

## Noticias Parroquiales y Mensaje de Nuestro Párroco

#### The Ascension of the Lord Jesus

I found this description of the Ascension and Jesus' glorified existence by Fr. William G. Most and wanted to share it with you:

Forty days after his Resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven. During this period between His Resurrection and Ascension, He actually gave the primacy He had promised to Peter, as we read in John 21. The many events between His resurrection and ascension rule out the theory that He ascended on Easter. His Ascension does not mean that heaven is somewhere up in space. This was a way of making clear that He was leaving the present mode of existence. St. Paul, in Colossians 3:1, urges us to live our lives now as if we had already died, had risen, and had ascended with Him. In a mystical sense we have done that, in that our Head has done that. In the physical sense it is still in the future.

He ascended to receive the glory due to Him as conqueror of sin and death (Philippians 2:8-11); to be our mediator and advocate with the Father (Hebrews 9:24); to send the Holy Spirit as He had promised at the Last Supper (John 16:7); and to prepare a place for us as He also promised (John 14:2).

Now He is seated at the Father's right hand, which means that, as He said, "all power has been given to me in heaven and on earth (Matthew 28:18). He always had that power as God, but now He exercises it as man, as King of the Universe, with His Mother beside Him as Queen of the Universe.

As God, He is everywhere, but not as man, though He is present on earth most widely in the Holy Eucharist, even as man.

Besides this real bodily presence in the Eucharist, Christ is present on earth in other, lesser ways. Vatican II explained the various forms of presence, in the Constitution on the Liturgy, # 7: "Christ is always present to His Church, especially in liturgical actions. He is present in the Sacrifice of the Mass in the person of the priest; 'He is the same one, now offering by the ministry of priests, who then offered Himself on the Cross [citing the Council of Trent].' But He is most greatly present under the Eucharistic species. He is present by His power in the Sacraments, so that when anyone baptizes, Christ Himself baptizes. He is present in His word, for He speaks when the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church. He is present, finally, when the Church prays and sings the Psalms, He who promised "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in their midst" (Matthew 18:20).

#### La Ascensión del Señor Jesús

Encontré esta descripción de la Ascensión y la existencia glorificada de Jesús por el P. William G. Most y quería compartirla con ustedes:

Cuarenta días después de su Resurrección, Jesús ascendió al cielo. Durante este período entre su

Resurrección y Ascensión, Él realmente le dio la primacía que le había prometido a Pedro, como leemos en Juan 21. Los numerosos acontecimientos entre su resurrección y ascensión descartan la teoría de que ascendió en Pascua. Su ascensión no significa que el cielo esté en algún lugar del espacio. Fue una forma de dejar claro que abandonaba el modo de existencia actual. San Pablo, en Colosenses 3:1, nos exhorta a vivir nuestras vidas ahora como si ya hubiéramos muerto, hubiéramos resucitado y hubiéramos ascendido con Él. En un sentido místico lo hemos hecho, ya que nuestra Cabeza lo ha hecho. En el sentido físico, todavía está en el futuro.

Él ascendió para recibir la gloria que le correspondía como vencedor del pecado y de la muerte (Filipenses 2:8 -11); para ser nuestro Mediador y defensor ante el Padre (Hebreos 9:24); para enviar al Espíritu Santo como había prometido en la Última Cena (Juan 16:7); y para prepararnos un lugar como también había prometido (Juan 14:2).

Ahora está sentado a la derecha del Padre, lo que significa que, como Él dijo, "todo poder me ha sido dado en el cielo y en la tierra" (Mateo 28:18). Siempre tuvo ese poder como Dios, pero ahora lo ejerce como hombre, como Rey del Universo, con Su Madre a Su lado como Reina del Universo.

Como Dios está en todas partes, pero no como hombre, aunque está presente en la Tierra más ampliamente en la Sagrada Eucaristía, incluso como hombre.

Además de esta presencia corporal real en la Eucaristía, Cristo está presente en la Tierra de otras formas en menor escala. El Vaticano II explicó las diversas formas de Su presencia, en la Constitución sobre la Liturgia, nº 7: "Cristo está siempre presente a su Iglesia, especialmente en las acciones litúrgicas. Está presente en el Sacrificio de la Misa en la persona del sacerdote; 'Él es el mismo, que ahora se ofrece por el ministerio de los sacerdotes, que entonces se ofreció a Sí mismo en la Cruz [citando el Concilio de Trent]'. Pero está más presente bajo las especies eucarísticas. Está presente por Su poder en los Sacramentos, de modo que cuando alguien bautiza, Cristo mismo bautiza. Está presente en su Palabra, pues habla cuando se leen las Sagradas Escrituras en la Iglesia. Está presente, en fin, cuando la Iglesia ora y canta los Salmos, Aquel que prometió: "Donde dos o tres están reunidos en mi nombre, allí estoy yo en medio de ellos" (Mt 18, 20).

It is, I believe, a reflection of their parents and family that they are growing in their faith and have come to know their prayers, the sacraments, and all about Jesus! Thank you to the parents for all you have done to prepare your child for their First Holy Communion. Additionally, I thank all of our wonderful volunteer catechists: (list them here). Finally we thank our STA Staff who worked well as a team this year to cooperate and

support the parents. I am so pleased with how well the year of catechesis has gone. We are all grateful to Almighty God for all God has done for us to bring us to this moment of celebration and First Communion!

## Thank You for Your Prayers and Support of Religious Education at STA!

Our Religious Education Department at STA experienced a strong academic year of catechesis, thanks to the parents, volunteers, staff, and students. Everyone involved brought about a wonderful experience of growing in our love for Jesus.

At STA we offer a variety of programming for our students to choose from. For students in grades 1-5, we have Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Levels 1, 2, and 3 available. We also have Traditional Catechesis available. Traditional Catechesis is offered in Spanish and English. This year 161 total students were enrolled in grades 1-5. We also offer middle school catechesis in a Youth Ministry style environment. 44 students are enrolled in our middle school program. Ninth grade students are part of our Confirmation Program that meets on Sunday evenings. Last Sunday 50 students were confirmed by Bishop Hying. And in addition to the formal catechesis offered for students in grades 1-9, we also offer a Youth Ministry program for 64 high school students after Confirmation that meets on Sunday evenings as well. We are always looking for catechists and small faith group leaders for our program so please pray about this and consider being a part of this important and fun ministry.

#### Laudato Si' Week

"Laudato Si' Week began as a way to celebrate the first anniversary of Pope Francis' world-changing papal encyclical letter, Laudato Si': On Care For Our Common Home. Since then, the annual celebration has become a way for all Catholics to unite and rejoice in the progress we've made in bringing Laudato Si' to life and to commit ourselves to further prayer and action for our common home.

This year, with the theme of Listening and Journeying Together, Catholics on six continents will work on "bringing the human family together to protect our common home" (LS 13), which is the guiding Laudato Si' quote for the weeklong celebration.

Catholics across the globe will unite their communities in action and learn more about how Laudato Si' offers a blueprint on how to tackle the climate crisis. If you have not yet read the encyclical, we encourage you to do so. It is a powerful document that has been embraced by many faith communities and inspires people around the world to take action on the climate crisis.

The encyclical encourages people to examine and change their lifestyles through sound ecological virtues, greater simplicity and less focus on material things. Pope Francis extends an "urgent challenge to protect our common home ... to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that things can change."

By taking personal action and reducing excessive consumption and waste in our lives, we can meet our obligation to reduce our impact on the environment while creating a sustainable future for generations to follow.

#### **Catholic Worker in Madison**

STA parishioners Andrea and Justin Novotney and their three boys are working to open a Catholic Worker house in which to provide hospitality to those in need of housing, particularly refugees and women with children, on the west side of Madison. A 'house of hospitality', within the Catholic Worker movement, provides shelter, and often food and clothing, to those in need. The Catholic Worker was founded by Servant of God Dorothy Day and Peter Maurin in New York in 1933 amidst the Great Depression as a way to live out Catholic social teaching and the Gospel values—responding to the needs of those immediately around them.

## **Gospel Reflection**

#### Matthew 28:16-20

I have the rare chance today to choose from two Gospels: one for the seventh Sunday of Easter and one for the Ascension; today I have chosen to write about one line from the Ascension reading. When the eleven disciples met with Jesus on the mountain from which he was to ascend, Matthew tells us: "When they saw him, they worshipped, but they doubted." Yikes! Here are the disciples, who spent years with Jesus, experienced his miracles, saw him crucified, encountered him risen from the dead (!) and yet, they doubted! In a sense, this line should give us great hope. I am sure there are times when we all feel some twinges of doubt or hesitancy in our faith lives, and it is comforting in a sense to know that the very apostles could feel the same thing. It is important to see Jesus' response to this. Though he must be aware of their doubt, he does not chastise them or admonish them – no, he commissions them to baptize all nations. In the same way, God knows of our humanness, our faults and temptations, yet he also gives to us the commission to spread the Gospel. To help us do so, God sends his Holy Spirit to be with us, which we will celebrate next Sunday in the great Feast of Pentecost.
