

A Message From Our Pastor

Stewardship Corner: *“Prepare the way of the Lord...” - MARK 1:3* - We are all called to live a holy life. We are all called to invite others to live holy lives. Living a stewardship lifestyle, being grateful and generous with our gifts, puts us on the path to holiness and is an example for others to be holy, too. We are responsible not only for our own lives, but for the lives of others as well.

Bless Our Priests Collection: For many years most of us have benefited from the excellent work of our retired priests of the Diocese of Madison. They have worked in our schools, parishes, and communities. These priests labored for years in the Lord’s vineyard, confident that God would provide for their needs at retirement. In many cases, retired priests have continued to willingly be of service to parishes around the diocese. It is a fact that the work of the active priests would be more tedious without the help of our retired priests. ***This annual collection, called “Bless Our Priests Retirement Fund”, is an opportunity for us to say “Thank You” to these priests, who have been beacons of hope in our lives.*** The need is real, and the cause is noble. 3rd Sunday of Advent Kerygma: What if anything has God done to set us free? The Drama of the Redemption: We often think of Jesus as passive on the Cross, as if something is being done to Him. Of course, that is true, but more fundamentally, He is *doing* something. In fact, He is doing three things: (1). He is offering His life out of obedience to His Father as a sacrifice for sin. Although perfectly sinless Himself, He is taking on Himself the burden of all our sins and making atonement for them. (2). He is paying our debt to God the Father. That is what He is *doing* with respect to his Father. (3). He is also *doing* something directed toward us. He is revealing in the most astonishing way the infinite depths of God’s love for us. Finally, and we usually overlook this one, He is also *doing* something to the Powers of Sin, Death, Hell, and Satan. He is picking a fight. We heard in the second reading today the Apostle Paul saying, *“Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks.”* Why do we rejoice? Because the Son of God has come into the world. Why do we give thanks? Because our Rescuer has conquered the one who conquered us; He has deceived the one who de-

ceived us; He has humiliated the one whose goal was to humiliate us; He has destroyed the power of the one whose plan was to destroy us.

Why do we pray without ceasing? Because He has invited and called us to make ourselves ready to come home to our Father’s house. (The inspiration for this series was taken from the book by Fr. John Riccardo, *Rescued: The Unexpected and Extraordinary News of the Gospel* (Word Among Us, 2020),

A time to give: *“Joy shared, is joy multiplied.”* The season of Advent and Christmas is a great time to share our love with loved ones and those in need. Remember we are stewards of God’s blessings. While we remember our immediate family and friends, let us not forget the many that have little or less to celebrate with. This season of grace is a good time to reach out to them. Many may have lost loved ones and are not seeing any reason to celebrate. We are called to reach out to them and invite them into the spirit of the season.

On a special note, remember the needs of our parish at this time. People are always generous to their parish during the season of Christmas. We encourage you think of the SJV parish and school as you plan your giving. If your company has a matching gift program, we are happy to help you with the paperwork to multiply your donation. I have been asked if stock can be transferred as a gift to the parish and the answer is yes. We can help you with that paperwork as well. Just call the parish office or have your financial adviser call to set up the transfer. Remember all donations must to be received or postmarked by December 31st to count for 2020 tax purposes. God loves a cheerful giver; let us thank Him for all His blessings to us.

choose JOY

The third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday.

Gaudete, meaning rejoice, is the first word of the entrance antiphon. The color pink/rose symbolizes joy and is why the priests' vestments are this color and why we have a rose candle in our Advent wreath. Although

Advent is a season of preparation and penance, on Gaudete Sunday our expectation becomes more joyful as we recognize the Lord is near. Joy is a fruit of the Holy Spirit and an important part of Christian life.

Reflect on these lessons from Scripture and see how your faith can bring true joy to your life.

“Joy has come to me from the Holy One.” Bar 4:22

As humans, we have a natural desire for happiness and the only way to satisfy that desire is with God. If you are seeking joy and peace, then you must seek God.

“The joy of the Lord is our strength.” Neh 8:10

We can find joy every day not because life is always good but because God is. Joy comes from trusting God. Surrender your will to His will. In times of difficulty, say, “Jesus, I trust in you.”

“What thanksgiving, then, can we render to God for you, for all the joy we feel” 1 Thess 3:9

Keep an attitude of gratitude. Everything we have is from God. Instead of thinking about difficulties, focus on all the blessings in your life.

“Ask and you will receive, so that your joy may be complete.” Jn 16:24

Prayer is a source of joy and the foundation of having a relationship with God. Find peace by talking with God all day long as you would talk to a friend.

“You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy” Ps 16:11

Spending time in the Real Presence of God is an incredible privilege and a true source of joy. Take time to be with God at Mass and at Eucharistic Adoration.

“I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete.” Jn 15:11

Jesus clearly teaches that if we keep His commandments, we remain in His love. He gives us guidance on how to live correctly not to control us or to be a tyrant king, but to help us find true joy.

Readings for Next Weekend

First Reading

2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8B-12, 14A, 16

When King David was settled in his palace, and the LORD had given him rest from his enemies on every side, he said to Nathan the prophet, "Here I am living in a house of cedar, while the ark of God dwells in a tent!" Nathan answered the king, "Go, do whatever you have in mind, for the LORD is with you." But that night the LORD spoke to Nathan and said: "Go, tell my servant David, 'Thus says the LORD: Should you build me a house to dwell in?'"

"It was I who took you from the pasture and from the care of the flock to be commander of my people Israel. I have been with you wherever you went, and I have destroyed all your enemies before you. And I will make you famous like the great ones of the earth. I will fix a place for my people Israel; I will plant them so that they may dwell in their place without further disturbance. Neither shall the wicked continue to afflict them as they did of old, since the time I first appointed judges over my people Israel. I will give you rest from all your enemies. The LORD also reveals to you that he will establish a house for you. And when your time comes and you rest with your ancestors, I will raise up your heir after you, sprung from your loins, and I will make his kingdom firm. I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me. Your house and your kingdom shall endure forever before me; your throne shall stand firm forever."

Brothers and sisters: To him who can strengthen you, according to my gospel and the proclamation of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery kept secret for long ages but now manifested through the prophetic writings and, according to the command of the eternal God, made known to all nations to bring about the obedience of faith, to the only wise God, through Jesus Christ be glory forever and ever. Amen.

Gospel

Luke 1:26-38

The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And coming to her, he

said, "Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you." But she was greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." But Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" And the angel said to her in reply, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. And behold, Elizabeth, your relative, has also conceived a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month for her who was called barren; for nothing will be impossible for God." Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.




