

## Gospel Reflection of Mark 1:21-28 by Dcn. Jerome

3:15-4:10 PM—STA

This reading in Mark's comes at the very beginning of Jesus' public ministry, and I think the key line in today's reading is "he taught them as one having authority." It was important for Mark to show early in his Gospel that Jesus had the power, the authority, of God. It was important that Mark show that Jesus was fulfilling the role prophesized in today's first reading: that Jesus was a prophet like Moses, but of greater authority. Indeed, Mark will reveal as his Gospel unfolds that this new prophet, Jesus, is God.

3:45-4:30 PM-OP

Today, we think of authority as "one in command" or "one who gives orders." And that definition seems to be verified in today's reading, when Jesus commands the unclean spirit. But if you look at the roots of the word authority, it actually derives from a word, auctor, which literally means "one who causes to grow." Not one who commands but One who causes to grow.

The Gospel says the people were astonished at Jesus' teaching for he taught them as one having authority – that is, he did not command them; he caused them to grow. That is the root of authority.

And when Jesus casts out the unclean spirit, it is no tjust the casting out that shows his authority; it is the freeing of the man to grow in God's Word that best displays Jesus' authority. We see again near the end of the Gospel, Mark writes that it is Jesus' teaching that reveals his authority; it is his teaching that causes his listeners to grow.


It is easy to look at this Gospel and believe that the central message is God's authority to cast out unclean spirits. While that is true, I believe it is secondary. The casting out of the unclean spirit is a mere prelude to the true flowering of authority. The real authority is the opening up after the casting out; it is listening to and following the teaching of Jesus that allows us to grow.


### Young Adult Ministry
