Knights of Columbus is sponsoring "The Silver Rose Pilgrimage" at Sacred Heart on April 22^{nd} at the 8:15 A.M. Mass and again on April 22^{nd} at a 6:00 P.M. with a rosary service.

Under the mantle of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, in the mid-1990s, The Silver Rose Pilgrimage was adopted as a Supreme Council initiative, which grew to encompass multiple pilgrimage routes and reaffirm the Order's commitment to the sanctity of human life.

At Sacred Heart April 27^{th} at the 8:15 A.M. Mass, the St. Joseph Icon will be placed on display for honoring and prayers throughout the day and there will be a rosary and service at 6:30 PM

At all Masses on Saturday April 30th and Sunday May Ist. the St Joseph Icon will be on display; a brief oratory will present why St. Joseph is the role model for Fathers. The Knights of Columbus will conduct a membership drive after all Masses.

The **Let MI Kids Learn** petition drive is underway to promote educational justice legislation. Michigan children from low-income families would qualify for "Student Opportunity Scholarships" toward their out-of-pocket educational costs at public or nonpublic schools for tutoring, school supplies, computers, and tuition among other expenses. Donors to scholarship organizations would receive a state tax credit. Low-income parishioners and members of our community would benefit from this initiated legislation, regardless of where they send their children to school.

The Catholic Bishops of Michigan support this effort. Please prayerfully consider signing the two required petitions to create the scholarships and tax credits to improve the education of Michigan's school children.

The petitions will be available for signing after Masses on April 23rd/24th and April 30/May I or stop by the Parish Office during office hours.

He is risen! He is truly risen! This is what the celebration of Easter is all about — the truth that Jesus was crucified for our sins and three days later rose from the dead, conquering death once and for all.

We know it's true, but this Easter Sunday, let's ask ourselves if we live as if it's true. Do we live as witnesses to the glorious reality of the Resurrection? A witness, of course, is one with first-hand knowledge. Our readings today focus not only on the Resurrection itself, but also on those who were witnesses to it.

In the Gospel, St. John describes the very first witnesses to the empty tomb, Mary Magdalene, John ("the disciple whom Jesus loved"), and Peter. Each had an individual "experience" of the empty tomb. Each went up close to see for themselves what Jesus' love had accomplished.

How can we as Christian stewards all these years later see for ourselves and so become His witnesses? We "see for ourselves" when we prayerfully read the Scriptures knowing they are a living love letter from God with a message to each one of us. We "see for ourselves" each time we receive the precious Body and Blood of our Lord in the Eucharist. We "see for ourselves" when we experience His personal and healing power in our hearts during Reconciliation. We "see for ourselves" when we pour out our lives in loving service to those around us and experience the deep satisfaction that only comes when we are imitating our Savior.

This Easter, resolve to live as if the saving power of the Resurrection is true. Experience Jesus for yourself every day from now on. You will be a powerful witness to the truth that He is risen! He is truly risen!

My dear friends in Christ,

were redeemed by the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. That's the reality, that's the truth, that's the joy of Easter!!!
