

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.


Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth.

Gospel Reflection: John 15:9-17 by Dcn. Jerome Buhman

In today's readings; some variation of the word "love" is repeated 18 times. But what is love?

My answer – I don't know. What I *mean* is that I don't think it can be adequately defined. But we can |describe love; to do so I will turn to the game of tennis. In tennis when you have zero points, it is called love. Why? There are 2 theories.

One theory notes that the game originated in aristocratic circles in France, and that people first played the game "for love of the game," -- therefore played for nothing – no wagering and no scoring.

The second theory comes from the French words for egg, which is pronounced "l'oeuf," the shape of which resembles a zero. When adopted into English, "l'oeuf" became "love," meaning zero on the scoreboard. The resemblance of a zero and an egg is obvious, and today we use the term "goose-egg" to refer to a zero on a scoreboard.


We can use these theories to describe 2 types of love. Let's call our first description Egg Love. Like the theory that love in tennis derived from an egg-like zero on the scoreboard, this sort of love is based keeping score – if I do something for you, what do I get out of it? It is loving with the expectation of receiving return.

Our second description we'll call Royal Love, in that we love for love's own sake. We don't expect anything in return. The score doesn't matter – it is in the doing that the reward is gained. This is the type of love described in the readings today.

"In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us." God loves us so much he has given us the free will to love him back or to turn our backs on him. In the Gospel, Jesus says "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." He loved us so much he died for us, but it is our choice to love Him and follow Him. His death wasn't a demand to love, it was an invitation.

If we can but attempt to love one another as Christ loved us, if we can love with a Royal Love, and expect nothing in return, then we have achieved a victory. Game, Set and Match.

Reflexión del Evangelio Juan 15,9-17 del deacano Jerome

En las lecturas de hoy se repite 18 veces alguna variación de la palabra "amor". Pero, ¿qué es el amor?

Mi respuesta: no lo sé. Lo que quiero decir es que no creo que pueda definirse adecuadamente. Pero podemos describir el amor; para ello recurriré al juego del tenis. En el tenis, cuando tienes cero puntos, se llama amor. ¿Por qué? Hay dos teorías.

Una teoría señala que el juego se originó en los círculos aristocráticos de Francia, y que la gente primero jugaba al juego "por amor al juego", es decir, jugaba por nada, sin apuestas y sin puntuaciones.

La segunda teoría proviene de las palabras francesas para huevo, que se pronuncia "l'oeuf", cuya forma se asemeja a un cero. Cuando se adoptó al inglés, "l'oeuf" se convirtió en "love", que significa cero en el marcador. El parecido entre un cero y un huevo es obvio, y hoy utilizamos el término "goose-egg" para referirnos a un cero en un marcador.

Podemos utilizar estas teorías para describir 2 tipos de amor. Llamemos a nuestra primera descripción 'Egg-Love". Al igual que la teoría de que el amor en el tenis se deriva de un cero en el marcador, parecido a un huevo, este tipo de amor se basa en llevar la cuenta: si hago algo por ti, ¿qué gano yo con ello? Es amar con la expectativa de recibir algo a cambio.

Nuestra segunda descripción la llamaremos Amor Real, en el que amamos por amor mismo. No esperamos nada a cambio. El resultado no importa - es en el hacer donde se obtiene la recompensa. Este es el tipo de amor descrito en las lecturas de hoy.

"En esto consiste el amor: no en que nosotros hayamos amado a Dios, sino en que él nos amó a nosotros". Dios nos ama tanto que nos ha dado el libre albedrío de corresponderle o de darle la espalda. En el Evangelio, Jesús dice: "Nadie tiene un amor más grande que el que da la vida por sus amigos". Nos amó tanto que

murió por nosotros, pero es nuestra elección amarle y seguirle. Su muerte no fue una exigencia de amar, fue una invitación.

Si tan sólo podemos intentar amarnos unos a otros como Cristo nos amó, si podemos amar con un Amor Real, y no esperar nada a cambio, entonces habremos logrado una victoria. Juego, set y partido.

Also Coming Soon, PushPay Giving System:

PushPay is an online giving platform within the ParishStaq package. In time, it will replace our current online giving platforms like PayPal and SQUARE. PushPay provides a wide variety of giving options including frequency of gifts and types of collections. PushPay accepts Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Discover, as well as ACH (checking or savings accounts) gifts. Parishioners can log in and update their giving preferences at any time! You will be invited to enroll with PushPay during our transition to ParishStaq.

What's the difference between ParishStaq & PushPay?

- PushPay is a PCI compliant, 3rd party electronic giving processor for online giving.
- ParishStaq is a broader, dynamic Catholic software and database system for managing demographics, ministry involvement, events, and online giving transactions for your profile.
- In short, PushPay is the electronic giving tool used by ParishStaq. The two systems recently merged and are now fully integrated.

What's next?

- Over the next month, please look for transition communications in the bulletin and Flocknote emails. A link to enroll online will be shared and then you can create your own parishioner profile. We will also have staff available to help you enroll in person at the parish office. Stay tuned!
- Once you create your ParishStaq profile, we will merge it with your ParishSoft profile, to preserve the history.

greening of the earth. May we honor all these lives as we do our own.


