

### Gospel Reflection of John 15:1-8 by Dcn. Jerome Buhman

One of the things we sometimes miss in our Sunday Gospel readings is context. Take today's beautiful Gospel about the vine and the branches; it takes on extra meaning when we know that it comes to us from Chapter Fifteen of John's Gospel - the Last Supper Discourses. Jesus here is reassuring his apostles that he will be with them, even after his crucifixion. When understood in this light, the reading takes on a new poignancy that strikes a little deeper. For us, as the celebration of Easter begins to fade in our rearview mirror and the activities of spring ramp up, it is a good reminder that the risen Christ is still with us and that our mission as followers of Christ should not fade as well. As Jesus says in the final line of our Gospel today: "By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."



### Gospel Reflexion Juan 15,1-8 de deacano Jerome Buhman

Una de las cosas que a veces echamos de menos en las lecturas de los Evangelios dominicales es el contexto. Por ejemplo, el hermoso Evangelio de hoy sobre la vid y los sarmientos adquiere un significado especial cuando sabemos que procede del capítulo quince del Evangelio de San Juan: los Discursos de la Última Cena. Aquí, Jesús asegura a sus apóstoles que estará con ellos, incluso después de su crucifixión. Entendida de este modo, la lectura adquiere una nueva connotación, más profunda. Para nosotros, cuando la celebración de la Pascua empieza a desvanecerse en nuestro retrovisor y se intensifican las actividades de la primavera, es un buen recordatorio de que Cristo resucitado sigue con nosotros y de que nuestra misión como seguidores de Cristo no debe desvanecerse tampoco. Como dice Jesús en la última línea de nuestro Evangelio de hoy: "En esto es glorificado mi Padre, en que den mucho fruto y sean mis discípulos".

### Mix together:

- 1 10.75 oz can Campbell's Condensed Cream of Mushroom Soup
- 2 lbs Impossible Meat
- 1/2 cup fine dry breadcrumbs
- 1 egg, slightly beaten
- 2 packs of Lipton Dry Onion Soup Mix
- 1 tsp. salt

Pack firmly in to a loaf pan. Bake for 1 hour. Sprinkle grated sharp cheddar cheese on top. Bake for another 5 minutes at 375F.
