



Words from Fr. Brian Wilk Parochial Administrator

On this Second Sunday of Easter, the Gospel reading gives us much more to consider besides the question of doubt. Jesus shows

his hands and side twice in this Gospel for two purposes: to authenticate that he is indeed the crucified Jesus, and to confirm that he is not an apparition or a ghost.

While Jesus says that those who believe without seeing are blessed, the faith of the Church rests upon that of the Apostles, who themselves believed because of their interactions with the resurrected Christ. In his writing Desiderio desideravi, Pope Francis reminds us that the resurrection cannot merely remain an event of the past that we have no personal access to. If we are not given the possibility of a true encounter with Him, then our faith could not exist. Each of us need to have our own encounter with the risen Christ. In the words of Pope Francis, "it is the liturgy that guarantees for us the possibility of such an encounter."

Today is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. It is a day for us to consider, in a distinct way, the gift of God's mercy in our lives and our openness to it. It is also a day to consider how we might become more merciful to those around us. Pray for God's mercy. Pray for the grace to bring that mercy into the world.

Gospel Reflection of John 20:19-31 by Dcn. Jerome Buhman

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. What is mercy? If you look it up, you might find it means compassion or pity. But that's not quite right. Compassion & pity are emotions, something you feel. Mercy is active; it is something you do – as in an act of mercy. Mercy is an act of love, not just for someone who deserves it, but perhaps most especially for those who do not. The greatest act of mercy in history was what we celebrated last week on the death & resurrection of Jesus. That is mercy. It is through the power of the Holy Spirit breathed out by Jesus that we find the source of divine mercy.

Jesus asks us, no, commands us here today, to share that merciful love with others. But we are only human, and God knows that sometimes we will fail to do so -perhaps through indifference, pride, prejudice, or fear. These things prevent us from spreading God's mercy. So, this week, let us ask ourselves, "To whom can I be a conduit of God's mercy, and what things in my life are preventing me from doing so?"
