

Third Sunday of Ordinary Time

Jesus calls the disciples in pairs—a powerful reminder that discipleship happens in community. Each of us brings particular gifts, but those gifts are not meant to be siloed. Christ calls each of us to follow him in communion with fellow believers, just as he did with Simon, Andrew, James,

and John. Together, we can further Christ's work of proclaiming the Gospel to the ends of the earth! This is a great motivation for us as we prepare to go further in our strategic plan for the future, Into the Deep, and to see how we can work together to evangelize and make disciples.

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children—Monday, January 23

Please join us for Mass on Monday, January 23 at 8:30 a.m. as we make our prayer and offer Mass for the legal protection of unborn children. From the USCCB website:

The over 60 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton reflect with heart-breaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard. And while, on June 24, 2022, the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health

Organization decision overturned Roe v. Wade, right now state and federal laws, in many instances, are still hostile to preborn children. So, great prayer and advocacy is still very much needed. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 373 designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion."



Jornada de Oración por la Protección Legal del Niño por Nacer- Lunes 23 de enero de 2023

Únase a nosotros para la Misa el lunes 23 de enero a las 8:30 a. m. mientras rezamos y ofrecemos Misa por la protección legal de los niños no nacidos. Del sitio web de la USCCB:

Los más de 60 millones de abortos desde las decisiones de 1973 de Roe v. Wade y Doe v. Bolton reflejan con una magnitud desgarradora lo que el Papa Francisco quiere decir con una "cultura del descarte". Sin embargo, tenemos una gran confianza en la providencia de Dios. Se nos recuerda una y otra vez en las Escrituras que busquemos la ayuda del Señor, y como personas de fe, creemos que nuestras oraciones son escuchadas. Y

aunque, el 24 de junio de 2022, la decisión de la Organización de Salúd de la Mujer Dobbs v. Jackson anuló Roe v. Wade, en este momento las leyes estatales y federales, en muchos casos, todavía son hostiles a los niños no nacidos. Por lo tanto, todavía se necesita mucha oración y defensa. La Instrucción General del Misal Romano, n. 373, designa el 22 de enero como día particular de oración y llamado "Día penitencia, Oración por la Protección Legal de los Niños No Nacidos": "En todas las Diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América, el 22 de enero (o el 23 de enero, cuando 22 cae en domingo) se observará como día particular de oración por el pleno restablecimiento de la garantía legal del derecho a la vida y de la penitencia por las violaciones a la dignidad de la persona humana cometidas por actos de aborto".



65th Anniversary of St. Thomas Aquinas Parish

65 Aniversario de Nuestra Parroquia de Santo Tomás de Aquino

Next Weekend We Celebrate our 65th Anniversary since the founding of our St. Thomas Aquinas Parish!

Prior to the 1940's, Catholics living in Middleton Township were served by St. Bernard Parish. In 1945, Our Lady Queen of Peace was founded to serve Madison's growing west side. Then on June 13, 1958, Bishop William P. O'Connor founded Saint Thomas Aquinas Parish on a ten-acre site at the corner of Rosa Road and Mineral Point Road. In the early days the parish community had no church-just a vision and some land known as the "bean patch."

From those early years until now, we have experienced tremendous growth. By the 1970's it was clear that Madison was growing in a different direction and so the decision was made to sell the original land to CU-NA and invest in land on Everglade Drive. A new building was built and on August 13, 1976, our new and current church was dedicated. The parish has flourished in this location and by the early 1980's, the membership grew to nearly 1,000 households.

Now 65 years later, we have a parish family made up of 1,650 households and with our newly remodeled building are poised to be a center of evangelization and a place where people can experience Jesus Christ in a way that changes how we live.

¡El próximo fin de semana celebramos nuestro 65 aniversario desde la fundación de nuestra parroquia de Santo Tomás de Aquino!

Antes de la década de 1940, la parroquia de *St. Bernard* atendía a los católicos que vivían en el municipio de Middleton. En 1945, se fundó *Our Lady Queen of Peace* para servir al creciente lado oeste de Madison. Luego, el 13 de junio de 1958, el obispo William P. O'Connor fundó la parroquia de *Saint Thomas Aquinas* en un terreno de diez acres en la esquina de Rosa Road y Mineral Point Road. En los primeros días, la comunidad parroquial no tenía iglesia, solo una visión y un terreno conocido como el "parque del frijol."

Desde esos primeros años hasta ahora, hemos experimentado un tremendo crecimiento. Para la década de 1970, estaba claro que Madison estaba creciendo en una dirección diferente, por lo que se tomó la decisión de vender el terreno original a CUNA e invertir en un terreno en Everglade Drive. Se construyó un nuevo edificio y el 13 de agosto de 1976 y se dedicó nuestra iglesia nueva y actual. La parroquia ha florecido en este lugar y, a principios de la década de 1980, la membresía creció a casi 1,000 hogares.

Ahora, 65 años después, tenemos una familia parroquial compuesta por 1,650 hogares y, con nuestro edificio recién remodelado, estamos preparados para ser un centro de evangelización y un lugar donde las personas puedan experimentar a Jesucristo de una manera que cambie la forma en que vivimos.

Building Fund Update

We are pleased to share that as of January 1^{st} , 2023, we have made our final payments to pay off our two "Building Fund" loans:

Loan #19230 was for our real estate mortgage granted in March 2003 for \$685,000. This was used for the original expansion project of the Religious Education wing.


Loan #39870 was for a commercial loan granted in March 2017 for \$75,000. This was used for the replacement of our building HVAC unit.

In addition to the many parishioners who have been contributing on a monthly basis, we had a few families make very large contributions in December that helped us pay off our loans significantly earlier than scheduled – God is good! Thank you all for your generous support!

We are very excited to go into this new year with these aging loans paid off. This also saved us from having to pay increasing interest rates each month on the loans.

In addition to sharing this good news, we are also letting you know that we can't cancel the pink "Building Fund" envelopes in our offertory packets until June. For donations made in January through June using the pink Building Fund envelopes, these gifts will go into our "Capital Improvement Fund" to be used for capital improvement projects (roof replacement, re-paving, HVAC upgrades, etc.).





In addition to our Capital Improvement Fund, you could also support our facility by designating your donations to go towards our *Make Disciples Capital Campaign* fund. During the final phase of construction, we borrowed \$575,000 from Capitol Bank on our construction line of credit. This credit line was a planned financing measure to pay for our construction bills while donors fulfilled their MDCC pledges over the next 2-3 years. The quicker we repay this loan, the less interest we will have to pay on it. There are yellow *MDCC* fund envelopes that are already included with the offertory envelope packets that we mail to parishioners each month.

About Gracie's Icons

In Gracie's view, most of the ancient icons of saints tend to portray everyone as expressionless and hard to tell apart. But, she reminds us, the saints were hopeless, spunky, terrified, lonely, individualistic, rebellious, progressive, loving, ambitious, counter-cultural, or boisterous outcasts and sinners, who with God's grace reached beyond themselves and made the world and themselves so much better. In her icons, she portrays saints with their correct ethnicities to show the Church's more widespread, though sometimes hidden, diversity. She gives each saint a personality and a human

expression, with a modern twist. To further this notion of extraordinary coming from ordinary, she has painted each on a discarded or thrifted piece of wood. Did your celebration of Martin Luther King, Jr Day leave you questioning what you could do next?

Are you looking for ways to learn more during Black History Month in February?

Want to start real conversations about race in your home, among your friends, in your church or community?

In conjunction with Our Lady Queen of Peace parish we are planning to offer at St. Thomas Aquinas the Spring 2023 *Black History for a New Day* course developed by Justified Anger. Those who have taken the course in the past speak highly of the impact it has had on their understanding of racism and the transformative impact it has had on their lives.

The hybrid course runs every Monday or Wednesday night from 7-9 pm, February 6 – April 17. Tuition is \$300 for a university-quality, 90-minute lecture followed by a 30-minute facilitated breakout discussion session. If we have enough interest, we will hold the livestreamed sessions in the community room at St. Thomas Aquinas.

The course includes online lecture videos, slides, supplemental materials/resources and a Next Steps Digital Guide. The series will end with an opportunity to debrief and connect socially in a virtual or in person potluck. There is a free "Next Steps Series," which includes an Action Planning Session.



Gospel Reflection

Matthew 4:12-23

Ugh. As I write this, we are enduring yet another cloudy day here in Madison, which seems to make these short days even darker. And with hardly any snow left, it seems to make this post-Christmas

time period even more dreary than usual, prompting many of us to sit inside huddled on the couch, vegging out. All this makes Isaiah's words quoted in the Gospel even more striking: "the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light."

For Jesus, too, was probably feeling that he was under an even darker cloud. The Gospel begins with the news of John the Baptist's arrest. But instead of shutting himself inside, Jesus moves to action. He begins to preach. He begins to gather his disciples. He begins to proclaim the kingdom of God.

Jesus is that great light for us, shining in the darkness. We need to shake off the dreariness of apathy that can so easily engulf us this time of year and follow the example that is illuminated by that light. We are also called to proclaim the kingdom. We are also called to make disciples. Let us take advantage of the opportunities that come to us in our everyday lives to become sparks of evangelization that can enkindle the fire of faith, hope and love in others. Let us make this gloomy darkness an even greater incentive to reflect the light of Christ in the world!


