FROM THE DESK OF MONSIGNOR BUTLER

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - CHRIST REVEALED TO THE WHOLE WORLD



When Jesus, son of Mary, son of God, was born in a Bethlehem stable, He was at once Good News to the Jewish people. Proclaimed by angels to shepherds in a field, He was the long-awaited Messiah. Those humble shepherds were not expecting anything out of the ordinary that night, but they were the first to hear God's promise to the Chosen People had been fulfilled. The story could have ended right there.

But God had another more glorious plan. The Magi were seekers, not fully knowing what they were looking for, a sign in the heavens, a bright star, pointed the way, they believed, to the birth of a new king. Certainly, the births of kings were major

events, but in their seeking, the Magi were to find even more than they expected; the Savior, not only of the Jews, but of the Gentiles as well.

Jesus today, early in the freshness of a new year, is just as much the Savior of the world as He was when the travelers from the East reached their destination. We pay homage as they did, remembering He came to free us from sin and death and give us a share of his very life.

One way to acknowledge our Savior is to make a simple mark on our doorways to bless our homes for the new year. With the numerals of the new year and the initials CMB, we mark the entrance to our homes with a piece of chalk. The letters C, M, and B stand for the traditional names of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. CMB also stands for the Latin words Christus Mansionem benedicat, or "Christ bless this house." With this simple blessing, we open our homes to the salvation Jesus offers and proclaim Him once again as Savior of the world.

Please be sure to take home one of the Epiphany blessing cards today after Mass along with the chalk to mark your doorway with 20+C+M+B+22 and bless your home!


Confirmation preparation classes are coming up soon! Please review the details noted below for your planning purposes.

Classes will meet on Thursdays from 6:30PM-7:30PM in the St. Clement of Rome School Cafeteria. All in-person class dates are: March 3rd, March 10th, March 24th, March 31st, April 7th, April 21st, April 28th and May 5th. The Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled for Wednesday, May 11th.



Class Format

We will cover one chapter of the textbook per week. Classes are designed to facilitate discussion, foster community, and inspire personal prayer life. I ask that students be ready to participate by completing homework assignments and contributing to conversation.

Homework

Each week students will complete a 30 minute homework assignment which may include journal reflections, chapter reflections, conversation with Confirmation sponsor, a Saint project, Confirmation letter to Bishop Rivituso, etc.

To register, complete the Private School Confirmation Registration form found on the St. Clement of Rome Parish website under PSR. **The registration fee for Confirmation Preparation is \$50.** Please complete the registration form and submit payment to the rectory on or before February 1st. 





LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Human beings easily get bored. Life's routines can become so predictable that there is often little time for excitement or freshness. Today is all about the new and the wonderful. In celebrating the beauty and simplicity of the Epiphany, we see in tangible ways God's creative, redemptive, and restorative power. This refreshment and revitalization is offered not only to a select few but to everyone throughout the world. There is nothing routine or static about God. Surprises, wonders, miracles, opportunities, healings, and joy without measure are available to those who believe. There are never any endings, just beginnings. And, when darkness, boredom, and gloom seem to be the order of the day, a bright new light now shines pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."


