

And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory, and then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky. (Mk. 13: 26-27)

Dear brothers and sisters,

God has revealed to us very clearly that His Son will come again. Jesus Christ, the Son of Man (that is one of the ways the Holy Scripture calls him), will return at the end of time marking an end to this world. But this time, Jesus Christ will appear in glory and majesty, **to judge the living and the dead**, as we say when we pray the Creed every Sunday. *Then He will repay to everyone as their deeds deserve* (Rom. 2: 6).

Many Christians, too many Christians, no longer believe this prophesy, this certainty of faith, this dogma. There are multiple reasons for this disbelief, but there is one that can explain the others. These nonbelievers have stopped loving God due to disappointment, weariness, or sadness. They feel cheated by a God who has lied to them. *"What has happened to the promise of his coming?"* they will say, *"Since our Fathers died everything has gone on just as it has since the beginning of creation!"* (2 Pe. 3:4). Believing in Jesus has been a fraud. Nothing has changed! There is still injustice, evil, crimes, wars, innocent children suffering, murders, disease, hatred, hypocrisy, death . . . and it grows even worse. Where is the heavenly Father who cares for his children? It's been too long since Jesus came, and he said he would come soon. Soon? There is no point in sticking to void promises.

It is very symptomatic that similar disappointment and weariness have driven many married couples to drop their vows. Love is over, love has died, they say. And it is true, but are wrongly focused. Rather they have killed the love in their marriage. Love cannot die by itself, because love is forever. God is LOVE. But we can spoil, destroy and kill love, if we don't nourish it carefully as a living creature. The nourishment of spiritual life, of faith, is prayer. If our faith starves, our love for God staves as well. Many Christians today don't pray at all, or they don't pray enough. Some feel too tired and unable to pray more. They think that they are too busy and have no more time left for prayer. Others feel they pray enough and have reached their "prayer limit".

Jesus taught us: *Stay awake, and pray not to be put to the test* (Mat. 26:41). However, we are tempted every day and we fall into temptations, requiring us to go to Confession

frequently. If we fall into temptations, are we praying enough? Can we be satisfied and boast about our prayer? NO, of course not! We can always improve our prayers. We can always pray more and/or better. Maybe it's true I have no more time available or too many duties. But that doesn't prevent me from praying more attentively, in a more focused, loving, friendly manner while demonstrating confidence and humility. We can further augment our prayers by meditating the Psalms (the Holy Scripture), looking for silence and loneliness (quieter places and moments) and participating in Eucharistic Adoration.

If we strive and make all necessary sacrifices to obtain growth in our prayer, then we will be spiritually well and strongly nourished. The devil would no longer deceive us into losing our heart. We would keep the faith and a steady and tender love for God. Even if we stumble and fall sometimes, we would get up immediately through the Sacrament of Confession. Because we would understand the words of the Holy Spirit, when St. Peter said:

There is one thing, my dear friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. The Lord is not being slow in carrying out his promises, as some people think he is; rather is he being patient with you, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to repentance. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and melt away, the earth and all that it contains will be burned up. Since everything is coming to an end like this, what holy and saintly lives you should be living while you wait for the Day of God to come and try to hasten its coming: on that Day the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat (2 Pe 3: 8-12).

The Day of the Lord, the final Day, the Judgement Day of this world will come. We should not be scared or sad. If we understood that Day as the sweet Day at which we will finally see the Lord face to face and be able to hug him and kiss him for eternity, thanks to his infinite mercy. we could overcome any fear.

Let us practice searching for God's mercy with all our hearts here on earth, so that we may find it up in Heaven.



Saint of the Week


Although her life was short, St. Elizabeth of Hungary (1207 – 1231) is recognized for her love of the poor and suffering, and as patroness of Catholic charities and the Secular Franciscan Order. The daughter of the King of Hungary, she chose a life of penance instead of leisure, which made an impact on the "commoners" she served.

St. Elizabeth married Louis of Thuringia when she was 14. Deeply in love, they had three children. Despite their wealth, she led a life of prayer, sacrifice, and service to the poor and sick under the spiritual direction of a Franciscan friar.

After six years of marriage, her husband died in the Crusades, and St. Elizabeth was grief-stricken. Her husband's family did not look kindly upon her and mistreated her before finally throwing her out of the palace. However, the return of her husband's allies from the Crusades resulted in her being reinstated, since her son was legal heir to the throne.

St. Elizabeth joined the Secular Franciscan Order in 1228 where she cared for the poor in a hospital she founded in honor of St. Francis of Assisi. She died in 1231, but her great popularity resulted in her being named a saint only four years later.
