





Gospel Reflection—Matthew 22:15-21 by Dcn. Jerome

Probably the most famous quote from today's Gospel is, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." But I want to focus on Jesus' previous line when he asks about the Roman coin, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" I think Jesus may be talking about more than coins when he asks this question; I believe he may have been using coinage as a stand in for everything material. Caesar, and by extension the Roman Empire, stood for the material and earthly: it was built by armed conquest, maintained by Roman law and taxation and rooted in worldly matters. Caesar's face and inscription on the coin showed that this is what he (and the Empire) valued. However, God created humankind in God's image, and it is His law that is inscribed upon our hearts (Jeremiah 31:33, Hebrews 8:10). God's creation is what he values most, and all we are belongs to him. So, when Jesus says to repay to Caesar, it is not so much a comment about taxes, but more a rejection of focus on earthly priorities. Jesus could look at each of us and ask "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" and we would answer "God's." Let us strive to live then as those made in the image of God with his law inscribed on our hearts.



LAUDATE DEUM



On the Feast of St Francis of Assisi. the patron saint of ecologists and animals, Pope Francis released his Care for God's sixth Apostolic Exhortation called Creation Team Laudate Deum, a 20-page document.

He speaks to global leaders as well as the laity. He emphasizes the need for "all people of good will" to act urgently to care for our common home because "...our responses have not been adequate, while the world in which we live is collapsing and may be nearing the breaking point". (LD #2) And "there are no lasting changes without cultural changes, without a maturing of lifestyles and convictions within societies, and there are no cultural changes without personal changes." (LD #70)


All Souls Day
