Amidst all life’s uncertainties; disappointments; so many kinds of death each day – rising to new life through God’s Divine Spirit in us is often a real challenge. Whether it be the loss of a loved one in physical death caused by COVID-19 or other illnesses; lesser but life-changing deaths; our own aging or that of a parent or spouse; the day to day uncertainty of these COVID-19 times; job loss; economic uncertainty; children growing; the questionable status of household, neighborhood and world ‘peace;’ or senseless violence, our Faith assures us that ‘Risen Life’ is ours on the journey if we see with eyes open to ‘Newness of Life.’ The Cross of Good Friday always gives way to the Resurrection of Easter: ‘dying to rising!’

More than others, this year I have been longing to sing again, “*Heleluyan*” as we wait and hope for an end to the darkness of the scourge of COVID-19. “*Heleluyan*” has become one of my favorite Easter acclamations:

**Christ is Risen, come and praise Him! Heleluyan! Hear the Gospel of Salvation! Heleluyan!\***  
**Now, the dark of death is broken! Heleluyan! Life forever for all people! Heleluyan!**

\**Heleluyan* is the Creek or Muskogee Nation word for ‘Alleluia.’ The Muskogee people sang *Heleluyan* as they walked the Trail of Tears. Today, every time it is sung, *Heleluyan* reminds us that God is always at the end of our road, ready to meet us there no matter what we encounter on our trail of life. Because all Christians—all people—are on a journey of faith together, this is a reminder of our shared bonds with those far and near as we walk together. We travel our journeys as one people. Our global oneness in fighting the pandemic affecting all our sisters and brothers in God’s Earth Family has become so much more evident. ‘*We journey together and the journey makes us one.*’ We share in the pain, sorrow, struggle, happiness, joy and salvation of each other. We are all one. Using *Heleluyan* as a Gospel acclamation in our Easter Eucharist honors the Creek heritage of this song as a song of journey and as a song of great faith.

How appropriate is *Heleluyan* as we continue our COVID-19 journey with ‘light at the end of the pandemic tunnel.’ We thank Shawn Rochon for his arrangement and for introducing us, through his Master’s Concert (2013), to the meaningful heritage of the Creek-Muskogee Nation.

Also in wishing all “A Blessed Easter!” I share a favorite Christmas greeting which reads:

**“Out of silence, MUSIC... Out of darkness, LIGHT...**

**Out of uncertainty, PROMISE... Hope was born that night.”**

Since this is one great big mystery we celebrate: The Incarnation of God in Jesus – an Incarnation which continues in us each day – a journey of Redemption and Salvation – of forgiveness, mercy and healing, the text is also an appropriate Easter message. “Out of silence, MUSIC...PROMISE” captures our grief over the absence of our beautiful adult and youth choirs and the promise of their return.

**THANKS TO ONE AND ALL** who have helped us ‘stay connected,’ and all who celebrated the Easter Mystery ‘distanced in-person;’ at home and online, and those who ministered on behalf of the community making it possible for us to join together in ‘in-person and virtual prayer’ and life-giving; life-saving outreach.

## EASTER 2021

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Early on Easter morning, three women go to the tomb of Jesus to anoint His body, per Jewish custom. Approaching the tomb, they discuss the dilemma of rolling back the large stone that covers the entrance, for it is too heavy for them to move. It is at this moment that they realize the stone has been rolled away and, upon entering the tomb, Jesus' body is nowhere to be found. Rather, an angel greets them with the instruction, "Do not be amazed!" Jesus had risen just as He had foretold. (Mark 16:1-7)

How often during this past year have we discussed with one another our human frailty amid the heavy burdens that confront us? Like the three women, we continue with our daily responsibilities amid uncertainty, doubt, and confusion. If this past year has taught us anything, a lesson may be that we have less control over our lives and the successes we seek than we once thought. Rather than depress or frustrate us, this realization should be a consolation to all those who celebrate the Resurrection.

It was precisely in this moment of the recognition of weakness that the glory of God was made manifest. While the women entered the empty tomb in sheer amazement, the heavenly being reminded them, "Do not be amazed!" What is burdensome, overwhelming, destructive, and even deadly for humans, is conquered by Christ. God has promised to save us, and Christ has surely risen from the dead. Do not be amazed!

What the angel is instructing the women – and all of us now – is to believe that God is faithful. Every worry of the human heart comes from a lack of trust in God's faithfulness. During Lent, we may have profoundly experienced these worries as we tried to let go of the behaviors or treasures we cling to for security and comfort. At Easter, we rejoice in the event of God's faithfulness that destroys the fears, even the ultimate fear of death, forever. Rather than be amazed, or in disbelief of the saving power of God, we are called to rejoice in His faithfulness and love for us.

I invite you to ponder the reading from Isaiah 54 that was read at the Easter Vigil. We hear the Lord say:


*Though the mountains leave their place and the hills be shaken, my love shall never leave you nor my covenant of peace be shaken, says the LORD, who has mercy on you...*

*All your children shall be taught by the LORD, and great shall be the peace of your children. In justice shall you be established, far from the fear of oppression, where destruction cannot come near you. (Is 54:10-14)*

In the many ways we have all been challenged, confounded, or wounded this past year, I ask you to bring these burdens to the empty tomb. Together with the women, encounter the glory of God's faithfulness and let your heart rejoice in His mercy and love for you. His love will never leave you. Let us all bring the joy of the Resurrection, which we celebrate at every Mass, to our families and communities.
