

# From Fr. Brian Wilk, Parochial Administrator

While Jesus' disciples may have hoped that he was the Messiah, they needed confirmation for such a radical claim. Jesus offered them confirmation slowly, establishing solid foundations before building further. For example, the disciples offer a list of people to whom many have compared Jesus - John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah or another prophet. Peter's response, "You are the Christ" may have been something he was considering for a while, or it may have come at the moment. Either way Peter's awareness brought him a new mission.

We are all called to a similar, deeper conversion. These encounters may be sudden and powerful, or they may be gradual and gentle. Either way, for us such a new awareness can help fulfill the mission that Christ entrusts to those who bear his name. Who do you say that Jesus is? How do you give witness to who Jesus is in your daily life?

It hardly seems possible, but the school year has begun as students returned to Queen of Peace School this past week. Please keep our students, teachers, support staff, maintenance staff, administrators and school volunteers in your prayers. I am looking forward to a great year.

# Gospel Reflection/Reflexión del Evangelio

#### Matthew 16:13-20 by Dcn. Jerome

The recent Gospel readings this year highlight a series of call-outs that Jesus uses to challenge, to educate, and to motivate the apostles, especially Peter.


Two weeks ago, Jesus walked on the water. Peter went to meet him, but, due to lack of faith, began to sink. Jesus saved him, but also called him out for lack of faith. Today, Jesus calls out his disciples by asking what they think of him and challenges them to answer for themselves what they believe about him. Peter rises to the challenge and Jesus praises him for his openness to the Father. In next week's Gospel — \*spoiler alert\* — Jesus will reveal to the disciples that he will suffer, be killed, and will rise again. At Peter's protest that Jesus should not suffer, Jesus will call him out and challenge him to think not like a man would think, but how God would think. He further calls out Peter & the disciples by asking them to deny themselves and take up their own crosses for the sake of the kingdom.

So, you may be asking, what do these call-outs to Peter 2000 years ago have to do with me? Well, something very important happens in today's Gospel: Jesus tells Peter that he is the rock on which he will build his Church. We are that Church, so we are connected to Peter. But there's more. The Greek word that the Gospel author uses for Church, and which he only uses two places in the entire gospel, is ecclesia. And the literal Greek meaning of ecclesia is "those who are called out." And that means as church, by our very name, we are being called out. We are being called out. We are being challenged by the very same questions as Peter is in the Gospels. Why do we at times have so little faith? Who do WE believe that Jesus is? Are we comfortable with the fact that Jesus suffered and died for us? Are we willing to deny ourselves and take up our crosses and follow Jesus? Jesus challenges us as he challenged Peter. How do we respond to these challenges?

#### Mateo 16:13-20 de Deacano Jerome

Las últimas lecturas del Evangelio de este año resaltan una serie de llamadas de atención que Jesús utiliza para retar, educar y motivar a los apóstoles, especialmente a Pedro.

Hace dos semanas, Jesús caminó sobre las aguas; Pedro salió a su encuentro, pero por falta de fe empezó a hundirse. Jesús lo salvó, pero también le llamó la atención por su falta de fe. Hoy, Jesús desafía a sus discípulos preguntándoles qué piensan de él y les reta a responder por sí mismos lo que creen de él. Pedro acepta el reto y Jesús lo elogia por su apertura al Padre. En el Evangelio de la próxima semana, Jesús revelará a sus discípulos que sufrirá, morirá y resucitará. Ante la protesta de Pedro de que Jesús no debía sufrir, Jesús le llamará la atención y lo retará a pensar no como pensaría un hombre, sino como pensaría Dios. Además, le pide a Pedro y a los discípulos que se nieguen a sí mismos y carguen con sus propias cruces por el bien del Reino.

Entonces, te preguntarás, ¿qué tienen que ver conmigo estas llamadas de atención a Pedro de hace 2000 años? Pues bien, en el Evangelio de hoy sucede algo muy importante: Jesús le dice a Pedro que él es la roca sobre la que edificará su Iglesia. Nosotros somos esa Iglesia, así que estamos conectados con Pedro. Pero hay más: la palabra griega que el autor del Evangelio utiliza para Iglesia, y que sólo utiliza 2 veces en todo el Evangelio, es ecclesia. Y el significado literal griego de ecclesia es "los que le llaman la atención". Y eso significa que como Iglesia, por nuestro propio nombre, nos está llamando la atención. Nos está llamando la atención; estamos siendo desafiados por las mismas preguntas que Pedro en los Evangelios: ¿por qué a veces tenemos tan poca fe? ¿Quién creemos que es Jesús? ¿Nos sentimos cómodos con el hecho de que Jesús sufrió y murió por nosotros? ¿Estamos dispuestos a negarnos a nosotros mismos, a tomar nuestra cruz y a seguir a Jesús? Jesús nos desafía como desafió a Pedro; ¿cómo respondemos a estos desafios?

# **Justice & Peace and Outreach**

#### Season of Creation

Friday of this week—September 1—is World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, instituted in the Catholic Church in 2015 by Pope Francis to remind us of our commitment to care for our common home. This is also the beginning of the annual Season of Creation, which extends from September 1 to October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. This year's theme is *Let Justice and Peace Flow*, a message that grows in importance and necessity as we consider so many recent events. In his message for this day, Pope Francis emphasizes that

"God wants everyone to strive to be just in every situation, to live according to his laws and thus to enable life to flourish. When we seek first the kingdom of God (Mt 6:33), maintaining a right relationship with God, humanity and nature, then justice and peace can flow like a never-failing stream of pure water, nourishing humanity and all creatures."

There are significant links between justice and the global climate crisis that we are now witnessing. The warming of the planet is seriously affecting the poor and the vulnerable—those without the resources to move elsewhere or to rebuild when environmental disasters occur. To enact the justice God calls for, we must change the very way that we live. Addressing climate change requires habit change, and there are some remarkable examples that we could put into practice. For example, Americans use an average of 365 plastic bags per person per year, while people in Denmark use an average of only 4 plastic bags per year. Certainly we can do more to move in that direction!

To inspire and encourage us all to act during the Season of Creation, STA's Care for God's Creation team will be encouraging the use of reusable grocery bags by selling recycled plastic shopping bags for \$5 on the weekends of September 9-10 and 16-17. Each bag will feature the winning artwork from our logo contest, highlighting the message of Pope Francis in his encyclical, Laudato Si'. Using and re-using a recycled bag is an important first step in reducing the amount of plastic that is accumulating on the earth. Consider picking up one or more of our STA shopping bags in September. In this small way, you can begin to make a big difference!


