

Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel reading, St. Mark writes this story addressed to the pagan converts. His intention is to tell them that they are also invited to participate in the heavenly banquet. In His ministry of preaching, teaching and healing Jesus, though He spent His time mostly with the Jewish people, not



with the Gentiles also instructed the apostles to go out to all the corners of the world and preach the good news.

The healing of a deaf and dumb in Decapolis and the exorcism of the daughter of the Syro-Phoenician woman in Tyre both in a pagan territories stress the fulfillment of prophecy in the person of Christ. When the people witnessed these miracles they were astounded by saying that He has done all things well. Jesus here continues God's creative power by giving hearing to the deaf and speech to the dumb. Such acts of Jesus is also the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy in the first reading.

We have to express our thanks and gratitude to our Lord Jesus who carried through God's plan of salvation even unto His passion and death on the cross. Also, we express our thanks to the chosen people of God who safeguarded their comprehension of God and believed in God promises till the coming of Christ. And lastly, we have to thank the friends of Jesus, the Apostles and other believers of Christ who were faithful and sacrificed their faith to the church and to all of us.
