Pentecost Sunday 2023

Pentecost always occurs 50 days after the death and resurrection of Jesus, and ten days after his ascension into heaven. The timing of these feasts is also where Catholics get the concept of the Novena - nine days of prayer - because in Acts 1, Mary and the Apostles prayed together "continuously" for nine days after the Ascension leading up to Pentecost. Traditionally, the Church prays the Novena to the Holy Spirit in the days before Pentecost. In the US, Ascension Thursday is observed instead of the 7th Sunday of Easter, so this affects how we observe the feast days and why it is different than the Biblical timeline.

In the Christian tradition, Pentecost is the celebration of the person of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room. Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church. Peter, the first Pope, preaches for the first time and converts thousands of new believers (Acts 2:13-41). The apostles and believers, for the first time, were united by a common language, and a common zeal and purpose to go and preach the Gospel.

Today's Gospel passage tells us how Jesus gave to the Apostles the power and authority to forgive sins. "Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained." These wonderful words, which bind together inseparably the presence of the Holy Spirit with the gift of forgiveness, are referred to directly in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. But they have a much wider meaning. Those words remind us of the Christian vocation we all have, to love and forgive as we have been loved and forgiven in the world of today, which is often fiercely judgmental and vengeful.

Come, Holy Spirit


Come Holy Spirit, and fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of Your Divine Love. Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created, and You shall renew the face of the earth. Oh God, Who by the light of the Holy Spirit instructed the hearts of the faithful, Grant, that by the same Spirit we may be truly wise and ever rejoice in His consolation. We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

Domingo de Pentecostés de 2023

Pentecostés siempre ocurre 50 días después de la muerte y resurrección de Jesús, y diez días después de su ascensión al cielo. La cronología de estas fiestas es de donde los católicos sacan el concepto de la Novena nueve días de oración-, porque en Hechos 1, María y los Apóstoles rezaron juntos "continuamente" durante nueve días después de la Ascensión hasta Pentecostés. Tradicionalmente, la Iglesia reza la Novena al Espíritu Santo en los días previos a Pentecostés. En EE.UU. se celebra el Jueves de la Ascensión en lugar del 7º Domingo de Pascua, por lo que esto afecta cómo celebramos las fiestas y por qué es diferente al calendario bíblico.

En la tradición cristiana, Pentecostés es la celebración de la venida del Espíritu Santo sobre los Apóstoles, María y los primeros seguidores de Jesús, reunidos en el Cenáculo. Pentecostés se considera el día del nacimiento de la Iglesia: Pedro, el primer Papa, predica por primera vez y convierte a miles de nuevos creyentes (Hch 2,13-41). Los apóstoles y los creyentes, por primera vez, estaban unidos por una lengua común, y por un fervor y propósito común de ir a predicar el Evangelio.

El pasaje del Evangelio de hoy nos cuenta cómo Jesús dio a los Apóstoles el poder y la autoridad para perdonar los pecados. "Recibid el Espíritu Santo. A quienes perdonen los pecados, les quedaran perdonados; a quienes se los retengan, les quedaran retenidos". A estas maravillosas palabras, que unen inseparablemente la presencia del Espíritu Santo con el don del perdón, se refiere directamente el Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Pero tienen un significado mucho más amplio. Esas palabras nos recuerdan la vocación cristiana que todos tenemos, de amar y perdonar como hemos sido amados y perdonados en el mundo de hoy, que a menudo es ferozmente crítico y vengativo.



Into the Deep Update

Next weekend there will be an important announcement from our new Parochial Administrator, Fr. Brian Wilk, regarding the new Mass and Confession Schedule for our Pastorate #21. Please stay tuned for this important announcement. The main update for us this week is in regard to Hispanic Ministry. The announcement from the diocese will appear below. You will notice that there has been a change in priest assignment to cover Hispanic Ministry for our pastorate. Instead of Fr. Gabriel Lopez-Betanzos as first assigned, Fr. Brian Dulli will now offer the Spanish Mass and be available for pastoral care. The change was made because we wanted to have a priest who could be more available to the community rather, than offering the Mass only. Maira Rivera, our Director of Hispanic Ministry, will work closely with Fr. Brian Dulli to be sure we are serving the people.

Update about Priest Assignments for Hispanic Ministry in Madison and the greater Madison area

On May 5th, several priests who serve Hispanic Ministry in Dane County and the new Parochial Administrators for those respective parishes/pastorates met to determine how best to initially serve the Hispanic community at St. John the Baptist in Waunakee, St. Thomas Aquinas in Madison, and St. Peter in Madison come July 1, 2023 (when the "Into the Deep" plan begins to get implemented). Following this meeting and understanding the importance of serving the Hispanic community both sacramentally and pastorally, Bishop Hying has assigned Fr. Brian Dulli to assist in Pastorate 21 and Fr. Osvaldo Briones, SJS to assist in Pastorate 18 as the priests who serve the Hispanic community both sacramentally and pastorally with potential office hours at those parishes. The Hispanic community in Pastorate 23 will be served by a designated priest from Pastorate 22; the exact priest is still to be determined. Bishop Hying will continue to consult with priests and leaders in the Hispanic community to develop a more comprehensive plan for Hispanic Ministry in the greater Madison area and across the Diocese of Madison.

Actualización de Into the Deep

El próximo fin de semana habrá un anuncio importante de nuestro nuevo Administrador Parroquial, P. Brian Wilk, con respecto al nuevo Horario de Misas y Confesiones para nuestro Pastorado #21. Por favor permanezcan atentos a este anuncio importante. La actualización principal para nosotros esta semana es con respecto al Ministerio Hispano. El anuncio de la diócesis aparecerá a continuación. Usted notará que ha habido un cambio en la asignación de sacerdote para cubrir el Ministerio Hispano para nuestro Pastorado. En lugar del P. Gabriel López-Betanzos como fue asignado al principio, P. Brian Dulli ahora ofrecerá la Misa en Español y estará disponible para el cuidado pastoral. El cambio se hizo porque queríamos tener un sacerdote que pudiera estar más disponible para la comunidad en lugar de ofrecer la Misa solamente. Maira Rivera, nuestra Directora del Ministerio Hispano trabajara muy de cerca con Padre Brian Dulli para asegurarnos que estamos sirviendo a nuestra gente.

Actualización sobre los puestos sacerdotales para el Ministerio Hispano en Madison y el área metropolitana de Madison

El 5 de mayo, varios sacerdotes que sirven en el Ministerio Hispano en el Condado de Dane y los nuevos Administradores Parroquiales para esas respectivas parroquias/pastorados se reunieron para determinar la mejor manera de servir a la comunidad hispana en St. John the Baptist en Waunakee, St. Thomas Aquinas en Madison y St. Peter en Madison comenzando el 1 de julio de 2023 (cuando el plan "Into the Deep" comience a implementarse). Después de esta reunión y comprendiendo la importancia de servir a la comunidad hispana tanto sacramental como pastoralmente, el Obispo Hying ha asignado al Padre Brian Dulli para ayudar en el Pastorado 21 y al Padre Osvaldo Briones, SJS para avudar en en el Pastorado 18 como sacerdotes para servir a la comunidad hispana tanto sacramental como pastoralmente con horas de oficina potenciales en esas parroquias. La comunidad hispana del Pastorado 23 (St. Peter/ St. Dennis) será atendida por un sacerdote designado del Pastorado 22 (Good Shepherd/actualmente Cathedral); el sacerdote exacto aún está por determinarse. El Obispo Hying continuará consultando con sacerdotes y líderes de la comunidad hispana para desarrollar un plan más integral para el Ministerio Hispano en el área metropolitana de Madison y en toda la Diócesis de Madison.

Resurrection Cemetery Give a Tree Program is Growing

Pictured: Fr. Bart Timmerman of St. Thomas Aquinas and the parish staff, with Damian Lenshek, visit the newly planted Swamp White Oak tree in Resurrection Cemetery in Madison on May 19th. The tree was donated by the St. Thomas Aquinas Memorial Fund and directed donations made in memory of family member's passing.

This inaugural tree was planted this Spring as part of the Cemetery Give a Tree Program to replace trees lost at the cemetery recently, many that were over 100 years old. The Swamp White Oak grows very rapidly and can live for a long time - 300 to 350 years - and uniquely produces its acorns in clusters of two. Thus, like its donating parish, this tree an evangelizer: it sends its acorns out in pairs (Luke 10:1) and each acorn has a seed within it to be planted which, with God's grace, will grow and flourish (1 Corinthians 3:6-9).



The tree grows between Resurrection Cemetery chapel and the office and is marked with a granite marker that reads: "How Lovely is your Dwelling Place O Lord of Hosts! In Memory of the Faithful departed of St. Thomas Aquinas Parish."

Participating in the Give A Tree Program helps ensure the future beauty of Catholic cemeteries, which is a way of participating in the corporal work of mercy of burying the dead. For more information on the program, visit: *https://madisondiocese.org/tree*.



Are you hearing impaired? Assistive Listening System Receivers are available for people who have difficulty hearing in the church or the chapel. You can request one from an usher.


This system has two options:

Gospel Reflection

John 20:19-23

The Spirit moved me to write about the first reading today as well the Gospel. 😁 There's a line from today's reading from Acts when the disciples are preaching and each person in the crowd "heard them speaking in his own language." Upon reflection, that is the same way the Spirit works with us – we each hear the promptings of the Spirit in our own way, and we each react to those promptings according to the unique gifts we are given. In the Gospel, Jesus says to his disciples (including us!) "as the Father sends me, so I send you." As with the first reading, we each hear this command "in our own language" - that is, we are all called to evangelize, but we each have unique gifts to carry out that evangelization. We evangelize, but each "in our own language." Pentecost is a perfect time to stop and open ourselves to the Spirit and listen to hear how the Spirit calls us to evangelize.

It is interesting that our Gospel notes that it was the "first day of the week" when Jesus appeared to his disciples and told them to receive the Holy Spirit because this weekend is considered the unofficial "first weekend of the summer." We celebrate the coming of the Spirit this weekend – don't let the myriad events of summer drown out the Spirit's voice in your life because we are sent forth to evangelize, no matter the season, each in our own language.
