

Dear Friends:

St. John tells us that when the light of Christ came into the world some people rejected it. As we continue to **Journey with the Savior**, it might be appropriate to ask yourself this question. How has the Lord been inviting you to deeper conversion this Lent? God sent Jesus out of love, but we have the choice to embrace the light to receive life or embrace our fears to hide in the night. Light stands for truth and goodness. Let us pray for the grace to be open each day to Christ the Light.

Just a reminder to please check the schedules at both Queen of Peace and St. Thomas Aquinas for times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It can be a great moment of grace during this holy season. Please do not wait until the last week or last day. Take advantage of early opportunities.

Mass Stipends: The Bishops of the State of Wisconsin have decided to raise the Mass stipend when people reserve Mass intentions. The current stipend of \$10.00 has been increased to \$20.00. This is in effect for Masses scheduled after July 1, 2024. For Masses already scheduled, the \$10.00 stipend will remain in effect. The increase will only effect Masses scheduled in the future. This is not a Madison Diocese decision or parish decision. This is being done on a statewide basis covering all five Wisconsin dioceses.

Gospel Reflection of John 3:14-21 by Dcn. Jerome

Today's first reading and Gospel are about conversion. The word 'conversion' comes from the Latin word conversus which means "turn around." In both of these readings people heard the word of God and turned themselves around toward God. They reoriented themselves. Cyrus listened to God's voice and let the Jews go. The Jewish people themselves turned back to the worship of God after committing infidelity upon infidelity. Nicodemus went to see Jesus and from that encounter turned himself toward God. We find at the end of the Gospel of John that Nicodemus is one of the men who takes Jesus' body and prepares it for burial.

This reorientation, this conversion, is an important theme for us during the season of Lent – it is a time to turn ourselves more completely toward God. There are many ways to do this! Attend Mass in person or via livestream. Do something different in your spiritual life. Join us for Stations of the Cross on Friday evening and enjoy community in the simple supper after. Take up Liturgy of the Hours (it's available via app!) or pick up a spiritual reading book. Explore a new prayer form. Be like Cyrus and open yourself to the Word of God in the Scriptures or be like Nicodemus and join a study group to ask questions. Make the remainder of this Lent a transformative experience – it's a turn for the better.

El Vía Crucis es una representación visual del sufrimiento de Jesús desde el momento en que Poncio Pilato lo condenó a muerte hasta el momento en que fue sepultado. El Vía Crucis es, sobre todo, una oración que hacemos cuando recordamos el sufrimiento de Jesús. Las Estaciones de la Cruz de nuestra parroquia Santo Tomás de Aquino están ubicadas en las paredes laterales interiores de la iglesia principal. Los folletos del Vía Crucis estarán disponibles en el área de reunión si desea rezar el Vía Crucis por su cuenta.

Los viernes durante la Cuaresma, rezamos en inglés el Vía Crucis a las 6:00 p.m., con música, seguido de una cena sencilla de sopa y pan. El domingo 17 de marzo después de la misa de 1:00 PM rezaremos el Vía Crucis en español. Esta es una gran oportunidad para invitar amigos y vecinos a unirse a nosotros mientras contemplamos y honramos el gran amor de Jesús.

Reflexión del Evangelio John 3,14-21 de Dcn. Jerome

La primera lectura y el Evangelio de hoy tratan de la conversión. La palabra "conversión" viene del latín conversus, que significa "dar la vuelta". En ambas lecturas, las personas escucharon la palabra de Dios y se volvieron hacia Dios. Se reorientaron. Ciro escuchó la voz de Dios y dejó ir a los judíos. El propio pueblo judío volvió a adorar a Dios después de cometer infidelidad tras infidelidad. Nicodemo fue a ver a Jesús y a partir de ese encuentro se volvió hacia Dios; encontramos al final del Evangelio de Juan que Nicodemo es uno de los hombres que toma el cuerpo de Jesús y lo prepara para la sepultura.

Esta reorientación, esta conversión, es un tema importante para nosotros durante el tiempo de Cuaresma: es el momento de volvernos más completamente hacia Dios. Hay muchas maneras de hacerlo. Asiste a Misa en persona o a través del "livestream". Haz algo diferente en tu vida espiritual. Únete a nosotros en el Vía Crucis del viernes por la noche y disfruta de la comunidad en la sencilla cena después del Vía Crucis. Sigue la Liturgia de las Horas (¡está disponible a través de una aplicación!) o toma un libro de lectura espiritual. Explora una nueva forma de oración. Sé como Ciro y ábrete a la Palabra de Dios en las Escrituras o sé como Nicodemo y únete a un grupo de estudio para hacer preguntas. Renovated Memorial Mobile

Our parish memorial mobile which hangs over the baptismal font is newly renovated and expanded to accommodate our needs for many years to come. The mobile was originally installed to commemorate our faithful departed during our parish 50th Jubilee in 2008. The names of all our parish members who have celebrated a funeral at the parish since our founding in 1958 are displayed. At the time, it was planned to only display the mobile for our jubilee year. It became clear that a permanent commemoration was very much valued by our parishioners and visitors who have lost a loved one from our parish. We have continued to add new panels each year for the funerals we have celebrated with our parish families. We are fortunate that parishioners Dave and Donna Gray and the staff at Total Awards and Promotions have helped us build and maintain the structure for the past 16 years.

As the structure has aged it has warped, and the original frosted acrylic panels are no longer available. Major support for our new mobile was given in memory of longtime parishioner Dolores Schwenn, who was on the building committee for our current building when we moved from the corner of Rosa and Mineral Point Roads in 1976. We are grateful to so many to have this concrete reminder that when we pray the sacraments, we pray with the whole Communion of Saints.


The position of the memorial over the baptismal font is a purposeful reminder that, in the waters of baptism, we each have died with Christ and rose with him to new life. The light of the Paschal Candle, which is reflected in the panels, is the divided yet undimmed light given to us in our baptismal candle, and which will stand before our casket or urn at our own funerals. At our baptism we become a part of the Body of Christ – those still living, all those who praise God in heaven, and those who await the fullness of life after death. Our mobile reminds us that at each Mass we join our voices together with all the Angels and Saints and with all our faithful departed as the One Body of Christ.





Care for God's Creation Lenten Practices

As we continue on our Lenten journey, let us draw closer to Jesus through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Jesus died for our



sins. What will we do to share in His suffering and express our love for Him?

This Lent the Care for God's Creation Team asks that we consider fasting from meat more than once a week. In the U.S. "Agriculture's share of [greenhouse gas] emissions has gone up 12% since 1990 and meat production is responsible for much of that increase... By 2050, greenhouse gas emissions from animals and producing their feed could easily account for half of U.S. emissions."

Roasted Butternut Squash Pasta www.pumpernickelandrye.com Ingredients:

1½ lbs. butternut squash (cubed) 1 lb. trottole pasta (or pasta of your choice) 1/4 c. dark brown sugar 3 Tbsp. olive oil 1/4 tsp. salt 1/4 tsp. pepper

3 Tbsp. heavy cream (or substitute almond milk) 1/4 c. pumpkin seeds

1/4 c. dark brown sugar 1 Tbsp. fresh thyme plus 3 Tbsp. olive oil sprigs for garnish

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. In a bowl, combine the butternut squash, dark brown sugar, olive oil, salt, and pepper and toss to coat the squash evenly. Pour into a roasting dish, cover with aluminum foil and roast for 45-60 minutes.

In the last 20 minutes of roasting, boil and cook the pasta. When the pasta has cooked, strain and return pasta to the cooking pot, remove the roasted butternut squash from the oven and place a 1/4 of the butternut squash into the pot with the pasta (these are chunky bits for the final dish).

Put the remaining squash in a blender and puree until smooth; add the heavy cream (or almond milk) and give one quick blitz. Pour the pureed squash along with fresh thyme and pumpkin seeds on the pasta and stir to combine and coat the pasta. Serve and enjoy!

Sharing Sunday - Personal Care Item Collection Drive March 16-17 & 23-24

hygiene but these items are in short supply on the pantry shelves. Our Sharing Sunday focus for the month of March will be on Personal Care Items.

Just as they did last year in conjunction with learning about the pillars of Lent, our STA MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY students will be partnering with the STA St Vincent de Paul Conference to assemble items donated by our parish members into personal care kits for the pantry. Please help provide our parish youth the opportunity to make their efforts matter, knowing that they are helping to fill the pantry shelves with an abundance of products that provide dignity and confidence to our neighbors. Last year our students were able to assemble and donate over 60 personal care kits to the food pantry through the generous donations of our parish family.

The following items have been identified by the pantry staff as some of the most needed items, but all donations of unopened personal care products are always welcome. Thank you so much for your generosity!

toilet paper, toothpaste, shampoo/conditioner soap/body wash, deodorant, combs (wide tooth)

laundry soap/detergent (consider smaller containers to be more easily distributed with a Personal Care Kit)

first aid supplies (bandages, antibiotic ointment...)
