**Forgiveness**

All three scriptures today speak about “repentance and the forgiveness of sins.” The attitude of Christians is not to be one of revenge and violence, but of reconciliation and forgiveness.

The early church community could have reacted to the killing of Jesus, their leader, by trying to get revenge or by trying to destroy those who killed Jesus. They were initially afraid of the authorities; however, Jesus came saying “Peace be with you.” Jesus came giving the power to forgive. Instead of revenge and violence, the early community seems to have adopted an attitude of forgiveness and reconciliation, even toward those who had been so hostile to Jesus and his teaching and even toward those who persecuted the early Christian community.

We are not called to be passive and do nothing in the face of injustice. We are called to an active and loving nonviolence. How does this spirit of forgiveness influence our action for justice?

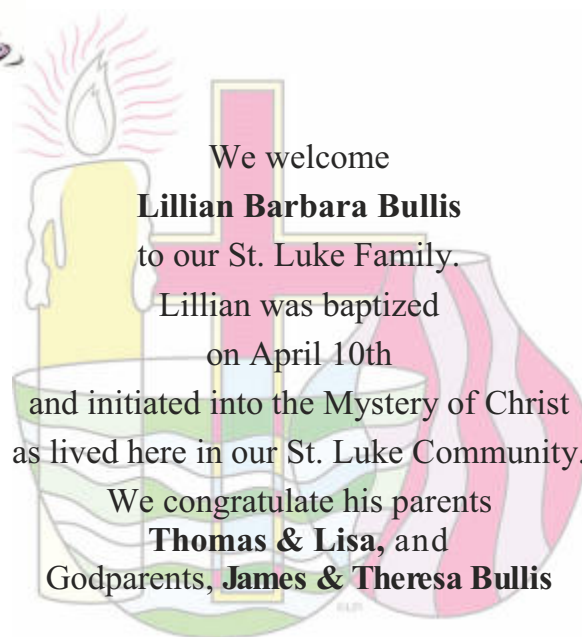


## The Mercy Tree

## Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Christ,

We continue to celebrate the Easter Sacraments and reflect on, digest and live the Easter Mystery of Christ through our Mystagogia. Today we celebrate the First Communion of 3 young members of our Catholic Christian Faith Community of St. Luke. A wonderful day for them this is YES, but also a graced time for all of us to reflect on what Eucharistic Communion is all about. As the Body of Christ we celebrate the richness of who Christ is for us and who we are as the Body of Christ.

The Celebration of Eucharist and the 'act of communing' joins us as Christians to the Body of Christ and to one another as Church. This past year plus, with COVID-19 pandemic restrictions on, and fears of gathering, many have yearned for Eucharistic Communion but been unable to receive Communion. We have however, learned how much 'communion' – 'being one' – celebrating our oneness in any way possible is important; essential to our being the Body of Christ – God's earth family.

At the Mass of the Lord's Supper we celebrated in a special way who we are as Eucharist - the Body of Christ - disciples called to be 'one body' - 'a holy Communion' - 'footwashers' (even without the foot washing ritual again this year) – 'people of service' - 'the eyes, hand, feet, heart of Christ.'

Following Vatican Council II, Mr. Gabe Huck a gifted, holy, far sighted writer and teacher in Chicago spoke of 'us, the gathered Body of Christ, becoming *'the holy communion.'* Most often we think of Communion or Holy Communion as our sharing the Eucharistic Presence of the Risen Christ in the consecrated bread and wine. This meal shared certainly is Holy Communion. But have we ever thought of us – gathered either in person or virtually – as a Holy Communion in Christ? Gabe Huck is correct when he teaches that 'we – the holy communion – leave the building together as the Body of Christ – the eyes and hands of Christ. St. John's Gospel from the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday teaches: as Eucharist–*a holy communion*—we go forth to be of SERVICE as we 'live into our Baptism.'

First Communion is more than a family affair—EUCARIST IS A FAITH COMMUNITY EVENT IN THE SPIRIT OF THE RISEN CHRIST! Children learn by doing and they (and adults) learn through ritual. Children (and adults) learn to worship by worshipping; to share by sharing; to pray by praying as they see their parents pray; to love by being loved and loving. Children (and adults) grasp symbols in real ways when they are done regularly and well. For First Communicants (and adults) God's love is like a parents' love. Forgiveness from God is identified by forgiveness they receive or do not experience from others. When they hear that Eucharist is a special meal which Jesus shares with us they immediately relate it to meals shared by family and friends.

When we say "AMEN" while approaching the Lord's Table we are saying "Yes, I believe" in the Sacramental Presence of Christ in the consecrated Eucharistic Bread and Wine, AND we are saying "YES, WE ARE SACRAMENT! - WE ARE A VITAL PART OF CHRIST'S BODY AND IN COMMUNION WE ARE UNITED - MADE ONE! - 'a Holy Communion' in Christ!"

Archbishop ListECKI has invited the Church of Southeastern Wisconsin to reflect on 'The Gift of Sunday.' In his introduction to *'The Gift of Sunday'* pamphlet (available on the formation material table), the Archbishop reminds us, "*The Church draws her life from the Eucharist... It is truly right and just to give God thanks and praise through Christ our Lord.... Each Sunday is a participation in the very action of Christ, and we encounter the living God alive in our midst.... As we begin each week in prayer, marking the Lord's Day with fidelity, we come to Mass with joys and sorrows. We bring all of this to God and allow God to transform us.*"

**The Parish Staff, Pastoral Council, and all the People of Saint Luke join me in extending CONGRATULATIONS to 'Jesus' special little ones' who come forward to receive Eucharist at the Lord's Table in COMMUNION for the first time this Sunday!**

## Safe Environment News



### Did You Know...?

Criminal Background Checks are conducted on every priest, deacon, parish director, employee and volunteer working with minors in active ministry in parishes and schools in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

In 2020 over 70 Safe Environment Education sessions were conducted in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Over 1,800 adults were trained in identifying signs of abuse and neglect, and over 3,800 criminal background checks were conducted. Over 50,000 children were trained in Safe Environment topics.

Victim/survivor restorative justice support groups are hosted by Paula Kaempffer, the Outreach Coordinator for Restorative Justice and Abuse Prevention for the Archdiocese of St. Paul/Minneapolis. Virtual offerings include a general group for all victims/survivors of sexual abuse, a group specifically for those sexually assaulted by clergy as adults, and a group for family and friends of victims of clergy sexual abuse. 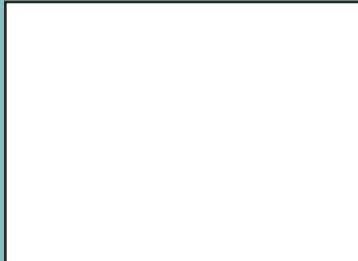
