

A Message From Our Pastor

Stewardship Corner: *“Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.” - 1 JOHN 3:18* - Regarding our Catholic faith, do you “walk the talk?” Do your actions reflect what it means to be a good disciple? Are you an active participant at Sunday Mass? Are you joyful when participating in parish ministry? Do you give gratefully and generously with your financial support to your parish and other Church needs? If not, it is not too late to start!

Coronavirus Church Reopening Update from the Diocese: Since the reopening of in-person Mass a year ago on Pentecost Sunday, the Diocese of Madison has emphasized the safety of all worshipers to be a primary focus. Their guidelines to the parishes within the diocese have been guided by science and state and local ordinances where applicable. As more people are getting vaccinated and cases of new infections continue to trend downwards, we received an update from the Diocese for some practices.

First, by order of Rock County Department of Public Health, everyone coming into the Church is still expected to wear a mask. This mandate has not been rescinded in Rock County.

Second, we are still limited up to 50% capacity with physical distancing, and other protective measures, and best business practices. *However, if you are reading this from home and have not been at Mass since reopening, please come - we have enough space to do what is required.*

Third, beginning Mother’s Day weekend (next week), we are no longer required to block every other pew in Church. As the Church fills up, we can open more pews and let people sit back-to-back with proper distancing. *Everyone is still required to wear a mask and expected to continue hand sanitizing and other best practices. Those who are sick are asked to stay home and watch Mass via livestream.*

Fourth, Congregational singing *is still not allowed* at this time. There may be a choral group singing, if they wear their masks and are physically distanced while they are singing.

I continue to count on the cooperation of everyone as we work through all of this. Those of us who have no great moral objections or other serious reasons for not getting the vaccines should consider getting one of the ones the Church tells us is permissible. Sometimes charity demands we think more broadly and do all we can to help the common good. Moreover, achieving the vaccine goal will allow us to get back to our normal way of life and worship sooner. Let charity anchor all we do. Love never fails.

May Crowning: We invite you to join us on Thursday, May 6 at 8:15 A.M. Mass for the May crowning with the school children. The second graders will be coming to Mass in their First Holy Communion best. Their class will lead us with the crowning ceremony following Mass.

May Devotion: May is the month of Mary, as a practice, I would encourage all to say the rosary every day this month. This will be our collective challenge for this month. For a start, if your family is not in the habit of reciting the rosary every day, or frequently, just do one decade (ten Hail Mary’s) every day and recite the Memorare at the end.

The Memorare: Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother. To thee I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

First Reading

Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being."







Important Information Regarding Offertory Donations

If you are donating through your bank's bill pay service or a distribution through your investment firm, make sure your name is included with the donation and that the donation is sent to 1245 Clark Street, Janesville, WI 53545. Or, have the investment firm send the check to your home and forward it to SJV. We have received a few donations this year with no donor name included. Most of the checks do not list a phone number or contact to call and track down the donor. We have copies of those donations with hopes of finding the donors name in the future.

If you are not using your bank's bill pay service or your investment account, another way to donate is through our online donation process at www.sjv.org. This is a secure website. You set up your own account which allows you to choose the bank or credit card account of your choice, the amount you want to donate, the frequency of the donation and the date. This process can be used for offertory (envelope) donations and special collections including tuition assistance, endowment fund and memorials.

All registered members receive envelopes whether they use the above options or the traditional envelope option. This helps all of us remember the special collections throughout the year. 

Compassionate, gratuitous services available for divorced Catholics and those in irregular marriage situations

In an effort to improve our diocesan ministry to divorced Catholics and those in irregular marriage situations, our diocesan tribunal has expanded its services to include a Pre-Petition Case Advisor. A Pre-Petition Case Advisor accompanies an individual through the discernment process following a divorce by explaining the Church’s teaching on marriage, making a personal assessment of any moral and canonical remedies available, and providing assistance in petitioning for a declaration of nullity (commonly referred to as an annulment).
