


# Baraga County Catholic Community "Three Parishes In One Family"



Today's Gospel reading brings us to the very essence of a stewardship way of life, as Jesus responds to a question posed to Him by one of the scribes: "Which is the first of all the commandments?" His answer is a beautiful and concise description of a Christian steward's life: "The first [commandment] is this.... You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Let's consider these "greatest commandments" as they relate to three aspects of a Christian steward's daily life the use of our time, of our talents and of our material treasure.

The use of time in the context of stewardship refers primarily to our relationship with the Lord — in other words, our prayer life. Since time is a gift to me from God, I show my love for Him and my gratitude for this gift by giving Him the best portion of my time. My best time for prayer may be first thing in the morning before the noise and hectic pace of the day begin. It may be a few quiet moments at my desk during my lunch break. Or it could be in the evening with my spouse after the children have gone to bed.

Of course, it is vital to talk to God throughout the day, but if I really want to love Him with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength, shouldn't I make time for God "first" on my agenda each day? Not as an afterthought, but as a time I have intentionally chosen to spend only with Him.

# From Your Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

A group of children was once given a bundle of sticks by their teacher. She told them to break the sticks one by one, and they easily snapped them. Then she asked them to tie the sticks together in a bundle and try again. No matter how hard they tried, they couldn't break the bundle. The teacher smiled and said, "Alone, each of you is easily broken, but together, you are strong."

In this week, Jesus addresses the accusations made against Him by some in the crowd. They claim that He casts out demons by the power of Beelzebul. Jesus responds with the famous saying, "Every kingdom divided against itself will be laid waste" (Luke 11:17). He uses this moment to reveal a profound truth about unity and strength.

Just as the children in the story could not break the bundle of sticks when they were tied together, so too must the Church, families, and communities remain united in the Spirit to resist evil. A divided household or nation is vulnerable to collapse, just as a person divided by sin is weak. The prophet Joel speaks of the coming "day of the Lord," which will be a day of darkness and destruction for those who are not united in their faith (Joel 2:1-2).

Jesus' mission was to build up the Kingdom of God, a kingdom that stands strong through unity in love and truth. When we allow division—whether through sin, pride, or disunity—we give evil a foothold. We must constantly strive to strengthen our spiritual lives by staying connected to Christ and His Church, for it is only in Him that we find true strength and protection against the forces that seek to divide and destroy us.

Last week's bulletin showed the Bible Study on the Acts of the Apostles starting on November 3rd, but it will start on November 10th.




