Let us keep these parents who have lost a child in our prayers – praying for God's healing, consolation, and peace for them and their families. May our faith in the Risen Christ fill us with hope as we look forward to reuniting with our deceased loved ones in God's eternal kingdom of heaven.

### Almsgiving Project for Lent 2023 CRS Earthquake Disaster Relief Fund

One of our Lenten practices is almsgiving, of sharing what we have with others who are in need. On February 6, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake devastated large areas of central Turkey and northwest Syria. The death toll has surpassed 45,000 and continues to climb. The earthquake is the worst to strike Turkey this century. Later that day, the region experienced a second 7.7 magnitude quake.

Across affected areas in both countries, apartment buildings and schools have been leveled. For Syrians, the damage took place in areas already devastated by years of war. In Turkey, the airports and the high roads of Anatolia are closed and most hospitals are unusable. Schools have been closed across the country.

<u>Catholic Relief Services (CRS)</u> will support emergency relief efforts led by local partners in both Syria and Turkey with Caritas Internationalis, Caritas Syria in Aleppo and Lattakia—where extensive damage has been reported—and other local partners. Already in Turkey, Caritas Internationalis, in coordination with authorities, is bringing displaced people to safe, open spaces and distributing hot meals and clothing.

Your gifts will help partners to provide safe shelter, and access to food, clean water and hygiene supplies. Please use the envelope stapled to this Sunday's bulletin and place it in next Sunday's collection or mail it to the parish. Thank you for your generosity!

### Proyecto de Limosna para la Cuaresma 2023—Fondo de Ayuda para Desastres por Terremotos de CRS

Una de nuestras prácticas de Cuaresma es la limosna, de compartir lo que tenemos con otros que están en necesidad. En el 6 de febrero, un terremoto de magnitud 7,8 devastó grandes áreas del centro de Turquía y el noroeste de Siria. El número de muertos ha superado los 45.000 y continúa aumentando. El terremoto es el peor que ha azotado a Turquía este siglo. Ese mismo día por la tarde, la región tuvo un segundo terremoto de magnitud 7,7.

En las áreas afectadas de ambos países, se han arrasado edificios de apartamentos y escuelas. Para los sirios, el daño se produjo en zonas ya devastadas por años de guerra. En Turquía, los aeropuertos y las carreteras principales de Anatolia están cerrados y la mayoría de los hospitales están inutilizables. Las escuelas han sido cerradas en todo el país.

<u>Catholic Relief Services (CRS)</u> apoyará esfuerzos de ayuda de emergencia liderados por socios locales en Siria y Turquía con Caritas Internationalis, Caritas Siria en Alepo y Lattakia, donde se han informado daños extensos, y otros socios locales. Ya en Turquía, Caritas Internationalis, en coordinación con las autoridades, está llevando a las personas desplazadas a espacios abiertos y seguros y distribuyendo comida caliente y ropa.

Sus donaciones ayudarán a los socios a proporcionar un refugio seguro y acceso a alimentos, agua potable y suministros de higiene. Utilice el sobre grapado en el boletín de este domingo y colóquelo en la colecta del próximo domingo o envíelo por correo a la parroquia. ¡Gracias por tu generosidad!

### Stations of the Cross: A Lenten Walk with Jesus

The Stations of the Cross is a visual representation of Jesus' suffering from the time when Pontius Pilate condemned him to death until the moment when he was put in the grave. The stations of the cross are above all a prayer we pray when we remember Jesus' suffering. The St. Thomas Aquinas stations of the cross are located on the inner side walls of the main church. Booklets help us follow along with the reflections and prayers.

From now until Easter, there will be many opportunities to pray together with the Stations of the Cross.

On **Tuesdays during Lent at 6:00PM** (following the 5:30PM Mass) there will be a simple, traditional experience of the Stations of the Cross.

On **Fridays during Lent from 6-7:30pm**, we will pray the Stations of the Cross at 6:00PM, complete with music, followed by a simple supper of soup and bread. Each week, as we eat, we'll hear someone speak briefly about their experience of faith, and how Jesus has been part of their journey. This is a great opportunity to invite friends and neighbors to join us as we experience the great love of Jesus.

# **Gospel Reflection**

#### Mt 17:1-9

The Gospel today is a 2 in 1 special! Jesus appears with Moses, representing Old Testament Law, and Elijah, representing the prophets. Jesus is the combination and perfection of these two: 2 in 1. And he is giving a preview of the ushering in of the new covenant through his death and resurrection. And in this preview, Jesus appears in blinding white clothes. Now when is it that we wear white clothes? Baptism. And did you know that Lent is the season of baptism? That's right! We often associate Lent with Reconciliation, but it is equally the season of Baptism.

Lent is 2 in 1.

The Constitution of the Sacred Liturgy, from Vatican II, says "There are two elements especially characteristic of Lent: the recalling of baptism or the preparation for it, and penance." In Lent we are to walk with catechumens preparing for their baptism at Easter, but we all also renew our own vows on that day. 2 in 1. And what happens in the waters of baptism? We are washed clean of sin, as in reconciliation, and we are filled with an inrushing of the Holy Spirit, in part to help us fulfil our vows. 2 in 1.

And what is encompassed by those vows? That can be summed up in an often-overlooked prayer that we use in the baptismal rite: the ephphatha prayer. Ephphatha means "be opened!" the word Jesus used to cure a deaf and mute man. In the rite we pray while touching the ears and mouth: "The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the dumb speak; may he soon touch your ears to receive his word and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father." Hear and proclaim. 2 in 1. So this Lent, let us make it a point to listen and hear what God is speaking to us, and proclaim that Word through our lives as Christians. 2 in 1.

This Lent, consider a sacrifice focused on Care for God's Creation. Why a Lenten Creation Care Fast?

Heating and cooling account for up to 48 percent of home energy consumption according to the Department of Energy. Turning the thermostat down helps protect the environment. Concerned about being too cold? Put on a sweater and/or add a blanket at night and consider how many in this world have no heat at all.



#### HOME ENERGY FAST

Set thermostats to  $65^{\circ}$  or lower at night when you sleep;  $60^{\circ}$ when you are not home; and  $68^{\circ}$ in the day when you are home. Too cold? Put on a sweater and/

or add a blanket. You can save an estimated 10% on your heating by turning your thermostat down  $10^{\circ}$  for 8 hours a day.

Are you hearing impaired? Assistive Listening System Receivers are available for people who have difficulty hearing in the church or the chapel. You can request one from an usher.

This system has two options:

- 1) You can use the receiver with headphones (either bring your own, or use ours). Or... •
- You can use the Receiver with a loop that goes around your neck and connects directly to the T-coil of your hearing aids.

If you are unsure if your hearing aid has this capability, your audiologist can advise you how to switch your hearing aid on and off the T-coil mode.




