





At all Masses for TODAY, May 23, we will be combining our monthly grocery collection for the St. Vincent de Paul Outreach Program, the Mini Vinnie Little Food Pantry and the Waukesha Food Pantry and our annual collection for items that can be used for the St. Vincent de Paul Summer Lunch in the Park Program.

The St. Luke Society of St. Vincent de Paul is planning to participate in providing free lunches for children and their families at Saratoga Park, designated as a low income area of Waukesha. Due to Covid restrictions, lunches will be prepared and packaged and handed out rather than served on site. St. Luke Parish will provide lunches on June 16, 17 and 18. The lunches will be assembled in Carpenter Hall in the evening and taken to the park and distributed the next morning. Donations of individually packaged snacks or cookies, fruit cups, pudding cups or juice boxes are helpful. Cash donations are appreciated to purchase ham, cheese, bread, fresh fruit and vegetables and milk.

As noted Catholic writer Caryll Houselander states, "We are the resurrection going on always!"

As we allow God's breath to fill and animate us; encourage others to breathe and do whatever is needed to make sure that all our sisters and brothers can breathe freely and deeply, enjoying the dignity given us all by God's Spirit in Christ, yes, 'the resurrection goes on always.'

In so many ways in recent years and especially during the past fourteen plus months we have known bitterness, pain, hurt, hatred caused by the defense of injustice and discrimination. We have known the pain of suffering and seeing loved ones gasping for breath on streets; in hospitals; care centers and homes; near to us and in distant lands as the COVID-19 Pandemic raged. Beyond dying, we have experienced the resurrection first hand, as people have risen to the moment and assisted with aid; medical care; essential work; plain old fashioned love and support in unprecedented times.

Music is known to be a healing remedy for our human pain leading us from death to life; raising us up together to Newness of Life.

Once again Shawn Rochon, our Director of Music and Liturgy, has found a most appropriate hymn text in these times of COVID-19, societal unrest, and uncertainty giving gradual movement out of pandemic and injustice crisis, offering us hope to go on living and loving.

In a recent email to the Music Ministry (after the Catholic Comeback Matrix #8 permitted choirs) Shawn wrote, "Hello Everyone, whether or not you will be singing with us for Pentecost I want to share this song with you.

"I found this song a few months ago, and I think it is the perfect prayer with which to end our Easter season and this pandemic year, as some of you come together to sing together for the first time in a long time. I am hopeful that the choir ensemble on this coming Pentecost Sunday will sing this.

"The hymn, 'Christ Still Rises' so beautifully weaves together our Easter mystery, the glory of Christ in and through us, and, I think, speaks to much of the myriad emotions felt by all of us recently. I hope it crosses any lines of division, opinion, or the like, and it speaks to us wherever we are on our journey, at least I hope you find this to be the case." Shawn

It is our privilege this Pentecost to Confirm one of our youth, Jordan John Karch. In part, Jordan wrote in his letter requesting Confirmation:

"I want to increase my relationship with God. I chose Nicholas as my Confirmation name because I want to be like St. Nicholas who fed the hungry and gave to the poor. I have helped many people in need and participated at parish formation, community building activities and Outreach, even singing and playing chimes in the Youth Choir."

Jordan is one more proof that 'Christ Still Rises' in our day. Congratulations Jordan on your Confirmation!

## *Fullness of Easter*

Easter reaches its fullness today, the 50th day, the Spirit's day, birthday of the church, great Pentecost! What began in cold ashes, what was washed with water and oiled with gladness and nourished with bread and wine now is filled with breath and stirred aflame. Breathe deeply today; let every breath be a prayer. Play the flute or the kazoo. Hang wind chimes to catch God's breath. Fly a kite. Be on fire today; live passionately. Read a love poem. Challenge someone to act on behalf of the common good. Take a stand against a grave injustice. Light seven candles on the dinner table. Wear red. Eat strawberries (if you're not allergic). Sing "Come, Holy Ghost." (And if you don't know it, find someone to teach it to you.) Fifty days of Easter have been given for our delight and for our salvation. Rejoice and be glad!

## *Pentecost*

On Pentecost, we celebrate the day on which the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples in a form resembling tongues of fire, empowering them to proclaim the message that Jesus is risen from the dead. According to Acts of the Apostles (1:13–14), Mary, the apostles, and other disciples had been huddled together in an upper room after the ascension of Jesus. But on this day they went forth from that room as new people, alive in the Spirit, speaking in tongues and winning over believers by the thousands.

A few special features mark the Mass of Pentecost Sunday. The options for the First Reading for Saturday's Vigil Mass, for example, are taken from the Old Testament. Throughout the Easter season, all the readings come from the New Testament—except, of course, the Responsorial Psalm. Saturday's First Reading foreshadows the coming of the Spirit. On Sunday, the First Reading comes from Acts of the Apostles, and it tells the story of Pentecost. After the Second Reading, everyone sings or says the Pentecost Sequence, a special hymn that tells the meaning of this day.

If the priest uses Eucharistic Prayer I, he inserts a special phrase saying that this is the day "on which the Holy Spirit appeared to the Apostles in tongues of fire." The Mass concludes with a double "alleluia." The deacon or priest adds the words to his dismissal, and you answer, "Thanks be to God, alleluia, alleluia." This joyful acclamation concludes the Church's celebration of Easter.

The Paschal candle burns throughout the Pentecost Mass, as it does for the fifty days of Easter Time. After Mass, however, it is moved from its place near the ambo to a position in the baptistry.

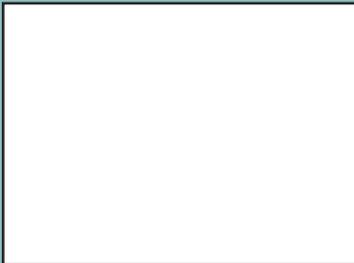
