

Almsgiving During Lent

The Justice and Peace Commission, as part of our focus on the topic of evictions, will be providing the name of an organization each week that provides service or support to families who are at risk for or who have actually been evicted. We will also give information on how to make a contribution, if you so choose, to that organization as part of your Lenten almsgiving.

This week's organization: Nia Imani Family, Inc.

Nia Imani Family's mission is to "provide homeless young, pregnant or first time mothers with safe, orderly housing in a family-like setting where they can come to terms with and manage childhood trauma, learn critical life skills, accountability, self-examination, goal setting and parenting so they can become self-sufficient, responsible parents, citizens and role models within their community".

This facility is Milwaukee's only long-term (up to 24 months) transitional housing for women and their children. The building features 13 resident apartments, a computer room, kitchen area, children's play space, group meeting space, community room and three ground floor tenants storefronts.



Our first reading is a selection from Ezekiel's vision of the "dry bones." He was writing during the Babylonian captivity, when things looked very bleak for the Jewish people. They were captives in a foreign land, Jerusalem and the temple had been destroyed, and there seemed to be no way forward. They had broken the covenant with God and this was their punishment.

In the vision, God led Ezekiel out into a huge plain filled with dry bones. The bones started to move, rattling like thunder, and joined together. Then they were covered with sinews, followed by flesh, and finally skin. But they were lifeless until the breath of God entered them, giving them life, as God had breathed life into Adam. The point was that they should have hope, that God would breathe life back into them, despite the direness of their situation. That is what happened: eventually they were able to return to their homeland, rebuild Jerusalem and the temple, and become a nation again.

The message to us is to trust in God's goodness and mercy, no matter what we have done or how dire things might seem to us. God loves us, wants the best for us, and offers us forgiveness. God's forgiveness is always there: we just have to accept it.

Lent is a special time in which we are invited to turn back to God, accepting His love and forgiveness. He is always ready to breathe life back into our dry bones. A special opportunity is **Tuesday**, **March 28**th. We will have a **communal reconciliation service at 7:00 pm**, with three priests available for individual confession. If that does not work for you, on Wednesday, March 29th, **confessions will be held at St. Margaret Mary parish from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm**. I will be one of the priests hearing confessions from 2:00 to 4:00 pm.

We are soon entering into our remembrance of the suffering, death, and resurrection of the Son of God, actions that clearly demonstrated that He loves us and wants us to be close to Him. I urge you to avail yourself of one of these opportunities to allow God to breathe life back into any dry bones. God bless.
