

### Words from Fr. Brian Wilk INTOTEDEEP **Parochial Administrator**



Dear Friends:

I want to take this opportunity to briefly re-cap what is happening within our pastorate of St. Thomas Aquinas and Our Lady Queen of Peace. As I discussed at the weekend Masses a few weeks back, the parishes will not be entering into a formal merger. I explored the pros and cons of a merger with Bishop Hying, and he agreed that we should continue operating independently of one another in terms of finance, human resources and our overall business operations.

With that said, we will continue to operate as a linkage, sharing priests and deacons, programming opportunities and liturgical celebrations. These things, which we have been doing since July, have worked well, and have expanded opportunities for faith experiences between both parishes.

The third part of this is that since we will not be merging into a new parish, there is no need to change the name of either parish. I know that many of you are pleased with this development.

I am grateful to Bishop Hying for his understanding and support of the concerns which I raised with him. Our priests and deacons support this decision as well as our parish councils and staffs. We will continue to work together where we can as we continue to make disciples and share the Gospel in our parishes and communities. Thank you for your continued support.

As we continue to Journey with the Savior this Lenten season, please take advantage of the Stations of the Cross and opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation at both STA and OP. The schedules are included in the parish bulletins as well as on-line.

Have a prayerful week as we continue our journey. Blessings!

### Gospel Reflection of John 2:13-25 by Dcn. Jerome

". . . stop making my Father's house a marketplace." With these words Jesus drove the money changers out of the Temple in today's Gospel reading. The Temple was the center of Jewish life, and was to be the place in which God would dwell with his people. The animal sellers and money changers were there originally to facilitate the offering of sacrifice, but over the years corruption and greed had replaced service to the people. The temple had become a place of commerce. This Gospel can perhaps be a warning to us to not let our relationship with God and the Church become transactional. That is, our relationship shouldn't be based on the idea that we come to God just when we need something, or if we pray for something we will get it just how we want it. And our Church isn't just a place we come to on Sunday morning or to receive a sacrament. Our relationship should be a personal one that permeates our daily life, a relationship of mutual love. As we are human, it's often difficult to live up to our side of this relationship, but God is always loving and forgiving. Lent is a good time to examine how our relationship with God reflects Jesus' relationship with his Father; that is our model.

". . dejen de hacer de la casa de mi Padre un mercado". Con estas palabras, Jesús expulsó a los que cambiaban dinero del Templo en la lectura del Evangelio de hoy. El Templo era el centro de la vida judía, y debía ser el lugar en el que Dios habitara con su pueblo. Los vendedores de animales y los que cambiaban dinero estaban allí originalmente para facilitar la ofrenda de sacrificios, pero con los años la corrupción y la codicia habían sustituido el servicio al pueblo. El templo se había convertido en un lugar de comercio. Este Evangelio puede ser quizás una advertencia para que no dejemos que nuestra relación con Dios y con la Iglesia se convierta en algo transaccional. Es decir, nuestra relación no debe basarse en la idea de que acudimos a Dios sólo cuando necesitamos algo, o que si rezamos por algo lo obtendremos tal y como queremos. Y nuestra Iglesia no es sólo un lugar al que acudimos el domingo por la mañana o para recibir un sacramento. Nuestra relación debe ser una relación personal que impregne nuestra vida cotidiana; una relación de amor mutuo. Como somos humanos, a menudo es difícil cumplir nuestra parte de esta relación, pero Dios es siempre amoroso y misericordioso. La Cuaresma es un buen momento para examinar cómo nuestra relación con Dios refleja la relación de Jesús con su Padre; ése es nuestro modelo.

During our Lenten Season, we continue to learn and grow into our new hymnal: Gather IV.

Our new hymnal includes many of the songs from One in Faith, but as we begin to move through the seasons of the Church year, we are beginning to introduce a few new songs as well. The choir, cantors, and small groups have been singing preludes before Mass taken from our new hymnal almost exclusively. We have also introduced a few new texts and melodies to our assembly as well. This process will take us several years, as we begin to learn and utilize the vast diversity of music and songs available to us. Please know that we are doing our best to keep our repertoire stable and consistent so that all who come to gather for prayer can continue to participate with confidence and gusto.

I'd like to take a moment to draw your attention to one of our new Lenten texts:


### Save the Date—March 6



### Care for God's Creation **Lenten Practices**

As we continue on our Lenten journey, let us draw closer to Jesus through prayer, Care for God's Creation Team fasting, and almsgiving. Jesus died for our



sins. What will we do to share in His suffering and express our love for Him?

This Lent the Care for God's Creation Team asks that we consider fasting from meat more than once a week. "According to Water Footprint Network data, it takes over 2,000 gallons of water to produce a single steak and over 800 gallons to produce a single glass of milk. Nearly 600 gallons are used to produce just one pound of chicken meat, and nearly 400 gallons go into just one egg."

### **Three Sisters Soup Ingredients:**

2 tsp. vegetable oil 1 onion, diced

4 carrots, chopped

4 cloves garlic, minced 4 stalks celery, chopped

8 cups vegetable broth

1 butternut squash, peeled and cubed 1½ cups frozen corn

2-19 oz. cans no salt added kidney beans, drained and

2 tsp. dried thyme (or 4 Tbsp. fresh) 1 tsp. ground pepper

### **Directions:**

- 1. Heat oil in a large saucepan. Add onion and sauté over medium heat, stirring often until golden, about
- 2. Add carrots, garlic and celery and sauté for another 8 minutes, or until softened.
- 3. Add vegetable broth and bring to a boil.
- 4. Turn down heat and add cubed squash. Simmer, covered, for 8 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 5. Add beans, corn, thyme and pepper. Stir and simmer another few minutes, until squash is soft with a fork.
