

Gospel Reflection of Mark 1:14-20 by Dcn. Jerome

There is a sense of urgency and action in all of today's readings. Jonah calls for Nineveh to repent, and the city's citizens immediately do so. In our second reading, Paul warns the Corinthians that "time is running out." And in our Gospel, Jesus, at the beginning of his ministry, immediately proclaims "the Kingdom of God is at hand," and begins calling disciples. The disciples, too, seem filled with a sense of urgency, abandoning their nets without delay and following Jesus. This same urgency and call to action must be in our lives, too, as disciples of Christ, for the Kingdom of God is at hand! As Pope John Paul II said, "all the just of the earth . . . who, under the influence of grace, seek God with a sincere heart are called to build the kingdom of God by working with the Lord, who is its first and decisive builder." Do we feel the urgency to do so? In all of our readings today there is a sense of a finite amount of time for action, and the same goes for our lives; what are we doing in that time to build the kingdom?


Special Young Adult



2023 Financial Update from the Business Office



Thank you for your generous support to our parish offertory. We reached and exceeded our 2023 calendar year goal by 109%. We also saw a 5.5% increase in offertory giving versus the 2022 calendar year.

We did not meet our Make Disciples Capital Campaign income goal for this year,. This will be an area of opportunity for the remainder of the fiscal year (July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024).

The Make Disciples Capital Campaign (MDCC) began in 2018 with three priorities:

- 1. The building-wide construction project to make repairs and upgrades in the sanctuary, chapel, gathering area, music room, social hall, kitchen, and church offices.
- 2. Remodel and modernization of the Faith Formation Wing to reopen and serve as an "Enrichment Center."
- 3. The third priority was to establish an endowment fund to finance future improvements and provide support for capital improvement needs of the parish in the coming years.



During the final phase of our Make Disciples Capital Campaign construction, we borrowed \$575,000 from Capitol Bank on our construction line of credit. This credit line was a planned financing measure to pay for our construction bills, while donors fulfilled their MDCC pledges over the next 1-2 years. The sooner we repay this loan, the less interest we will have to pay on it. As of December 31, 2023, the balance of the construction loan is \$285,000.

There is still an opportunity and need to contribute to our Make Disciples Capital Campaign. Thank you to all who have fulfilled their pledge during this campaign or are currently making donations monthly or yearly towards their gift!

Additionally, we established an endowment fund at the Catholic Diocese of Madison Foundation in 2019 as part of the Make Disciples Capital Campaign. Any gifts made to the MDCC endowment will be used for future building and maintenance upgrades for St. Thomas Aquinas building and grounds. Care for God's Creation Winter Reminder

One way to act on Pope Benedict's plea for firm resolve to achieve sustainability in the winter is to curb or eliminate the use of salt to melt the snow and ice. Salt can infiltrate and permanently pollute groundwater and streams. Use the minimal amount needed.

- 1. **Shovel** Clear walkways and other areas before the snow turns to ice.
- 2. **Scatter** If you use salt, scatter it so that there is space between the grains. A 12-ounce coffee mug of salt is enough to treat an entire 20-foot driveway.
- 3. **Switch** When pavement temperatures drop below 15 degrees, salt won't work. Switch to sand for traction or a different ice melter that works at lower temperatures (i.e., calcium chloride).
- 4. **Store Correctly** Store ice melting products in airtight containers to maintain maximum effectiveness.
