A Message From Our Pastor

Stewardship Corner: “He said to them, “Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while.” MARK 6:31 - Do you spend time, every day, alone, and in silence listening to how God is calling you? If not, you are missing out on a wonderful opportunity to develop a more personal relationship with Him. Unless we talk, and more importantly, listen, to God every day, how else will we know how He is calling us? Consider making a retreat this year, spend some “alone” time with God.

Prayer Requests: One key aspect of my job as your pastor is to cater to the spiritual needs of my parishioners. A big part of this is offering prayers for people both in times of joy and in times of need. As your pastor, I am obligated by Canon Law to offer “*Mass for the People*” on any given weekend. Fr. Peter takes on this responsibility in my absence. This is the Mass that the priest offers for the sole intentions of the parishioners both known and unknown to the priest. You will notice this Mass intention being rotated at different Mass times each weekend depending on other special intentions. Many times, people ask us to pray for them or for a family member. These requests are of primary importance to Fr. Peter and me. While we may not be mentioning everyone by name, we nevertheless remember all these intentions in our prayers both private and at Mass. I think it is also important that people with special prayer requests who want us to pray for an intention contact the parish office.

Reflection for the week!

You are never alone: One of the lessons from the early church is the sense of communality that existed among the believers. The Acts of the Apostles and the Epistles are filled with stories of how the early Christians supported each other in their faith journey and helped each other in their need. This was true especially during the time of the great persecutions when Christians had to lean on the faith of their fellow Christians to get through hard times. With a united front, they were able to withstand all the persecutions that came their way while holding true to their faith.

As Christians, we are never alone. We are constantly wrapped by the love of Christ and our dear and gracious God is always there for us. Here at SJV, we do not want anyone who walks into the doors of this parish church to ever feel that they are alone on this journey. We want to support you and walk with you. We are here to share in your joys and in your sorrows. That is why I am encouraging you all to pay attention to what is going on in our families, with our

neighbors, and with our fellow parishioners. If there is someone you know that is hurting and had felt estranged from the Church, please reach out to them, and invite them to come back “home”. Let them know that we care about them and their situation.

While we may not always be able to alleviate all their burdens, we will always support them with our prayers and friendship. Why not try inviting your friends with whom you play cards, golf, quilt, and hang out with, to come worship with us here at SJV on any given weekend. We would love to meet them and have them experience the fervent spirit that is here at SJV parish. “Great things happen when God mixes with us”! May the good Lord who has begun this good work in us bring it to fulfillment! Amen

Gospel

John 6:1-15

Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee. A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick. Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. The Jewish feast of Passover was near. When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.
