





Urgent: Email Scam Alert from the Archdiocese

Within the past few months, parishes within the Archdiocese of Milwaukee (and nation-wide) have fallen victim to various forms of financial fraud.

Some parishioners have notified us that they received scam emails appearing as if they are coming from their pastor, requesting that the email receiver purchase gift cards on his behalf. Although many who have received these emails have found them suspicious enough to inquire before moving forward, some have followed through with these purchases, thinking the gift cards they are purchasing are being sent to their pastor.

The scammers are very creative, and many people and organizations have been swindled by their fraudulent tactics. They have access to email strings, will mention names of people you know, and can mask the phone number or email they are using look legitimate.

If you receive an email that looks like it is coming from your pastor that is asking for money, gift cards, or requesting any items of purchase, please notify the parish and **DO NOT MOVE FORWARD WITH THE PURCHASE.**

**Dear People of St. Luke Members and Guests -
Lenten Pilgrims on a Journey - ALL!**

Yes! Lent is first and foremost about Baptism!

It is the journey to and from the pool of life-giving water which not only 'makes us one' but renews, refreshes, ignites and energizes us for a life-time of pilgrimage - a lifetime of service. So far on this Lenten pilgrimage we have been reminded with the 'ashen cross' of our own mortality and charged with a life mission: 'Repent and Believe the Good News;' we have journeyed into, through and out of the desert with Jesus. We went up the Mountain and allowed God to transform us - change us that we might help transform - change our world for the better - finding new ways to be of service with our many gifts, talents and resources. This Lent, on the Second Sunday of Lent, we were called to 'Mission' by Fr. Kenneth Amadi. Besides the monies collected for our Missionary Cooperation Plan we hope to bond more deeply with our sisters and brothers of St. Pius X Parish, Gbagalape, Nigeria as we learn from them what it means to be 'neighbors' no matter how many miles are between us. Our Lenten Almsgiving helps our St. Pius X sisters and brothers as well.

Our journey brought us to Jacob's Well and our encounter with the seeking woman. Along with the Woman at the Well we were encouraged to accept ourselves, and one another, in love and evangelize as we tell and retell our Baptismal / life stories. Last Sunday we met up with 'the person blind from birth.' Our challenge also is to listen to one another's conversion stories and let the Holy Spirit touch us - connect us with creation - anoint our eyes with sight giving spittle and mud - that we, too, might 'see differently.' 'Seeing differently' so we can 'be the change' leads us right into today's Gospel story of the 'Raising of Lazarus.' We see differently with eyes opened; accept living water which quenches thirst; and call others from their tombs to newness of life in Christ.



The problem I 'see' with all this, at least for me, is that my life (our lives) is/are too full. My eyes are bulging (my BMI too is off target). My 2017 Mission experience in Nigeria has opened my eyes and heart to reality. I need to make more room; not for stuff, but for that which really matters. Fasting has gotten a bad rap in our society. "Why deprive ourselves - we've worked for it - we deserve as much as we can get!" is our chant. Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the three time-honored conversion pillars of Lenten practice. The "Great Fast" will soon be upon us. The "Great Fast" runs throughout the whole of the Easter Triduum: Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening through the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. No matter how well we have or have not done with our fasting thus far on our Lenten Journey we can still refocus in these late Lenten days - for a lifetime. I offer two reflections as we continue our Lenten Journey:

No. 1 "Thoughts on Fasting" by S. Joan Chittister, OSB

"How do we explain the meaning of fasting in our own time? The answers ring with the kind of simplicity and depth common only to the holiest of disciplines. The fact is that the values of fasting strike to the heart of a person, sharpen the soul to the presence of God, and energize the spirit in a way engorgement never can.

"Fasting calls a person to authenticity. It empties us, literally, of all the non-essentials in our lives so we have room for God. It lifts our spirits beyond the mundane. Fasting confronts our consumer mentality with a reminder of what it is to be dependent on God. It reminds us that we are not here simply to pamper ourselves. We are, indeed, expected to be our brother and sister's keeper. We know why we are hungry. We voluntarily gave up the food we could have had. But why are they hungry? Where is the food they should be eating? What can we do to fill them now that we are done filling only ourselves?

"Fasting opens us to the truth. It makes space in us to hear others, to ask the right questions, to ingest the answers we have been too comfortable to care about for far too long. It makes room for adding "to our service a bit more prayer and reading and almsgiving," as the *Rule of Benedict* says. Fasting requires us to develop a sense of limits. No, we may not have it all, do it all, and demand it all. Our needs do not exceed the needs of others, and our needs may never become more important than theirs. Fasting teaches us to say no to ourselves in small things so that we have the strength to say no to those people and systems and governments who want to use us to shore up their own power and profit despite the needs of others. No. 2 "A Lenten Fast" by Fr. Lichtenberg

"Fast from judging others; Feast on Christ living in them.

Fast from words that pollute; Feast on phrases that purify.

Fast from discontent; Feast on gratitude. Fast from anger; Feast on patience.

Fast from pessimism; Feast on optimism. Fast from worry; Feast on appreciation.

Fast from complaining; Feast here too on appreciation.

Fast from unrelenting pressures; Feast on unceasing prayer.

Fast from bitterness; Feast on forgiveness.

Fast from over concern with self; Feast on compassion for others.

Fast from personal anxiety; Feast on trust.


Fast from discouragement; Feast on eternal hope.

Fast from everything that separates you from God; Feast on everything that draws you in and to Christ as Easter People.

Fast from Wickedness

Leo, bishop of Rome from 440 to 461, wrote: "The sum total of our fasting does not consist in merely abstaining from food. In vain do we deny our body food if we do not withhold our heart from wickedness and restrain our lips so that they speak no evil. We must



so moderate our rightful use of food that our other desires may be subject to the same rule. They therefore who desire to do good works, let them not fear that they shall be without the means: since even for giving two pennies, the generosity of the poor widow of the gospel was glorified!"

Fasting is a means by which we find the energy to "withhold our hearts from wickedness and restrain our lips so that they speak no evil."

Whether you refrain from eating altogether or you simplify your meal, use some time at the table to write letters to your political representatives about issues of justice and peace: health care for the sick, children's rights and education, dwellings for the homeless, the conservation of the earth's resources. Send copies of your letters to the local newspaper. Let your letters be the two pennies of the widow of the gospel.
