abundante y gratuita.

Art & Environment Wish List

Throughout the Seasons of the Church Year we have a dedicated team of people who help us enliven our celebration of the Mass, through their decorating and care for the Sanctuary and the Altar. This group of folks works with a very small budget amount each year, which primarily takes care of the flowers for the Seasons of Christmas and Easter. As we have striven to be good stewards of the resources we have been blest with, we are now at the point where some of our cloth and other furnishings need to be refreshed or replaced. We can only do this through your generosity! This list includes a few examples of what we are looking for and their associated costs. If you would be willing to assist us financially with this endeavor, please contact Greg Buchberger (greg@stamadison.org or 608-833-2600 x869). Thank you to all our parishioners and friends for your generosity to our parish family.

Set of New Altar Cloths/Fabric for Decorating

Ranges from \$1,200 - \$2,500 PER SEASON, depending upon the style and size of the altar cloths which are used. Seasons of Christmas and Easter, where we use full cloths that drape to the floor cost considerably more. We are looking forward to new altar cloths for the Seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time. We would ideally like to purchase a couple of new sets each year, so that we can spread out the cost and be responsible stewards of your gifts.

New Censor/Thurible/Incense Stand

\$1,200. Our current stand has been around for many years and is very worn. It also does not match any of our altar appointments or candle sticks. This new stand would integrate well into our décor as needed.

New Advent Wreath/Stand

\$2,500 - \$3,000. We have been making do using our Altar candle sticks and carefully attaching a wreath to them. Making the investment in an actual Advent wreath stand for the church will allow us to spend less time in setup, be more creative in our decorating of the wreath, and allow us more time to focus on other parts of the church in our Advent décor.



Sanctuary Lamp Stand

\$3,000. A floor-standing sanctuary lamp stand would allow us some options for placement of the sanctuary lamp. Last year, we used a temporary setup for this during Lent, which was a bit precarious. Having a floor stand allows us a safe way to keep the sanctuary lamp visible throughout the Seasons of the Year.

Torch Stands

\$1,400. We currently have several processional candles/ pew torches, which we rarely use because they are difficult to store and to setup for use. Having storage stands for them, would allow us to utilize them much more easily, and use them for special liturgical celebrations and Masses throughout the year.

Blessed Carlo Acutis' Eucharistic Miracles of the World December 8 – 10, 9am-7pm December 11, 8am – 3pm.

Carlo Acutis was a boy from Milan, Italy, who had a great love for the Lord, the Eucharist, computers and the internet, hiking and other activities that young people do. Because of his love for Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, he gathered information of all of the recorded Eucharistic Miracles from around the globe, and cataloged these into a website. He finished his work in 2005. A year later, Carlo died at the age of 15 from leukemia. He was beatified in 2020. Since that time, a traveling exhibit of panels has been developed, using the information he cataloged. A Relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis will accompany the exhibit – be sure to come visit this exciting display!

Gospel Reflection

Matthew 24:37-44

On the First Sunday of Advent on November 27th in Madison, Wisconsin, the sun doesn't rise until after 7 AM and sets before 4:30 PM. That's a lot of darkness. With that much darkness, it's easy to feel sleepy and hard to stay

awake. But Jesus tells us in our Gospel today to "stay awake!" And how do we do that? We turn on a light. That spiritual light for us is following in the way of Jesus, living his commandments, loving God and one another. That creates light around us and keeps us awake – but we know that our limited little lights are just dim reflections of the light of the sun, or rather the son, which illumines all. But you might say, there is darkness! Yes, but the sun is ALWAYS shining; the darkness of night only arrives when the bulk of the earth comes between us and the sun. Let this be a reminder at this busy time of year to not let earthly things come between us and the Light. So as we prepare during this season of Advent, let us stay awake and keep our lights shining, until the bright dawning arrival of the Son!


