

As part of our ongoing Into the Deep efforts to realign our resources, work more collaboratively, and better serve and evangelize our people, Bishop Hying is excited to announce that he has selected St. Thomas Aquinas Parish in Madison to be a new centralized site for Hispanic ministry. An important part of this plan is the assignment of a full-time, Spanish-speaking priest dedicated to serving the Hispanic Community. Fr. Reflection: Mark 5:21-43 by Dcn. Jerome Buhman

Details, details! Sometimes, such as in today's Gospel, we find little details that say

a lot. Today's Gospel tells two stories of healing. In both, we find a female who is sick and in need of healing. Jesus calls the hemorrhaging woman Daughter, and the girl who is raised is also a daughter. And, in each story, the number 12 appears – the woman has suffered from her hemorrhage for twelve years, and Jairus' daughter was twelve years old.

Why are these details important? Well, we see throughout the Old Testament mention of the phrase Daughter Zion or Daughter Jerusalem – these are allusions to the whole of the chosen people. The Holy People of God were considered His Daughter. We also find numerous instances of the use of the number 12, which, for the ancient Hebrews, was a number of completeness; hence the twelve tribes that comprised Israel and the twelve apostles who are to lay the foundation of a new holy nation.

Therefore, we can look at these women not only as individuals, but also as symbols for all people. Thus, we see that Mark is showing us that Christ has the power to cure individual physical ailments, AND he is showing us that Christ is the one who has come to cure all of us from our spiritual ailments. Jesus has come to heal us all. And those are details worth noting.


Reflexión del Evangelio de Marc 5,21-43 de Deacono Jerome

¡Detalles, detalles! A veces, como en el



Why and How I Compost: **One Parishioner's Story** by Paula Bizot

Care for God's Creation Team

Composting turns our trash into treasure using Nature's God-given recycling system. God is so sensible and creative!

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops webpage on the seven themes of Catholic Social Teaching says, "We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation." God has given us many tools to support us in our obligation to care for His creation. Composting is one of them!

So, how does composting help care for God's creation? According to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (publication WA-1528), about onefourth of American household waste is food and vard waste. When this waste is landfilled, it breaks down in the absence of oxygen leading to the production of methane, a greenhouse gas 28 times more powerful than carbon dioxide (US EPA). Composting saves limited landfill space and prevents methane production when waste breaks down in the presence of oxygen (US EPA).

Recognizing the benefits of composting, there was a period when I wanted to compost at home, but it seemed too complicated. I had read about recommended ratios of "browns" and "greens" and how things should be layered. Then one day this topic came up during an STA small group meeting. Someone in the group told me not to worry about the specifics and encouraged me to just give it a try. So I did. For two years now, my family has been mixing our fruit and vegetable scraps with yard waste. Keep it moist, keep it aerated, give it some time, and voila, you'll have compost. It's very gratifying knowing I am keeping these items out of the landfill and creating valuable soil!

Did you know that the Madison Society of St Vincent de Paul has a 1.25 acre plot donated by the Lacy Family where we grow fruits and vegetables for the SVDP Food Pantry? Typically, Lacy Garden provides about 20,000 pounds of vegetables a year for the pantry. The garden is run entirely by volunteers. On June 6 our STA and OP Vincentians provided the labor. We weeded in earnest, (learned the correct method of hoeing!), established a second structure for the pole beans, planted beans, squash and potatoes and harvested radishes.

Some volunteers help every week, but volunteers can come whenever they are able. They are greatly appreciated. The work sessions are Mondays and Thursdays from 5-6:30 PM and you can just show up. The garden is located at 5897 Whalen Road, Fitchburg. Tools and instructions are provided when you arrive. Wear clothes that can get dirty, closed-toe shoes and bring a water bottle.
