

#### Invitation to Jesuitical





### Gospel Reflection of John 1:35-42 by Dcn. Jerome

There is a lot of calling in today's readings. In our first reading from the first book of Samuel, the Lord calls out to Samuel; when Samuel realizes (with Eli's help) that God is calling, he responded "speak for your servant is listening." This can be a reminder for us not just to listen for God's call but to realize it is not always a solitary endeavor. There are others in our lives who can assist us in listening to God's call. In the Gospel, too, John helps point out the Lord to his disciples so that they can follow him. There are many people in our lives who are able to help us in listening to God's call whether that is a friend, a neighbor, an author of a book, a YouTuber and more. But that is not the end of calling in today's Gospel. Once he hears the Lord, Andrew goes out and calls Peter to follow the Lord. And that is our "calling" as well; through listening to His Word, we are to go and call others to follow Him.





Mr. Cornelius' background in raising livestock, growing Indigenous corn, and harvesting other seasonal foods promotes his ability to provide effective technical assistance to Native American farmers and ranchers. Mr. Cornelius also serves as an appellate judge for the Oneida Nation.

We praise you, O God, confident that you work in our hearts and through our actions, so that we may better care for our common home.




