

I was surprised to meet a couple who are long time members of the parish in learning that child rearing is foreign to them for they do not have one. But a double surprise is their



smile at me when I asked them if they can adopt me. Days followed that when they willingly accepted my invitation for them to help me in "taking care" of the parish through service in a parish ministry, it dawned on me that, there, they "adopted me." Jesus will not ask something that are "not ours" in following Him. He will always start from where we are.

He asks those whom He chose, "the twelve" from where they are. Their places of work and life are from the "waters" and "land," workers of the earth but leading to a "spiritual kingdom."
