

A Message From Our Pastor

Stewardship Corner: *“Take heed, watch and pray; for you do not know when the time will come.” - Mark 13:33* - We all take things for granted. In particular, we take time for granted. We make our lives too busy. We plan our time, our days, weeks, months, even years in advance. Remember, our time on earth is a gift. None of us knows how long we will be here. Start today and begin thanking God for each and every day. Take time in silence, every day, and listen to how God is calling you right now to help build His kingdom on earth.

Reservations for Christmas Mass: Thanks to everyone who took our survey in October. It was very helpful for our Christmas planning and scheduling. We will be having a total of six Masses between Christmas Eve and Christmas Day to make sure we accommodate all. Expect to get a **Flocknote** email with instructions. This information will also be posted on all our social medial platforms. It will explain how to go about making online reservations for a particular Mass. I ask for everyone’s *patience and understanding* as we try to navigate through these challenging times. We have more information in the bulletin about this and please call the parish office, 752-8708, if you have questions after reading this information.

Advent-A New Beginning: This weekend we begin the season of Advent and the new Liturgical Year Cycle B: for Sunday readings and Cycle I: for weekday readings. From the Latin **Adventus** (coming or arrival), this four-week liturgical season inaugurates the entire Liturgical year. Purple is the color of Advent, with the option of rose for the third Sunday (*Gaudete Sunday*). While purple denotes penitence for Lent, it is associated with the notion of royalty in Advent. Purple is the royal color and Christ is the “Prince of Peace”. The Gloria is not sung or recited during Advent as during Lent, but for different reasons. The Gloria is reserved so that on the eve of Christmas, this song of the angels may ring out anew in all its freshness. What kind of spiritual preparation should we making during Advent? I would suggest we make time for personal and family prayer. Secondly, make sure we go to confession between now and Christmas. Finally, do works of charity by sharing and being generous.

How well do you know the Bible? Have you ever tried reading the Old Testament only to discover that some of the books do not seem to fit where they

appear? For example, in the first five books of the bible, Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy, the book of Leviticus does not appear to follow the story line. Why do we go from the story of the history of salvation to a whole book on laws and rituals? Do you know that to understand the book of Psalms, you must know how it fits within the context of 1st and 2nd Book of Samuel? Have you been wondering why some books of the Old Testament are called the Torah (Law)? Do you know that the root word for the Torah is “Yarah” in Hebrew, which means, *“to shoot an arrow, to hit the mark”*; hence, keeping the law means hitting the mark? On the other side, sin is called “Chet” in Hebrew, which means *missing the mark*. Have your children ever questioned you why the first commandment is the first of the commandments? Are there any biblical supports for having holy images in the church in the light of the first commandment? What is the biblical meaning of the number “forty”? For example, the people of Israel wandered for forty days in the desert before reaching the promised land. Christ fasted for forty days and night in the desert. This number is not a randomly picked number nor is it coincidental. The number “forty” in the bible means the *“time of testing”*. Do you know that to understand the Book of the Prophets, you must read them in the context of 1st and 2nd Kings?

I encourage all to read the bible each day during this coming Advent Season, especially the Book of the Prophet Isaiah and the Gospel of St. Luke. If the bible is said to be the Word of God, it makes it the most valuable book in the life of any Christian. As St. Jerome rightly remarks, “to be ignorant of the Scripture is to not know Christ”.

Readings for Next Weekend

First Reading

Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated; indeed, she has received from the hand of the LORD double for all her sins. A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the LORD! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God! Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill shall be made low; the rugged land shall be made a plain, the rough country, a broad valley. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together; for the mouth of the LORD has spoken. Go up on to a high mountain, Zion, herald of glad tidings; cry out at the top of our voice, Jerusalem, herald of good news! Fear not to cry out and say to the cities of Judah: Here is your God! Here comes with power the Lord GOD, who rules by his strong arm; here is his reward with him, his recompense before him. Like a shepherd he feeds his flock; in his arms he gathers the lambs, carrying them in his bosom, and leading the ewes with care.

Second Reading

2 Peter 3:8-14

Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years like one day. The Lord does not delay his promise, as some regard "delay," but he is patient with you, not wishing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a mighty roar and the elements will be dissolved by fire, and the earth and everything done on it will be found out. Since everything is to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be, conducting yourselves in holiness and devotion, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be dissolved in flames and the elements melted by fire. But according to his promise we await new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells. Therefore, beloved, since you await these things, be eager to be found without spot or blemish before him, at peace.

Gospel

Mark 1:1-8

The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God. As it is written in Isaiah the prophet: *Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."* John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey. And this is what he proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

CHRISTMAS MASS RESERVATIONS



On Monday, November 30 at 8 PM, we will open the online reservation system for our Christmas Mass schedule. You should have received an email on Wednesday, November 25 and you will receive a second email on Sunday, November 29, both through Flocknotes. The information is also available on the parish website, www.sjv.org, and our Facebook page.

E-Mail #1 on Wednesday, November 25, explained how to set up your “user profile” in our online reservation system and the link to access it. We also included instructions on accessing online assistance if needed.

E-Mail #2 on Sunday, November 29, will again include the link to the reservation page and serve as a reminder that reservations open on Monday, November 30 at 8 PM.

Seating will be limited for each Mass and all seating will be assigned in the order requests are received. No tickets will be issued. Instead, you will check in prior to Mass and the ushers will direct you to your pew. Masks are required for all attendees.

If different households plan to attend the same Mass and want to be seated together, please designate one family member to make the reservation for all to avoid duplication. Any cancellations or edits to your reservation can only be made by contacting the parish office at 752-8708.
