

The Easter Triduum: The Highlight of Our Church Year



Dear Friends,

When I look at the calendar, it's hard to believe that we will soon be celebrating the joy of Easter. Immediately prior to Easter, however, is the great celebration of the Easter Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. This is truly the highlight of our Church year.

I recently read a book entitled <u>The Practical Prophet</u>. It is a collection of pastoral writings done by the late Bishop Kenneth Untener of the Diocese of Saginaw. In the book, Bishop Untener states the following, "Everything rests on the Triduum. The holy days of obligation couldn't hold a candle to the Triduum. What are the feasts of the Immaculate Conception, the Assumption, All Saints, apart from the Triduum? Even Christmas loses its significance without the Triduum. Our logo is not the manger. Our logo is the cross."

What a thought provoking statement on the importance of the Triduum. To further highlight Bishop Untener's point, Pope Paul VI wrote in 1969 in the General Norms for the Liturgical Year, "Christ redeemed humankind and gave perfect glory to God principally through His paschal mystery. By dying, He destroyed our death and by rising, He restored our life. The Easter Triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ is thus the culmination of the entire liturgical year."

I have to admit that in recent years, I have felt a diminishing respect for the importance of the Triduum. For many, it seems to get in the way of their personal schedules. We need to take a hard look at what these days mean in the life of the Church and in our own personal faith journeys. To again quote Bishop Untener, "We need to get serious about the Triduum, and recover the tradition whereby Christians break stride on these three days, interrupt their routines, turn things upside down and make these days like no other days of the year."

As we approach Easter, I invite all of you to join us for these three great days in our faith community. To again quote Bishop Untener, who said it better than I ever could, "Come and join us as we pray together with the Lord who addressed the problems of evil and put his own life on the line for our sake. This is not past history. This is our story."

And what a story it is! Let's share it and live it together.

Music & Liturgy Corner

Gather IV—Amén. El Cuerpo de Cristo

During our Lenten Season, we continue to learn and grow into our new hymnal—Gather IV.

One of the benefits of the Gather IV hymnal is the amount of bilingual music and translations of English songs into Spanish and Spanish songs into English. This is very helpful and very important as we continue to embrace a wide variety of parishioners who speak different languages. It is so important for us to embrace our sisters and brothers and do our best to make everyone feel welcome and at home here at St. Thomas Aquinas. We ask all our parishioners to enter into these songs with an openness to one another and to reach across the aisle to make our parishioners, friends, and visitors feel welcome!

I'd like to take a moment to draw your attention to one of our new texts, *Amén. El Cuerpo de Cristo*. The composer, Fr. John Schiavone, is a priest in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. He builds his melodies along the lines and modes of Gregorian chant. "I want to keep that 'church' sound in my music and, at the same time, make it accessible to the average worshiper," he says. His bilingual English-Spanish pieces are often used at diocesan celebrations across the country, especially the Communion hymn "Amén. El Cuerpo de Cristo," which was used in the Mass celebrated by Pope Benedict XVI at Yankee Stadium in 2008.






Invitation from Bishop Hying

Gospel Reflection

Gospel Reflection of John 12:20-33 by Dcn. Jerome

In the first line of our Gospel, we hear that Greeks came to see Jesus. The term "Greek" was sometimes used to designate anyone who was not an inhabitant of Israel. Why does John throw this fact in here? Because John is making a point that these people are outsiders, people not originally from Israel. Why is that important? Because many Jews of Israel could only see themselves as the chosen people; they felt God dealt only with them; their vision was blocked from seeing God opening salvation to all.

This Gospel today shows John trying to give the Jews of Israel a new way to look at things. He is showing Jesus telling them that salvation is for all. By having Greeks asking to see Jesus, he demonstrates that all nations will come to Jesus and Jesus responds, "I will draw everyone to myself." Jesus is showing that salvation comes not by belonging to a certain group by birth. It comes from Him, believing in Him, by dying to self and being the servant of all.

Lent is a good time to reflect on the ways that we might be similar to many Jews in Israel at the time of Christ. Do we view the world in an "us" and "them" framework? Do we feel our salvation is assured only because of who we are and not what we do and God's saving grace? Do we fulfill our obligations from outside compulsion or from inner impulse? Do we dwell on the letter of the law or on the spirit? Jesus came for all – how do we assist in this mission?



Care for God's Creation Lenten Practices

This Lent the Care for God's Creation Team asks that we consider fasting from meat more than once a week because raising animals creates more greenhouse gas emissions than planting, nurturing and harvesting vegetables.

We also encourage paying attention to the amount of food we waste. "By eating only what we need and reducing food waste, an individual can reduce their carbon footprint by up to 1.3 tons annually. Not only will we lower emissions by reducing food waste, we'll also be healthier, save money, and protect our precious resources for future generations to come."

Check out your refrigerator and pantry. Rather than throwing out items close to expiration, get creative and use them in a salad, soup, stew or whatever you are planning to prepare for dinner. Rather than throwing away overripe produce, consider composting it to build nutritious soil for your garden.
