

# Fr. Bart Grants Opportunities of a Lifetime

For many, memories of 2020-2021 may be centered around COVID-19 quarantines, masks, and re-thinks of the way we work and interact with the outside world. For me, it was a time of significant family events, and my help was needed at a couple of them. It began with my first grandchild's birth in January 2020 and the joy it brought. I had always wanted to help my daughter, a career gal, for that first year. After talking it over with Fr. Bart, he was optimistic that we would work it out and agreed to allow me to work remotely for a year.

That joy quickly subsided as my dad's health began to rapidly deteriorate. In January, some weight loss concerns at a routine check-up, quickly escalated into tests leading to more tests, hospital visits leading to stays, and, finally, a diagnosis of stage IV cancer. By the end of February, my parents needed my help. Once again, I approached Fr. Bart, but in tears this time, requesting some time away to help my parents. He didn't flinch. We just put our heads together to figure out how to make things work. In March, COVID-19 safety measures were getting stricter, and we were fortunate enough to be with Dad all but two days of that time until he was brought home from the hospital, entered hospice care, and passed away a few days later at home on March 26, 2020. The funeral was very intimate with only the immediate family... and a wonderful surprise visit from Holly and Fr. Bart, who gave the burial rites, and became our heroes. Mom is one of Fr. Bart and Holly's biggest fans!

Meanwhile, in the midst of all the ado about Dad, on March 13th my younger daughter was married in a very intimate ceremony consisting of six people, which was not at all based on the pandemic but just how they wanted to celebrate it. The family was so happy for them and was able to watch the video and see pictures of their nuptials.

In April, after everything began to calm down, Mom and I drove to St. Charles, MO, to finally meet her great-grandson. Beginning in June 2020 and through June 2021, I made many trips to/from Madison and Missouri, and then Arkansas, where my daughter accepted a 2-year position for work. It wasn't always easy, but it was a great opportunity to help my family when they needed it most. Thank you to Fr. Bart and the entire staff!

# **Gospel Reflection**

#### by Dcn. Jerome Buhman

#### John 14:15-21

The Holy Spirit is front and center in our readings today. In our Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples that the Father will send the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, to be with them. In two weeks, we will celebrate that coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, a dramatic event that marks the birthday of the Church.

But that's probably not how most of us experience the Holy Spirit in our lives; our experiences are usually a little less spectacular. First, like the people of Samaria in our first reading, we must be open to the Spirit and prepare ourselves to receive the Spirit into our lives. We can be so busy and distracted in our everyday lives that we don't take time to pray and be quiet before God. We don't let the Spirit in. But with prayer and stillness before God, we allow the Spirit to flow into our daily lives.

Next, we must be patient. Not all workings of the Spirit happen in an instant as they did at Pentecost. In our personal lives, we all encounter difficulties, trials and troubles, and often when we turn to God, we want God to answer us immediately. If God doesn't, we become angry and harden ourselves against his approach. But if we allow God to respond in God's own time and in God's own way, we will gently feel God's presence. And our patience will be rewarded because the Spirit is relentless. No matter what we do or say, the Holy Spirit will always be there, asking us to open up. We just need to stop and listen.
