

Reflection: Mark 6:7-13 by Dcn. Jerome Buhman

Our first reading and our Gospel today should make us feel good about our mission to be evangelizers. Why? Because these

readings show that the people God often chooses to spread his word are not theologians or learned scholars of Scripture, but ordinary people who probably do not consider themselves to be up to the task – and yet, they do it anyway and with God's grace are successful. In our first reading, Amos declares himself not to be a prophet, but rather a "dresser of sycamores" who God calls to action. Our Gospel story comes from the early part of Mark, when the apostles are relatively new to their role of followers of Jesus, and they are (for the most part) fishermen. Yet they are sent forth and have great success. We, too, are called to spread the Gospel and, I am sure, we feel unequal to the task. Yet God calls us to do it all the same, and with God's grace, we also will be successful. So let us take the dismissal from Mass seriously when we hear it: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life."

Such participation by the Christian people as 'a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people' is their right and duty by reason of their baptism. In the reform and promotion of the Liturgy, this full and active participation by all the people is the aim to be considered before all else."

As we celebrate together, may we always strive to be active participants through our listening, through our responses, through our singing, and through our fervent prayer.

In the coming weeks, we will unpack more about our prayer life together, the Sacred Liturgy (the Mass), our liturgical ministries, and our music ministries! May we be open to the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives, and continue to come together as a community of faith!



Kenneth Oparaji, beloved father of **Rev. Fr. Lawrence Oparaji** (parish son of St. Thomas Aquinas), died on Thursday, June 27th in Abuja, Nigeria, from complications after emergency surgery for bleeding in his brain.

Kenneth, a devout Catholic, was born into the Igbo Tribe on October 1, 1963.

En Español

Del Padre Osvaldo

No debemos poner nuestra confianza en los medios materiales.

Algunos llamamos 'Sistema' a lo que clásicamente se llamaba el 'mundo', como fuente de tentación y perdición de muchas almas. El 'sistema', modernamente, lo abarca todo y es el que domina. Si no te subes al carro del sistema, te aplasta. El sistema y la bestia apocalíptica a la que muchos adoran es la

misma cosa. El sistema tiene un enorme poder de seducción. El Sistema nunca se dirige a nosotros por las malas, sino que nos ofrece de todo con tal que nos sometamos a él. Esta seducción nos puede hacer olvidar que el fin no justifica los medios. La práctica de descubrir estas insinuaciones es muy difícil (La oferta de algo que siempre quisimos... con la sola condición de que aceptemos algo en contra de nuestros principios católicos... una vez abdicado en un principio, abdicar en los principios subsiguientes es facilísimo; todo es cuestión de abrir una pequeña puerta).

De ahí la insistencia y las palabras duras ('ordenó') del Señor en el evangelio de hoy. Si no hacemos así, no seremos capaces de transmitir el evangelio que es eminentemente sobrenatural. Pero eso no debemos sentirnos desgraciados cuando carezcamos de los medios naturales necesarios para nuestra labor evangelica. No está demostrado que, cuando tengamos todos los medios materiales seremos mejores discípulos, mejores personas. ¡esto no es lógico! Con nuestra lógica humana, pensamos que, si no tenemos estos medios humanos, no podemos realizar los objetivos sobrenaturales. Pero 'mis caminos no son vuestros caminos... mis pensamientos, no son los vuestros...' Dios ve las cosas desde otro punto de vista.

El objetivo es salvar a la Iglesia, a la juventud y al mundo, a mi familia, a mí mismo... esto solo se puede llevar a cabo con los medios adecuados, que es lo mismo que decir: sin medios adecuados; pasando calamidades y

sacrificios, y participación intensa en la cruz del Señor. Las cosas grandes e importantes necesitan sufrimiento y tiempo.

No tengamos miedo a pasar privaciopocos. Si nos negamos a adorar a la Bestia, y ella intentará aplastarnos. Tened cuidado de nunca ceder en los principios. Es un error fácil de caer, incluso por gente buena e inteligente. Si no cedemos en los principios, entonces el mundo, el Sistema se opondrá, pero las cosas funcionarán, según Dios quiere. Esto atrae más que el poder y el dinero. Querer tener poder e influencia para poder llegar a más gente... es una tentación... pero entonces están usando los mismos medios v armas del mundo: 'vosotros no sois del mundo'. La verdadera influencia, es la de la fidelidad a ideas y a principios. San Fco. De Asís, el modo de poseer la tierra para el Señor no es el poder y el dinero, sino pobres y humildes de corazón. La felicidad a los principios tendrá una permanencia e influencia mayor que el poderío actual de los grandes de esta tierra. La fidelidad pervive: 'yo os he puesto, para que vayáis y deis fruto y vuestro fruto permanezca...'

Hope you had a joyful July 4th weekend with your family. Bet you gathered around the picnic table, shared conversa-

tion, and had a great potluck meal. Was there too much food? What happened to the leftovers? Packaged up for all to take home? Did everyone take only what they would eat?

The BBC reports that 30% of the world's food is wasted and if we stopped wasting food on this planet we'd eliminate 8% of our total emissions. The EPA reminds us that "When food is wasted, all the resources that went into producing, processing, distributing, and preparing that food are wasted too."

Let's begin to address this issue by only serving what will be eaten in the first place. If you are not successful at that, consider composting. If you are not sure how to do that, know that there are services that will pick up your food waste, compost it, and may even return it to you as rich soil to nourish your garden.
