

#### Words from Fr. Brian Wilk Parochial Administrator

In this weekend's Gospel, when Jesus returned to Nazareth, it was a sad occasion for him because people outwardly rejected

him. But it seems to me that those people were hurting themselves because Jesus was unable to do anything for them. They did not benefit from his visit.

It is hurtful to be rejected by anyone. But it is particularly hurtful to be rejected by one's own people. Jesus was amazed at their lack of faith. A key point here, however, is that he was saddened but not angered. Rejection can easily turn into anger.

We can all have experiences like this. We have wanted to help someone, but our help is refused. We feel frustrated and helpless. We feel like we want to give up. Jesus did not react like this. He did not become bitter. He did what little he could in Nazareth. Then he decided to take his light and his gifts elsewhere.

We need to pray for the courage to speak the truth. But there is a way of doing this. It has to be done with love and concern for the person. The secret is to be totally honest and totally kind at the same time. Jesus is such a splendid example of this.

## Reflection: Mark 6:1-6 by Dcn. Jerome Buhman

Last Sunday's Gospel reading and this Sunday's Gospel provide us with contrasting stories on the topic of faith. If you recall, in last week's reading Jesus healed two people: the woman with hemorrhages and the synagogue official's daughter. In the former case, Jesus said "Daughter, your faith has saved you," and in the latter, "Do not be afraid, just have faith." In today's reading Jesus returns to his hometown,

where he is met with the disbelief of its inhabitants and "is amazed at their lack of faith." The townsfolk thought that they already knew who Jesus was, and based on this, discounted his words and deeds. Familiarity breeds contempt. But the reading should give us pause: what is our relationship with Jesus? How well do we think we know him? How would we categorize our level of faith?

Es doloroso ser rechazado por cualquiera. Pero es particularmente doloroso ser rechazado por tu propia gente. Jesús se asombró de su falta de fe. Sin embargo, un punto clave aquí es que Él estaba triste, pero no enojado. El rechazo puede convertirse fácilmente en ira.

Todos podemos tener experiencias como ésta. Hemos querido ayudar a alguien, pero nuestra ayuda es rechazada. Nos sentimos frustrados e impotentes. Sentimos que queremos rendirnos. Jesús no reaccionó así. No se amargó. Hizo lo poco que pudo en Nazaret. Luego decidió llevar su luz y sus dones a otra parte.

Tenemos que rezar para tener el valor de decir la verdad. Pero hay una manera de hacerlo. Hay que hacerlo con amor y preocupación por la persona. El secreto es ser totalmente honesto y amable al mismo tiempo. Jesús es un espléndido ejemplo de ello.

Pero esta lectura debería hacernos reflexionar: ¿Cuál es nuestra relación con Jesús? ¿Hasta qué punto creemos conocerlo? ¿Cómo clasificaríamos nuestro nivel de fe?

### Caring for God's Creation by Building Healthy Soil

Care for God's

Concerned about using fertilizers and pesticides in your garden? Consider Creation Team composting. The EPA lists many benefits of composting on their website,

www.epa.gov/sustainable-management-food/ *composting#benefits*, including:

- Adds organic matter to the soil and increases the nutrient content and biodiversity of microbes in soil.
- Conserves water and reduces water use by helping soils retain moisture.
- Helps prevent soil erosion by reducing soil compaction and runoff.
- Reduces reliance on chemical fertilizers and pesticides.

Looking for a compost bin? Check out the Buyer's Guide, https://buyersguide.org/ and search for "compost bins." We recommend having an indoor bin to collect food scraps and a tumbler style bin for outdoors. The tumbler style makes it easier to rotate the compost and has openings that are at a comfortable height, so it is easy to take compost out. Here are photos of indoor and outdoor bins that our parishioner, Paula Bizot, uses with success.

Did you know that the Madison Society of St Vincent de Paul has a 1.25 acre plot donated by the Lacy Family where we grow fruits and vegetables for the SVDP Food Pantry? Typically, Lacy Garden provides about 20,000 pounds of vegetables a year for the pantry. The garden is run entirely by volunteers. On June 6 our STA and QP Vincentians provided the labor. We weeded in earnest, (learned the correct method of hoeing!), established a second structure for the pole beans, planted beans,

Some volunteers help every week, but volunteers can come whenever they are able. They are greatly appreciated. The work sessions are Mondays and Thursdays from 5-6:30 PM and you can just show up. The garden is located at 5897 Whalen Road, Fitchburg. Tools and instructions are provided when you arrive. Wear clothes that can get dirty, closed-toe shoes and bring a water bottle.
