OUR PARISH ADVENT OUTREACH - THERE IS STILL TIME TO DONATE!

This year, we once again chose Cross Catholic Outreach as our special Advent project because the work of this organization is so critical. This Advent, Cross Catholic Outreach is partnering with Father Raul Monterroso in the Diocese of Santa Rosa de Lima, Guatemala to build safe, concrete block homes for 80 impoverished families. Heartbreakingly, in the Diocese of Santa Rose de Lima the homes children grow up in often perpetuate poverty. They live in broken-down shacks cobbled together with sticks, scrap metal and bits of plastic. Whenever it rains, the floors turn to mud and their beds are soaked. It may seem hard to believe, but a contribution of \$6,034 will build a modest concrete house with a solid cement foundation and water-proof roof. If you would like to donate, please make your check payable to Saint Clement of Rome and write "Cross Catholic Outreach" in the memo. This is the final week we will be collecting for this very worthy cause.


DYNAMIC CATHOLIC, ALIVE! - SPIRITUAL LEADERSHIP

MISSOURI LEGISLATORS CONSIDER EXPANDING POSTPARTUM HEALTH COVERAGE

A bipartisan group of legislators will be working this year on expanding health insurance coverage for new mothers. Last year a bill was signed into law that included, among other provisions, an extension of postpartum coverage for mental health services for up to a year, subject to appropriation.

This year, lawmakers are looking to fund that expansion and also add a broader range of postpartum health care benefits through the state's Medicaid plan.

The Senate Interim Committee on Medicaid Accountability and Taxpayer Protection included the postpartum coverage expansion as one of its recommendations in its recently released report.

During the committee hearings held this summer, witnesses asked the committee to appropriate money for the coverage extension, stating that it could be done through federal funds from the American Rescue Plan Act.

The Missouri Catholic Conference has supported the bills expanding postpartum mental health coverage and will continue to follow legislation that would expand that coverage.


Catechist

Classes will meet on Thursdays from 6:30PM-7:30PM in the St. Clement of Rome School Cafeteria. All in-person class dates are: March 3rd, March 10th, March 24th, March 31st, April 7th, April 21st, April 28th and May 5th. The Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled for Wednesday, May 11th.



Class Format

We will cover one chapter of the textbook per week. Classes are designed to facilitate discussion, foster community, and inspire personal prayer life. I ask that students be ready to participate by completing homework assignments and contributing to conversation.

Homework

Each week students will complete a 30 minute homework assignment which may include journal reflections, chapter reflections, conversation with Confirmation sponsor, a Saint project, Confirmation letter to Bishop Rivituso, etc.



Inspiration for the week

It was the best of times and it was the worst of times. Our families can bring out the best and the worst in us. This is true of our families of origin, the current family of which we are a part, the family of our church, our society, and the like. In all of our family experiences, what stands out as our most challenging memory? Everything human can be found on the pages of family life. But there is also a Divine story to be discovered as well. When life gets difficult and perplexing, today's Feast of the Holy Family stands to remind us that it is not just by human effort that we tread treacherous waters. We have to remember and learn from the Divine effort too. We need this perspective if our love lessons are going to be learned completely and well. We are all works in progress and we all come from homes that are broken by imperfection. In whatever life brings us and in whatever family we find ourselves, may the promptings we feel toward faith and hope lead us to greater love.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin.

Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death.

Even in his final moments, St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow.


