



A Devotional Journey into the Mass: How to Encounter Jesus in the Eucharist



Christopher Carstens, Dir. of the Office of Sacred Worship, Diocese of LaCrosse

Many today desire to encounter Christ, but do not know how or where to find him. Certainly, he is present in the beauty of the world, the charity of his people, and in the longings of our hearts. But he is present in a most privileged way in the celebration of the Eucharist. But here, too, we need to learn how to recognize him. "A Devotional Journey into the Mass: How to Encounter Jesus in the Eucharist" will show how to meet Jesus in the Mass' various signs and symbols, such as the church door and the sign of the cross; to hear his voice in the Church's words in the Opening Prayer and the scriptural readings; to join our hearts to his during the offertory and Eucharist Prayer, and to share in his own divine life by the worthy reception of the Eucharist. Christ "stands at the door and knocks," waiting to welcome us at Mass: this presentation will help us open the door of our hearts to him.

Chris is also a visiting faculty member at the Liturgical Institute at the University of St. Mary of the Lake in Mundelein, Illinois; editor of the Adversus Bulletus; and one of the voices on The Liturgy Guys podcast. He is author of A Devotional Journey into the Mass (Sophia Press).

In last week's Gospel, we followed Jesus into the desert where He fasted and prayed. This week, He leads us up a mountain to witness His Transfiguration. Why both of these experiences?

He is preparing us to go with Him in a few short weeks to a hilltop — Golgotha — where He will lay down His life for our sake, and then finally to take us to an empty cave where He triumphed over sin and death once and for all.

Jesus perfectly understands our humanity. He knows we need desert experiences — times of self-denial and testing — in order to arrive at mountain-top moments when we see and feel His glorious presence in our lives. The purpose of these two types of experiences is summed up in the description of the Apostles who were with Jesus at that mountain-top experience in today's Gospel: "Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep, but becoming fully awake, they saw his glory...."

The reason for all of our fasting and prayer and almsgiving during lent is to be reawakened to all God has done for humanity, and to all that He has done for each of us personally. It is all too easy to get lulled into complacency in our daily routines, to "sleepwalk" through life, getting up and getting ourselves out the door, going to work, returning home for dinner and dishes, meetings, or sports activities, and finally flopping on the couch to watch TV until bedtime. While there is nothing inherently sinful in this routine, as Christian stewards, we are called to so much more!

This lent, let us train ourselves, or more precisely, allow Him to train us to say "Yes" to His will and to offer our lives back to Him in gratitude. In so doing, we, too, will become "transfigured." This is what it means to live fully awake; this is a stewardship way of life and it is glorious indeed.

## From Our Pastor

My dear friends in Christ,

I want to highlight one of the most important ways to take advantage of the graces of Lent. It is to make a good Confession. In her spiritual diary, St. Faustina says that our Lord told her: "[I]n the Tribunal of Mercy [the Sacrament of Reconciliation]... the greatest miracles take place and are constantly repeated." (1448)\* "Here the misery of the soul meets the God of mercy." (1602) "When you go to confession, to this fountain of mercy, the Blood and Water which came forth from My Heart always flows down upon your soul." (1602)

Our Lord goes on to say: "Come with faith to the feet of My representative." (1448) "I Myself am waiting there for you. I am only hidden by the priest ... I Myself act in your soul." (1602) "Make your confession before Me. The person of the priest is, for Me, only a screen. Never analyze what sort of a priest it is that I am making use of; open your soul in confession as you would to Me, and I will fill it with My light." (1725) "Were a soul like a decaying corpse, so that from a human standpoint, there would be no hope of restoration and everything would already be lost, it is not so with God. The miracle of Divine Mercy restores that soul in full. Oh, how miserable are those who do not take advantage of the miracle of God's mercy!" (1448)

This coming Wednesday March 16th at 6:00 at Sacred Heart Church, there will be 5-7 "screens" to hear your confession and communicate the awesome Divine Mercy that our Lord won by His passion, death, and resurrection. May God continue to bless you, our nation, and our world during these difficult times.
