

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus teaches how to correct another properly. As Christians we recognize the love God has for everyone. Just as that love motivated Jesus to find the greatest sinners and treat them with compassion, so too we must address each other out of the love God has taught us.



Have you ever offered fraternal and loving

correction to another? How did it go? St. Paul says that "love is the fulfillment of the law." What do you think he meant? How have you experienced the presence of Jesus in the midst of the Christian community?

All of these questions come to life in this weekend's readings. Use them as a point of meditation in the week ahead. The point of all of this is that we are not merely responsible for ourselves. An essential part of our faith is that we are committed to one another.

Gospel Reflection/Reflexión del Evangelio

Matthew 18:15-20 by Dcn. Jerome Think globally, act locally.

Two weeks ago, Jesus told Peter: You are the rock on which I will build my Church. In that reading, Matthew is referring to the universal church, the global church, the church throughout the world.

In today's reading, Matthew is talking about the local church, the local community. Specifically, Matthew is addressing how to approach conflict, but I want to take a slightly wider view of what Matthew implies about the early Christian community. In the Gospel today, we find the local church community as the defining community for its members. In the context of today's reading, it is evident that the people didn't "go to church," they <u>were of</u> the church, they <u>lived</u> the church. The church was an integral part of their every-day life. Their life in the community was defined by their life in the church.

I think it is appropriate that we reflect upon this and ask ourselves two questions – what role does the local church community play in my life and what role do I play in the life of the local church community? The answers, in turn, affect the global Church as the connected body of Christ. Because we all are an essential part of the Church, and we need every person in the church to truly <u>be</u> church for each other, just as the members of Matthew's church were church for each other.

Think globally, act locally.


Mateo 18:15-20 de Deacano Jerome Piensa globalmente, actúa localmente.

Hace dos semanas, Jesús le dijo a Pedro: Tú eres la roca sobre la cual edificaré mi Iglesia. En esa lectura, Mateo se refiere a la Iglesia universal, la Iglesia global, la Iglesia en todo el mundo.

En la lectura de hoy, Mateo habla de la Iglesia local, de la comunidad local. Específicamente, Mateo habla de cómo abordar los conflictos, pero yo quiero tener una visión un poco más amplia de lo que Mateo da a entender sobre la primitiva comunidad cristiana. En el Evangelio de hoy, encontramos la comunidad de la iglesia local como la comunidad que define a sus miembros. En el contexto de la lectura de hoy, es evidente que la gente no "iba a la iglesia", ellos eran de la iglesia y vivían la iglesia. La Iglesia era parte integrante de su vida cotidiana. Su vida en la comunidad se definía por su vida en la iglesia.

Creo que es conveniente que reflexionemos sobre ello y nos hagamos dos preguntas: ¿qué papel desempeña la comunidad de la iglesia local en mi vida y qué papel desempeño yo en la vida de la comunidad de la iglesia local? Las respuestas, a su vez, afectan a la Iglesia global como cuerpo conectado de Cristo. Porque todos somos una parte esencial de la Iglesia, y necesitamos que cada persona de la Iglesia sea verdaderamente Iglesia para los demás, del mismo modo que los miembros de la Iglesia de Mateo eran Iglesia los unos para los otros.




QP/STA Shuttle to/from the Eucharistic Congress

Justice & Peace and Outreach

Season of Creation September 1–October 4

Pope Benedict XVI once observed that 'the external deserts in the world are growing, because the



internal deserts have become so vast'. Consumerist greed, fueled by selfish hearts, is disrupting the planet's water cycle. The unrestrained burning of fossil fuels and the destruction of forests are pushing temperatures higher and leading to massive droughts. Alarming water shortages increasingly affect both small rural communities and large metropolises."

In these words from the his 2023 World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation message, Pope Francis calls upon us to pay attention, to observe the extent of the destruction, and to act now to protect our common home. The Creator gave us a planet teaming with life and instructed us to tend to that life. Our lives and those of our global sisters and brothers depend on our care for this earth.

During this Season of Creation, let's work on the internal deserts that Pope Benedict pointed out. This month, spend more time in nature and give thanks to God for all He has provided. Ponder the gift of trees that provide us with fruits and nuts, replenish our oxygen while sequestering carbon, and enrich the soil when they shed their leaves. What can we do to reciprocate for these gifts so freely given and act on Jesus's words in last Sunday's gospel: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself..."

Today, STA's Care for God's Creation team will be offering reusable shopping bags for \$5 after the weekend Masses September 9-10 & 16-17. Consider picking up one or more of these bags to reinforce your commitment to changing habits to save the planet. By adopting reusable shopping bags, you will be using less plastic, keeping plastic waste out of rivers, lakes, and oceans, and being mindful of our call to care for God's creation.



Making the World a Better Place, Together

On Thursday August 24, members of the social justice and human concerns groups from both St. Thomas Aquinas and Queen of Peace churches (Pastorate 21) came together for dinner and conversation. Nearly 80 people, from nearly 20



different ministries, discovered areas of commonality as well as unique ways that the people of each church have been serving those in need.

Fr. Brian Wilk, parochial administrator, blessed the group and the meal, and encouraged people to get to know each other. The Church can organize formal events like this, but the organic connections that people make with those of like minds are a key way of making ministries more robust. These relationships will make the entire community stronger.

Some of the ministries that are currently represented at both churches – such as those working for Respect Life – may end up combining. Others, such as the St. Vincent de Paul conferences, may remain distinct, even while working together closely. Some groups are currently present at just one of the two churches (such as Racial Justice at QP and Care for God's Creation at STA). These groups are already seeing members of both churches joining them, bringing new life, inspiration, and energy. Each ministry will need to discern the best way forward as we continue to grow into the new reality of Into the Deep.

This event was a great way to put names with faces, and to learn about what was taking place at the other church. The hope is that this winter, there will be a joint ministry fair event, that invites members of both churches to come and see, and get involved. We have been called and gifted with the Holy Spirit. When we collaborate, bringing the fullness of our gifts, we are making the world a better place, together.
