Holy Family

The scriptures this Sunday highlight the Catholic social teaching principle of solidarity - the recognition that we are responsible for each other – within our families, neighborhoods, country, and the whole world. The second reading reminds us that we cannot be in solidarity with people whom we hold grudges against. We can only be in solidarity if we are one community, regardless of our differences. It was a long, dusty, journey, but the importance of being present with others merited the effort.

We lift you in prayer. We send Christmas Greetings - 'tidings of great joy'- to all who join in celebrating Emmanuel: God with us! 'A Blessed and Merry Christmas to All!'

Many of us are feeling the stress of the troubling times in which we live. Each day, we are confronted with the news of violence, economic challenges, racial injustice unrest, and certainly life COVID-19 style; like it or not. This Christmas, as a Nation and as Church, we find ourselves divided through political and racial struggles. Civility and honesty is indeed wanting in our relationships and in our society. With hope we long for peacefulness, equality and justice; a return to truth which gives light.

We also call to mind and celebrate all the goodness shown forth in so many people and organizations giving hope for a more just, loving, welcoming and inclusive society. There were over 400 gift tags on our Advent Giving Tree and all gifts were purchased and distributed brightening many hearts this Christmas. Other gifts just appeared: Thanks for them, too!

Perhaps our stress is even closer to home as we deal with the illness and maybe death of a loved one from COVID-19 or any illness, the loss of a job, discrimination of one kind or another, a broken relationship, tragedy or natural disaster. "Letting go in life and in death is very hard work." What we really want for Christmas is a little peace. Our God is closer to us than we are to ourselves and loves equally each and every member of our earth family. There in lies the message and beauty of Christmas! In the face of a baby our tremendous human potential is seen and celebrated.

Our celebration of Christmas brings to light the Word of God made flesh in Jesus and in US. Christmas is Easter in Wintertime! The crib and cross are one. From the manger bed, through life to the cross and beyond the grave, the Lord Jesus shows us the path to health, happiness and holiness.

In last year's Christmas message I wrote that as the saying goes, "Next year in Jerusalem" we would again hopefully enjoy our Music Ministry. Well, this year 'in Jerusalem' we again have our Music Ministry back with us almost in full force. We welcome back the choral artistry of our wonderful choir (masked, of course), under the direction of Shawn Rochon and accompanied by Jacki Thering; our Handbell Choir under Shawn's direction; and our Youth Handchime Choir under the direction of Caitlin and Vance Dahl. This year our Singing Choir has prepared three selections from different countries; texts, melodies and harmony to lift our hearts: 'He Is Born (a French Carol);' 'O Sanctissima,' a traditional Sicilian Melody ('O Thou Joyful day;') 'Once, As I Remember,' a 17th century Italian Carol; 'Infant Holy, Infant Lowly;' and finally, 'Christmas Lullaby' which ties together Christmas and Easter as one Mystery in Faith. Without specific permission of World Library Publications I share only a few lines of Joe Mattingly's text from 'Christmas Lullaby' - "Christ by highest heav'n adored; Christ the everlasting Lord. Look upon the cradle stand, nails shall pierce his feet and hands. O see now, our infant King shall bear our cross in suffering." It is so tempting to keep the Christ Child in the manger, rather than listen to the Lord who grew up and showed us how to live and love as maturing People of God bringing God's Justice. We pray: O Emmanuel, transform us on our Journey of Faith.'


