Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him, and will dine with him, and he with Me. (Rev. 3:20)

My beloved brothers and sisters,

We've just celebrated Christmas, the birth of our Lord, God, in human flesh. The mystery of **INCARNATION**, the mystery of God's love becoming small, low and vulnerable for us, so that we may reach him in a completely human way.

Before the Lord's Incarnation (before his human birth) we could know God like a creature knows his Creator, from far away, through the evident and inevitable divine traces found in the creation. God's signature is in all creation. Who else could have done something no creature could have ever done? But after Incarnation we can know God very closely, in a human way, like men know each other. We can get to know God so closely that we can love him closer and even fall in love with him like the saints did. *No one has ever seen God; it is the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known* (Joh. 1:18).

Now, after the Incarnation we can touch, embrace, kiss, caress and see God. Through his humanity and through faith, in his humanity we can now contemplate his divinity. What was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we beheld and our hands handled, concerning the Word of Life -and the life was manifested, and we have seen and bear witness and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was manifested to us- what we have seen and heard we proclaim to you also, that you also may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ. And these things we write, so that our joy may be made complete (1]o. 1: 1-4). Like those privileged men who saw Jesus when he lived on earth, with faith they could have seen God. Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father, so how can you say, "Show us the Father"? (Joh. 14:9). Because within that humanity is the fullness of the Divinity. In him (in Jesu), in bodily form, lives divinity in all its fullness (Col. 2:9).

For many men this madness, is impossible. And somehow it is madness indeed, but a madness of divine Love which is wiser and more sensible than all human wisdom. A madness that the small-minded heart of men

rejects to accept. That's why so many people reject the Holy Cross of Christ. They cannot and don't want to understand that this is the way of love. While the Jews demand miracles and the Greeks look for wisdom, we are preaching a crucified Christ: to the Jews an obstacle they cannot get over, to the gentiles foolishness, but to those who have been called, whether they are Jews or Greeks, a Christ who is both the power of God and the wisdom of God (1Co. 1: 22-24). That's why so many object believing in the Holy Eucharist. They cannot accept God becoming so small for our sake, in order to nourish our souls for eternal life.

But we do believe in Jesus Christ presence in the Holy Eucharist. Therefore, since we really believe that God, the Son, is humbly and gloriously es-




tablished in that Holy Host, let me encourage you pay visits to our Lord in the Holy Eucharist. On your way home from work or school, in route to the grocery store or a sports practice, "STOP IN FOR A VISIT" to the Blessed Sacrament in our beautiful church, at St. Mary's, 960 Jefferson Street. HE, Jesus, is there in the tabernacle. Two red candles are lit telling us He is there ALONE waiting for us, knocking on our door, calling us, begging our company, longing for talking with us, because He loves us and needs us. As we said last week: LOVE makes us voluntarily needy. Therefore, lovers say to each other *I need you*, *I can't live without you!* God loves us so much that he wanted to need us the most. The Mystery of Love.

And let us tell many others to do the same. Hopefully there will be good Samaritans who will pity our Lord on the Cross, waiting for us in the Tabernacle.


