

Words from Dcn. Jerome

Gospel Reflection—Matthew 25:14-30 by Dcn. Jerome

We hear a lot about fear in today's readings. In the first reading, we hear "the woman who fears the Lord is to be praised." The Responsorial Psalm tells us "Blessed are those who fear the Lord." And in the Gospel, the third servant buried his talent "out of fear." What are we to make of this?

St. Thomas Aquinas can help us out a bit. He describes 2 aspects of fear in our relationship with God. The first kind of fear is the kind of fear we tend to think about, what Thomas calls servile fear. This is the fear of punishment. In terms of our relationship with God, this is our fear of hell. We stay close to God because of our fear of punishment. But this is a negative kind of fear.

Thomas tells us there is a better, holier kind of fear which he calls filial fear. This is the fear of being separated from God. It is called filial fear because it is the fear of a son who never wants to lose his relationship with his father.

Thomas tells us this fear is actually born out of love, since it is through love that we keep our relationship with our Father. And there is a major difference between the types of fear. Servile fear is a fear of passivity; that is, we do nothing in dread of punishment, and through our inactivity, we can actually hurt our relationship with God.

But filial fear is an active, positive force. Filial fear, the fear of being without God, impels us to do that which keeps our relationship strong: that is, it impels us to works of charity and mercy. We act out of love for the relationship.

That is what happens in the Gospel today. The first two servants love their master with a filial love. They know that to keep the relationship, they need to take what the master gives them and put it to work. The third servant acts out of servile fear; a fear of punishment. This fear makes him passive; he doesn't act, and therefore compromises the relationship.

So, we have two questions to ask ourselves this week as we approach the end of the Church year and look toward the second coming of Christ. The first is: Do we fear that coming with servile fear or filial fear? The second is: How are we investing what God has given us?

New Hymnals at STA

We are still just beginning our journey together as one Parish Family with our friends at Our Lady Queen of Peace. Before we know it, we will be merged into one new parish (with a new name) with St. Thomas Aquinas CHURCH and Our Lady Queen of Peace CHURCH sites!

Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners, donors, and friends, we will begin using new Hymnals at St. Thomas Aquinas in a couple of weeks! *Gather* – 4th *Edition* will be our new hymnal. Our Lady Queen of Peace will work on this endeavor for their site in the spring. Once we have the same hymnal at both sites, it will make our sharing and working together even easier.

While there are some songs that we will miss from our current One in Faith Hymnals, *Gather 4* has a much more vast selection of music from many publishers. This will allow us to continue to have a diverse selection of music to sing at our Masses.

One of the most important factors in choosing *Gather 4*, was that it has the most songs in common with both One in Faith (current STA Hymnal) and *Gather 3* (current QP Hymnal). *Gather 4* is the newest and most recently published hymnal available. While it contains a lot of new music (this is a good thing), it also has most of the songs that we know and love to sing at St. Thomas Aquinas and Our Lady Queen of Peace, including Mass of St. Ann, Misa Luna, and Mass of Joy and Peace, as well as compositions like "Tree of Life" and "Blessed One" by Aaron Thompson.



Missalettes

Working together and becoming one parish community takes time, effort, a good attitude, and a willingness to adapt to the changes that we are facing, especially as we come together for prayer.



BOTH churches will now have the same bilingual Missalette, "Celebremos," which will be located on shelves in the entry way to the church. Missalettes will no longer be in the pews in the church, nor in the chairs at the back of church, nor in the Chapel. If you use a Missalette, please pick one up as you enter the church, and return it to the shelf after Mass.

Our parish members have been very generous with their financial gifts. We are dedicated to being good stewards of those gifts and good stewards of our environment. This change will save our parish thousands of dollars each year and it is a better choice in caring for our environment. In the past, the majority of the Missalettes were recycled or thrown away without ever having been used.

Our liturgy and prayer is vibrant, active, and engaging. The Lectionary for Mass reminds us that we should listen to the proclamation of the Word, and to receive from God, the word of his covenant. "For their part, the faithful at the celebration of Mass are to listen to the Word of God with inward and outward reverence that will bring them continuous growth and draw them more deeply into the mystery which is celebrated." "When this word is proclaimed in the Church and put into living practice, it enlightens the faithful through the working of the Holy Spirit and draws them into the entire mystery of the Lord as a reality to be lived." These are profound words to remember, as we listen to God's Word proclaimed each Sunday at Mass. (Lectionary for Mass, excerpts from #45-47)

We encourage those gathered for prayer to listen to the Word proclaimed, so that you may receive in your hearing, what God speaks directly to you! If you require additional assistance, we have listening assistive devices available in the Ushers Room, and we are able to suggest supplements for your home use, like Magnificat (us.magnificat.net/), which will assist in your preparation for Mass.

Technology & Phone System

As we've continued our journey together as the Pastorate of Our Lady Queen of Peace and St. Thomas Aquinas, our parish staff has been working through some changes in our operations, technol-



ogy, and computer systems! As we work together more closely and journey between our church buildings more regularly, it is important that we can function and communicate with our parishioners easily!

This past summer, we began the transition from various calendar systems, into a new Google Calendar for all our staff, at both Our Lady Queen of Peace and St. Thomas Aquinas. All parish staff in our pastorate can now view and access the necessary calendars so that we can share our events and keep track of all the moving parts no matter which site we are at.

We then established a new file-share system which has allowed the parish staff to begin migrating data and saving files in a common location. This new file-share is accessible to all the staff in our pastorate no matter which building they are in, so that we can begin to move more easily between buildings, and have our files accessible. This has become extremely important as we begin to work on the merger of more aspects of our parish life, including our bulletin, into one for our pastorate.

Just in the past week, our St. Thomas Aquinas site has received a new phone system, which is now completely merged with the phone system at Our Lady Queen of Peace. EVERY phone in the building has been replaced, and some touch-ups will be finished in the coming weeks. This is truly a game-changer in many ways and has already proven to be immensely helpful as we continue our work together, as ONE parish of Our Lady Queen of Peace and St. Thomas Aquinas. We are now able to transfer calls directly between our buildings, and we have more functionality, allowing us to communicate much more efficiently!

All these technology updates were a team effort. Thanks to Mad City Techs for continuing to support the technology needs at St. Thomas Aquinas. Thanks to our parish staff for being flexible and willing to learn to use these new technologies, even when it may be frustrating and sometimes intimidating to learn and use new tools and technology. AND, many thanks to the generosity and assistance of the QP Technology Committee, Jon Vitale (IT at QP School), and Austin Lacey (QP Parishioner & IT Committee Chair). We are grateful for all of those who have assisted in making these changes, so that we can continue to grow into one parish family of Our Lady Queen of Peace and St. Thomas Aquinas.






Please return all gifts unwrapped with the ornament or card attached to the alcove at the left of the fireplace in the gathering area.


