WORD OF GOD SUNDAY NEXT WEEKEND

The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time has been declared 'Word of God Sunday' to call attention to the Holy Scriptures and the importance of growing closer to God through the Scriptures. By setting aside scheduled time to read and pray through the Scriptures, we learn more about God's salvation and love for us. Bible studies or programs such as 'Bible in a Year' https://bibleinayear.fireside.fm/ can help quide us.

Bring your Bible to Mass for the Sunday Masses next weekend, January 22-23, when we will have a Bible Blessing. Bring your family Bible, study Bible and/or children's Bible for a special blessing!

Need to select a Bible? Just look for one of these translations on the cover. There are other Catholic translations, but these are the most frequently used, and **best for beginning**.

New American Bible (NAB), and New American Bible-Revised Edition (NABRE)

One of the easiest versions of the Bible to understand, the New American Bible is perfect for everyday use. For this reason, it is especially popular among Catholic students and those who are new to reading Bible. St. Joseph Edition is the Bible translation used at Mass. The Catholic Bishops Bible online uses the NABRE translation: bible.usccb.org/bible

<u>The New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) 2nd Catholic Edition</u> (RSV2CE)
The RSV, second Catholic edition uses standard English and is in conformity with the Church's translation guidelines.

There are many publishers, and they include different commentaries.

A few examples are:

- Ignatius Bible: includes detailed notes
- Didache Bible (pronounced DID-uh-kay): includes commentaries based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church
- Great Adventure Catholic Bible: includes the Bible timeline and how it relates to history. This is the translation used in the 'Bible in a Year' podcast

Select the edition that best meets your needs at this time.

It's that time of year again for the **Knights of Columbus Free Throw Competition!** The competition is 100% FREE and all boys and girls ages 9-14 in the parish are eligible.

However, like most events over the last two years, we will need to handle a bit differently...this year's competition will be VIRTUAL. I ask that all participants video themselves and email/text to me with their results.

The challenge is straightforward – essentially, the goal is to make as many free throws as possible in 15 attempts. The boy & girl of each age group with most baskets wins the Council level of competition, receives a brand new basketball, and advances to the District level which will be held on February 20th (usually hosted by St Monica's). If there's a tie, I'll reach out individually and set up next steps.

We realize the ethical dilemma in entrusting this year's competition to the honor system, but we are confident that our values will prevail over a free basketball.

Ages 12, 13, 14 (Girls Competitions) Use a women's regulation-size basketball and shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet

Ages 12, 13, 14 (Boys Competitions) Use a men's regulation-size basketball and shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet


FULTON SHEEN'S BOOK


