

3 The Fifth Sunday of Easter May 15, 2022

From Our Pastor

My dear friends in Christ,

On this 5th Sunday of Easter, our Blessed Lord gives us a beautiful lesson of what it means to live in the light of His glorious resurrection. The Gospel this weekend is taken from our Lord's last will in Testament given on Holy Thursday in which He gives Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist. In the excerpt found in today's Gospel, He speaks tenderly to His disciples, "My children, I will be with you only a little while longer." He then goes on to say, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." There it is--our Lord is giving His disciples their marching orders. They are to go out into the world and not just love, but to love as He has loved them; moreover, our Lord declares that it is by this love, that they will evangelize the whole world.

On the surface, this sounds nice, but look deeper. How does lesus love? Ultimately the cross! Read again I Corinthians 13 in which St. Paul lists the various qualities of Christian love. The more you think about it and delve more deeply into it, the more you come to the stark realization that this kind of love is impossible to give consistently, day in, day out, for the rest of one's life--and that's true!!! We are called to something that is humanly impossible to give, but (here's the good news!) with God all things are possible!!! That's why to live a truly Christian life of faith, hope, and love in our daily thoughts, words, and actions, we need the grace of God that comes from a daily prayer life soaked in the Word of God and nourished by the Sacraments. Our Blessed Mother and the other saints are our models in this. For God's sake and the sake of the whole world, let's strive to love as Jesus has loved us.




