

Enrichment Center Grand Opening & Building Fund Update

Grand Opening of our STA Enrichment Center Saturday, January 28

The Enrichment Center is a place where people of all ages, in any stage of discipleship, can experience Jesus Christ in a life changing way. Having a youth room, adult meeting spaces, children's classrooms, and a child care room, will enhance our ability to serve all of our parishioners and will be a place our parishioners can invite others to join us for enrichment activities that help us develop a personal relationship with Jesus. Our Enrichment Center will help us:

Get kids involved in Church: The youth room is a space they can call their own and where they can make good friendships and feel like they are part of our community. As they grow older, they will be more likely to stay involved in church if they have positive memories of their time in youth ministry.

Creating a sense of community: The enrichment center allows for people of all ages and families to come and be a part of Bible studies, speaker series, small faith groups, Alpha, Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, and so much more. As we participate in these activities together, this builds a sense of community for our families and allows us to grow in faith together.

Help parents: Our child care room will help parents participate in parish activities that support our faith and help us to grow in our faith. We have a safe place where children can play and be cared for while the parents attend a meeting or faith enrichment activity.

Make Disciples: There are many ways we can make disciples, the Enrichment Center gives us the space where we can offer these opportunities to people of all ages in any stage of discipleship.

Building Fund Update

We are pleased to share that as of January 1, we have made our final payments to pay off our two *Building Fund* loans:

- 1) Loan #19230 was for our real estate mortgage granted in March 2003 for \$685,000. This was used for the original expansion project of the Religious Education wing.
- 2) Loan #39870 was for a commercial loan granted in March 2017 for \$75,000. This was used for the replacement of our building HVAC unit.

In addition to the many parishioners who have been contributing on a monthly basis, we had a few families make very large contributions in December that helped us pay off our loans significantly earlier than scheduled – God is good! Thank you all for your generous support!

We are very excited to go into this new year with these aging loans paid off.
This also saved us from having to pay increasing interest rates each month on the loans.

In addition to sharing this good news, we are also letting you know that we can't cancel the pink "Building Fund" envelopes in our offertory packets until June. For donations made in January through June using the pink Building Fund envelopes, these gifts will go into our "Capital Improvement Fund" to be used for capital improvement projects (roof replacement, re-paving, HVAC upgrades, etc.).

In addition to our Capital Improvement Fund, you could also support our facility by designating your donations to go towards our *Make Disciples Capital Campaign* fund. During the final phase of construction, we borrowed \$575,000 from Capitol Bank on our construction line of credit. This credit line was a planned financing measure to pay for our construction bills while donors fulfilled their MDCC pledges over the next 2-3 years. The quicker we repay this loan, the less interest we will have to pay on it. There are yellow *MDCC* fund envelopes that are already included with the offertory envelope packets that we mail to parishioners each month.



Gospel Reflection

Matthew 5:1-12

Today's Gospel is the very familiar Beatitudes from the Gospel of Matthew. But just for this reflection, I am renaming them the "Be Attitudes." A definition of attitude is "a settled way of thinking

or feeling about someone or something, typically one that is reflected in a person's behavior." A "Be Attitude" then would be one that is part of our very "Be-ing," that is, one that is ingrained in our nature. Therefore, the beatitudes the Gospel speaks about today relate not just to actions, but to being. Notice that Jesus doesn't say "Blessed are those who perform acts of mercy," he says "Blessed are the merciful." Not that I am saying that doing merciful acts is not blessed, but rather that the wellspring of those acts should come from being merciful, not from, say, guilt or the desire to look good in front of others. What Jesus is driving for here is more than just a change in actions, he is looking for actual conversion, turning to the Lord with our whole being. As Lent approaches, it is a good time for us to reflect upon the Be Attitudes, not just as what we do but who we are.


