



Words from Fr. Brian Wilk, Parochial Administrator

Happy New Year! This Sunday marks the beginning of the new church liturgical year. As always, the church year begins with the season of Advent.

The season of Advent prepares us for Christmas. To understand the message of Christmas, we must start at the beginning with the history of salvation. The Advent liturgies relive in a way the history of Israel, viewing it through the eyes of Christian faith. It shows that all of the history was pointing and leading toward Jesus. He was the one who fulfilled all the prophecies of old.

Three times in this weekend's Gospel Jesus tells his disciples to "stay awake." The call to "stay awake" is meant for us, too. It is a very appropriate call for the beginning of the new liturgical year. It is an ideal opportunity to wake up to the grandeur of our divine dignity, and to try to live accordingly. Put another way, Advent calls us to wake up. To shake off the dust of routine and habit, and to let Christ come alive in our lives once more.

Here are some things to consider for Advent. How can you make Advent an opportunity to share your faith with another? What daily practices in your home will help you turn to God during these weeks of anticipation? Could you schedule a time during the day to be especially alert to God's presence? These are some food for thought for the weeks ahead. Don't waste Advent!

Gospel Reflection

Mark 13:33-37 by Dcn. Jerome

In today's short Gospel, Jesus uses the term "watch" four times, and all four times he uses it in the form of a verb. But "watch" can also be a noun, like a wristwatch or the watch on your smartphone. We use these for two main purposes – to see what time it is now, and to see how long it is until some event for which we are waiting. The season of Advent is kind of like that watch. First, it is a season for us to look at our lives as Christians and see where we are at this point in Second, it is a time to think about coming events: Christ coming at the end of time and Christ coming at Christmas. We can count down to the latter, but the former is unknown, which makes our reflection on our current state all the more important. So this week, let's take some time to check our watches to see where our (hour?) lives are, and see if we have to make any large or small (minute?) changes as we prepare for Christ's first and second (second?) comings.



Music & Liturgy Corner

Today We Begin the Season of Advent!

Advent has a two-fold character: as a season to prepare for Christmas when Christ's first coming to us is remembered; as a season when that remembrance directs our mind and heart to await Christ's second coming at the end of time. Advent thus is a period of devout and joyful expectation (General Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar, 39).

The use of the organ and other musical instruments and the decorating of the altar with flowers should be done in a moderate manner, as is consonant with the character of the season, without anticipating the full joy of Christmas (Caeremoniale Episcoporum, 236).

Each weekend during the Advent Season, we will journey to the Advent Wreath where we will pray for the coming of Christ into our lives. Our song for the procession to the Wreath is "Come Emmanuel" which can be found on the violet Orders of Worship in your pews for the Season of Advent.

Hymnals

This is our first weekend using our new Gather -4^{th} Edition Hymnals. Many thanks, again, to all our donors and benefactors who made this project possible. Also, thank you to the many volunteers who assisted in getting the pews ready for our new books! Please be gentle and careful with our new books, so they can last for many years into the future. Hardbound hymnals are expected to last a minimum of 10 years, so they are a sound investment for our pastorate!



Missalettes & Assistive Listening System

For those who need assistance hearing during Mass, missalettes are available for pickup at the two main doors of the church, as well as in the balcony. Assistive listening bodypacks/receivers are also available in the Ushers' Room. You can: 1) use your hearing aids using the loop attachment, 2) use our headphones, or 3) bring your own headphones to use. Please return them to their places after Mass!

During the Season of Advent, there will be a violet Order of Worship in the pews to assist us with our prayer. While our new hymnals contain much of what our previous hymnals did, they do not contain everything. So, occasionally during the year, especially during the Seasons of Advent and Lent, we will still be printing an Order of Worship to assist us!
