You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased. (Lk. 3: 22)

It has been revealed to us that God is Love (1 Joh. 4: 8); and that the first fruit Love bears is joy, then peace, then patience . . . (Gal. 5: 22).

It is the joy of loving and being loved, the joy of a love that has been attended and reciprocated. For love's nature demands to be mutual and reciprocal. That's why love is the strongest unitive power in the whole universe, whereas hatred splits and sets apart. The connection between two persons in love is so close that both stop being two individuals, and become one soul, one mind, one body says the Holy Scripture about marriage love (Mat. 19:6). But the same applies to all kind of loves: between friends, brothers, sisters, parents and children. Therefore, wherever there is real love, there cannot be fights, quarrels, rage, violence, hard feelings, or yelling. If there is any, due to human weakness and imperfection, it is quickly acknowledged, forgiven, forgotten and overcome. Both participants learn the lesson and apply their best efforts not to repeat it. Should they fall again, they correct once more, and get up immediately.

That's at least the way true love should be according to God's plan for us since it is a matter of survival. Love has connected lovers so closely that they become one soul, one life, and neither side cannot let the other die. Each lover is compelled to protect, foster, care and cherish the other side as its own. So, love makes lovers' lives dependent on each other. The moment love blossoms your happiness is my happiness; your well-being is my well-being; your will and desires are mine; your sadness is my sadness; your problems and concerns are my problems and concerns as well. They are together in everything and share everything as one!

This is what happens in its most perfect form in God, between the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. That is how we should understand the final words of this Sunday's Gospel: You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased. The Father's divine Love for his eternal Son is so



perfect, so complete, so ravishing in the Holy Spirit, that whatever the Son did was pleasing to Him. It doesn't

mean the Son did whatever He liked, good or evil without caring out His Father's will. On the contrary. God the Son wanted to gladden His eternal Father by doing only His Father's will. That was the Son's mission, the purpose of His existence and His nourishment: *My food is to do the will of the one who sent me, and to complete his work.* (Joh. 4:34) *I have come from heaven, not to do my own will, but to do the will of him who sent me.* (Joh. 6:38)

All that Jesus did, can be summarized in one virtue: OBEDIENCE (*loving obedience*). Jesus had given everything to the Father, His own will included. Therefore He wanted and longed for doing only His Father's will. That greatly delights the Father and makes both infinitely joyful, because they are two divine Persons, but ONE SUBSTANTIAL AND ETERNAL LOVE, ONE DIVINITY in the Holy Spirit. The bliss of one is the bliss of all the divine Persons of the Holy Trinity.

Only through this obedient love could the world be saved, because *just as by one man's disobedience* many were made sinners, so by one man's obedience (Jesus Christ's obedience) are many to be made upright. (Rom 5:19)

May the Lord make us as obedient as His beloved Son, so that God can also find rest in us rejoicing in our loving obedience. *Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven...*


